MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM WORK SESSION Monday, October 6, 2014



WORK SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

Council President Duffie made a motion to go into closed session. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

At the conclusion of the closed session, Councilwoman Grant made a motion to return to open session. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

OPEN SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi made that resolution 2014:255 was added to the agenda, awarding the solid waste bid to Joseph Smentkowski, Inc.

1. OEM

Councilman Putrino said the Office of Emergency Management is not codified in the Borough ordinances. He said he reviewed the ordinances from a few other towns and believed the ordinance from Westwood is a good model for New Milford. He provided a draft of the proposed ordinance and asked for the Council to authorize the Borough Attorney to formalize the draft for introduction. All present agreed. Councilwoman Grant said the position of incident commander should be defined.

Mayor Subrizi said she would be resigning from the OEM position as soon as a successor could be found. Council President Duffie asked if Chief Papapietro would assume the

position until a replacement is named. Mayor Subrizi said she would continue to hold the position until a successor is named.

The Council discussed a stipend for the position and agreed the range should be from \$1,000 to \$4,750. The salary ordinance will be updated accordingly.

2. Best Practices Checklist

The Administrator Clerk referenced the previously distributed checklist. She said the state requires that it be discussed at a meeting and that the inventory results and the certification of the Chief Administrative and Chief Financial Officer be stated in the minutes. She said the results were 88 out of 100 which provides for full funding. She said one item was listed as perspective in the inventory, the concept of incentivizing employees not to take medical benefits, and it has been listed for discussion at the November work session. Councilman Putrino asked about question 17, noting it was red but the answer was yes. The Administrator explained it is red because it is a repeat question from a previous year but we answered affirmatively as we are doing what is required.

3. BCOS Application – Docks or Prospect Park

The Administrator said since the previous meeting a suggestion had been made to consider improvements to Prospect Park to include refinishing the basketball court, installing a new fence and providing new trash receptacles.

Regarding the previous suggestion of docks at Hardcastle Pond she reported the docks are made of polyethylene, they are long lasting and do not need to be removed during winter. She additionally reported on the engineering fees associated with the installation of the docks: Design - \$5,000; DEP Flood Hazard Area Wetland Permit - \$7,500; Construction Inspection - \$6,000; DEP Permit - \$1,800. She said the permit would take approximately six months to obtain.

The Administrator said the estimate for the Prospect Park Improvements came in at approximately \$94,000 for which we could expect to receive half that amount in a grant. Ms. Casey said this is a good application but she was of the understanding that we would be adding a picnic area or planting area for seniors. The Administrator said neither she nor the Recreation Director were aware of the picnic/planting area and we are now approaching the deadline for the application. She said we need to have an ad in the newspaper by October 12th to advertise a public hearing on the application to take place at the public meeting on October 27th. The Council unanimously agreed to proceed with the application for Prospect Park.

Council President Duffie said she did have a conversation with Ms. Casey regarding the Prospect Park Improvement and Ms. Casey is of the mind that if you include a number of elements to reach a number of groups the application will score better. Councilman Putrino suggested painting two shuffle board courts between the two basketball courts, which could be done for the cost of paint.

Mayor Subrizi said the natural grade of the hill at Prospect Park has been destroyed to make the park. She suggested the grade should be restored in order to alleviate the flooding that plagues the park.

4. Municipal Drug Alliance

Councilman Robalino outlined the setbacks that have befell the Dug Alliance over recent years – cancellation of carnivals, low attendance at middle school dances and difficulty recruiting members to serve on the committee. He said they do not feel they have the support of the town as whole. He said there are only six active members and three are not planning to return next year. He said the committee has tried to work with the schools to recruit members and they are looking to the Mayor and Council for suggestions on how to keep the committee going.

Mr. Leibman suggested reaching out to the County Prosecutor, noting they have a budget for programs. He also suggested reaching out to people one-on-one to people by asking the school for names of involved parents. He suggested asking the Prosecutor to come in to speak to the committee. Council President Duffie suggested doing it at a joint meeting with the three PTOs and the Drug Alliance.

Councilman Colucci suggested the Mayor and Council could reach out to friends and family to ask them to volunteer.

- 5. Resolution in Support of the NJ Constitutional Amendment to the regarding Open Space Councilwoman Grant said she brought the resolution to the Council for their consideration; the intent is to encourage people to vote yes to increase the amount of money dedicated to preserving open space. The resolution was added to the agenda as resolution 2014:256.
- 6. Approval of September 22, 2014 Closed and Work/Public Session Minutes Councilman Putrino made motion to approve the minutes of the September 22, 2014 Closed and Work/Public Session minutes. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. The motion passed without a roll call. All present in favor, with the exception of Councilman Ashley who abstained.

7. Administrator's Report

The Administrator referenced the request from the Acting DPW Superintendent to buy an enclosed trailer with money remaining from the capital appropriation for a pick-up truck. She said she spoke with the bond attorney and the re-appropriation could be added to either the DOT or CDBG bond ordinances he would be preparing for the next meeting at no additional charge. The Council had no objection to the re-appropriation and purchase of the trailer.

The Administrator reported she had received a request from the NMEF regarding lawn signs for the upcoming 10K. They have asked for permission to place the signs in prominent locations on Borough property. The Council agreed they could place the signs on the borough property at the intersection of River Edge Avenue and River Road and also at the Borough Hall.

The Administrator reported on a meeting she attended on September 19th with PSE&G. The purpose of the meeting was to give the town advance notice of gas line replacements that will be made in flood affected areas. She said the work would not begin until at least the spring of 2015. She said that PSE&G will pave curb to curb in any area that they need to dig up if it has recently been paved. They will be replacing cast iron with plastic and they expect the main line replacement to go quickly. She said the second topic addressed at the meeting was

the plan for the improvements to the New Milford substation. They will be building a gas insulated substation (GIS) building with dimensions of 100' x 120'. They will be making an application to the zoning board because the height of the building will be 40' where 35' is allowed. In addition to the GIS building they will be raising the transformers.

The Administrator said Mr. Conley was prepared and planned to attend this meeting with revisions as discussed at the September work session. Due to the heavy agenda he was rescheduled to the November work session. He will be forwarding information in advance of that meeting.

The Administrator reported the borough offices would be closed on Monday, October 13th in observance of Columbus Day and she would also be out of the office on October 16th and 17th.

Councilman Putrino said he would not be able to attend the 10/27 meeting as he will be out of town on business.

Council President Duffie said George DePalma of Dorchester Apartments is retiring and therefore stepping down from the Rent Leveling Board. Mr.DePalma has asked that Jack Linefski of Value Realty be appointed to replace him as the landlord representative. The appointment will be listed on the 10/27 agenda.

Councilman Colucci presented a letter of support for the safety improvements at the intersection of Berkley Street and Graphic Boulevard. He said he is expecting four additional letters and will forward them upon receipt. The letters will be forwarded to the grants consultant for inclusion in the application for the grant.

Councilman Colucci asked that the Council consider funding a new alarm system for NMFD Co. #2 in the 2015 capital budget. He said it will cost between \$5,000 and \$7,000 to fix and remount the old system and a new system can be purchased for approximately \$17,000. He said the new system would be friendlier to the neighbors as well.

Councilman Putrino commented on the recently completed micro-surfacing and said Concord, Myrtle and Baldwin look good but Sutton has a lot of marks from all of the turnarounds that take place in front of the school.

RESOLUTION AWARDING 2014 "COMPLETE SOLID WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES" CONTRACT TO SMENTKOWSKI, INC.

For the reasons set forth in this resolution, the Borough of New Milford ("New Milford") awards the 2014 "complete solid waste collection services" contract ("contract") to Smentkowski, Inc. ("Smentkowski") and rejects Waste Management of New Jersey's ("WM") challenge to Smentkowski's bid.

I. Findings of Fact

- 1. On June 2014, New Milford advertised for the contract pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Law ("LPC"), N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1, et. seq.
 - 2. Bids on the contract were returnable August 26, 2014.
- 3. The notice to bidders required them to properly fill out a questionnaire related to their ability to perform the contract.
- 4. The questionnaire begins by stating: "failure to complete this form or to provide any of the information required herein shall result in rejection of the Bid Proposal."
- 5. Question 13 on the questionnaire requires the bidder to "supply the most recent Annual Report....and a financial statement for the most recent two-year period (calendar or fiscal)."
- 6. New Milford received three (3) bids on the contract, from Smentkowski, WM, and Suburban Disposal, Inc.
 - 7. Smentkowski is the low bidder.

- 8. On September 11, 2014, WM submitted a challenge to Smentkowski's bid, stating that Smentkowski had failed to properly fill out question 13 and that Smentkowski's financial statements were incomplete, vague, and did not encompass a "two-year period." Smentkowski submitted a response to the challenge and WM submitted a reply.
- 9. Smentkowski's answers to the questionnaire are "please see attached," referring to documents submitted with the bid, including its 2013 "collector's report" and a financial statement "for the year ending December 31, 2012." The financial statement is dated August 8, 2012
- 10. Both WM and Suburban Disposal, Inc. also incorporated their answers to the questionnaire (in whole or in part) by reference to additional documents submitted with their bids. All bidders submitted their 2013 "collector's report."
 - 11. WM submitted financial statements for 2012 and 2013.
 - 13. Suburban Disposal, Inc. submitted financial statements for 2011 and 2012.
- 14. The "collector's report" submitted by each bidder is a document each bidder is required to file annually with the New Jersey Department of Environment Protection pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26H-1.19(a).
- 15. The "collector's report" is required to include "financial condition...income and expenses for a calendar year period," among other things.
- 16. The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection may assess penalties for failure to file a "collector's report" or for incomplete or inaccurate information in a "collector's report" pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26H-5.15(a).
- 17. Smentkowski's "collector's report" for 2013 (the most recent one) includes a statement of its gross revenue and net income, among other things.
- 18. Smentkowski's reported net income for 2013 was approximately \$12,000; WM's was over \$7,000,000; and Suburban Disposal, Inc.'s was over \$170,000.

II. Conclusions

19. The purpose of the questionnaire is to assure New Milford that the bidder possesses the necessary equipment and financial stability to perform the contract. Meadowbrook Carting Co. v. Borough of Island Heights, 138 N.J. 307, 322 (1994); N.J.S.A. 40A:11-20 to 22.

- 20. <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 7:26H-6.5(d)(2) mandates that any bidder on a solid waste disposal contract fill out the questionnaire.
- 21. Question 13 on the questionnaire requires somewhat overlapping information, since the "collector's report" contains much, if not all, of the information set forth in financial statements.
- 22. WM challenges only Smentkowski's financial statements, not its "collector's report," which is for 2013, the same year as WM's and Suburban Disposal, Inc.'s.
- 23. Because the "collector's reports" are all for the same year and they contain much of the same information as the financial statements, Smentkowski's (apparent) failure to provide financial statements for the "most recent two-year period" does not deprive New Milford of the assurance "that the contract will be entered into, performed and guaranteed according to its specified requirements." Meadowbrook Carting, supra at 315.
- 24. While Smentkowski's net income for 2013 was much lower than WM and Suburban Disposal, there is nothing in its "collector's report" or financial statement that calls Smentkowski's ability to perform the contract into question such that New Milford could reject it as the low bidder.
- 25. Smentkowski owns or controls the necessary equipment to perform the contract, has existing contracts with other political subdivisions, and ultimately earned more money in 2013 than it spent, as Smentkowski certified to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection in its "collector's report."
- 26. Deeming Smentkowski's (apparent) failure to provide financial statements for the "most recent two-year period" immaterial is not "of such a nature that its waiver could adversely affect competitive bidding." <u>Id.</u>
- 27. Smentkowski did not fail to provide *any* financial statements. Smentkoswki provided a 2012 financial statement, but failed to provide one for either 2011 or 2013. Smentkowski's "collector's report" contains very similar information to a 2013 financial statement. A financial statement from 2011 would not aid New Milford in assessing Smentkowski's bid, since it would be superseded by the 2012 financial statement and the "collector's report."
- 28. WM's argument that other potential bidders might have bid had they known that only one financial statement might be sufficient is illusory in this context because of the necessity of the "collector's report." Any bidder would have a "collector's report" because the New Jersey Department of Environment Protection requires them to be filed annually.

- 29. Any bidder who was concerned about their financial condition and who might have omitted financial statements entirely would have had their bid rejected. Smentkowski, however, is not in that position. Its "collector's report" in conjunction with its 2012 financial statement sufficiently complies with question 13 in the questionnaire such that any defect is immaterial.
- 30. The LPC was recently amended not to require financial statements in competitive contracting where the bidder submits sufficient insurance and proof of surety. The amendment, while not controlling on straight public bidding, is nevertheless a statement that the legislature does not consider financial statements material where there are other guarantees of performance.
- 31. The NJ DEP has made the same statement by not requiring financial statements in its uniform bid specifications for waste disposal contracts in all circumstances. Instead, "collector's reports" are sufficient unless the bidder has not been in business long enough to have filed a "collector's report."
- 32. Just as New Milford is required to justify waiver of an immaterial defect, so too is New Milford required to justify rejection of a prima facie low bidder. There is no justification for such a rejection here.
- 33. WM's challenge to Smentkowski's bid is rejected and the one (1) year contract with four (4) one year options is awarded to Smentkowski.
- 34. The Chief Financial Officer has certified that funds are available from account 01-2010-26-3052-073 of the current fund in the amount not to exceed \$389,200 for the first year from October 16, 2014 through October 15, 2015 and in accordance with NJAC 5:30-5.5(d)2 certifies that this contract is subject to the availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds in future years.
