MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM PUBLIC SESSION MEETING Monday, June 28, 2021



PUBLIC SESSION:

Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statement. The meeting was held by electronic means, in accordance with law. The Mayor read an announcement regarding public comments during remote meetings.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Mr. Wielkotz said there is a resolution before the governing body to amend the budget that was introduced on March 22, 2021. He said the reason for the amendment is to insert grants that have been received since the budget introduction and to insert the 2021 allocation of the American Rescue Plan funds from the federal government. He said \$516,000 of the \$859,000 allocation is being used; \$196,000 of which will pay off the COVID-19 Special Emergency passed in 2020 for revenue losses resulting from the pandemic and \$320,000 to reduce the tax rate. He said this will reduce the municipal tax increase on the average assessment from \$67, in the introduced budget, to \$3 in the amended budget.

Mayor Putrino asked if a public hearing on the amendment is required.

Mr. Wielkotz said two things trigger the requirement to advertise the amendment and hold a public hearing: an increase or decrease in an existing appropriation of more than 10% or a new appropriation that exceeds 1% of the total budget. He said we are not increasing or decreasing any existing appropriations and none of the new appropriations exceed 1% of the total budget, therefore, a hearing is not required.

2021:164 Amend 2021 Municipal Budget

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to adopt resolution 2021:164. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

2021:165 Adopt 2021 Municipal Budget

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to adopt resolution 2021:165. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 14, 2021 Work Session meeting. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2021:10

NEW BUSINESS:

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2021:13

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR A CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT IN THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE RECEIPT, ACCEPTANCE AND DEPOSIT OF GRANT FUNDS THEREFORE AND TO AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATIONS OF \$87,634

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised, and a public hearing will be held on July 26, 2021.

Councilwoman Duffie asked if the grant would cover the entire purchase. The Administrator said that it would.

APPOINTMENTS: JIM MCCARTEN – PLANNING BOARD – CLASS IV JEFFREY FORSTER – PLANNING BOARD – CLASS IV

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the appointments to the Planning Board. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

1. Eagle Scout Project Request

Councilman Seymour asked to table this topic to the next meeting.

2. Little League Batting Cages

The Administrator referenced the letter from New Milford Little League, in which they outlined their request for two batting cages, one each at LaBarbera and Connelly fields. She said the governing body had previously approved one batting cage at Connelly field. She said the batting cage design was drafted by Colliers Engineering and accepted by NMLL. She said the purpose of resolution 2021:168 is to provide the Borough with design immunity.

Councilwoman Duffie asked if there is a need for a second batting cage. Mayor Putrino said there is, as there is currently no batting cage at LaBarbera field.

All present agreed to authorize NMLL to move forward with both batting cages.

3. 2021 Municipal Budget

As the 2021 Municipal Budget was adopted earlier in the meeting, no further discussion was necessary.

4. Schedule Updates

Mayor Putrino said National Night Out is scheduled for Tuesday, August 3rd from 7:00 PM to 10:00 PM, weather permitting. He said it will be held on LaBarbera field.

5. COVID-19 Task Force Report

The Administrator reported that the Covid-19 Task Force met on Thursday, June 24th, with reports from the NMPD, NMFD, OEM, Ambulance Corps, Health Department, Administration, DPW, Recreation, the BOE and the Mayor and Council. Topics discussed included the vaccination site clinics, reopening of borough offices and resumption of services, indoor/outdoor dining, and upcoming events. Future Task Force meetings have been suspended, given the progress made and the recission of most restrictions.

Council President Grant commended the Task Force for a job well done under difficult circumstances.

Mayor Putrino said the Task Force served to bridge the communications between all the various departments throughout the pandemic.

6. Administrator's Report

- Barring unforeseen circumstances, the Mayor and Council will resume in-person meetings in September.
- The Borough Hall reopens to the public on Thursday, July 1st.
- Estimated tax bills are being sent out as the tax rate has yet to be set by the County. Tax collection will be by drop box and online only.

• Engineering Report

- Knights Field grading and drainage are underway. Anticipated completion August 2021
- Madison Avenue Sidewalk wetlands flagging scheduled for this week with surveying to follow. Anticipated start Spring 2022
- Kennedy Basketball Court Resurfacing pavement resurfacing, hoop systems, benches and striping have been completed. Center court logo scheduled for July. Anticipated completion July 2021
- Kennedy Field Batting Cage Design revised based upon feedback from Little League. Permission to proceed upon approval of resolution 2021:168
- DOT Culvert Project ecological and survey work completed in June. Anticipated start November 2021
- Sutton Place Tennis Court Resurfacing contractor identified drainage concerns, construction pending drainage work. Anticipated completion August 2021

- DOT Road Project (Boulevard) borough reviewing plans, out to bid in July. Anticipated start September 2021
- Kennedy Field Bench Covers design pending, bench covers to be purchased by the borough with installation going out to bid. Anticipated completion December 2021
- The Borough will be closed on Monday, July 5th in observance of the 4th of July.
- There will be just one meeting in July scheduled for Monday, 7/26

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Council President Grant made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Grant said the library will reopen July 1st and will welcome patrons in the afternoon, with the continuation of curbside pick-up in the morning. She said the sculpture garden is complete and the dedication will be held on September 18th. Mayor Putrino said that picnic tables are being installed at the library as well.

Councilwoman Duffie acknowledged the efforts of the Board of Health and OEM for organizing and running the vaccine clinic. She also commended the Health Department inspectors, in cooperation with the DPW and Property Maintenance, for their efforts in town.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Senior Center has been doing a great job and keeping busy with exercise classes and virtual programming. She said the Historic Commission is continuing their work on the oral history project and encouraged anyone interested to share their stories.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said she had no highlights to report.

Councilman Seymour said the Board or Ed has scheduled a special session for June 30th at 7:00 PM. He said the meeting will be held in person, in the NMHS auditorium, and will also be livestreamed. He said the purpose of the meeting is to announce the selection of the new Superintendent. Councilman Seymour said he has been working with Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley and Commissioner Tracy Zur on the Hunger Action Drive scheduled for September.

Councilman Grotsky said the Shade Tree Commission is considering the designation of Heritage Tree for three trees in town, tentatively scheduled for September.

Council President Grant made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.
