Council President Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 28, 2021 Public Session meeting. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

### **ADOPT ORDINANCE 2021:13**

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR A CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT IN THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE RECEIPT, ACCEPTANCE AND DEPOSIT OF GRANT FUNDS THEREFORE AND TO AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATIONS OF \$87,634

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to open to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

#### **INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2021:14**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER XXX OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "LAND USE REGULATIONS" THEREBY AMENDING SUBSECTIONS 30-3 THROUGH 30-17

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER II OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION" THEREBY AMENDING SUBSECTION 2-19.1 ENTITLED "COMPOSITION OF THE NEW MILFORD POLICE DEPARTMENT"

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised, and a public hearing will be held on August 23, 2021.

### **INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2021:16**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER II OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION" THEREBY AMENDING SUBSECTION 2-20,6A ENTITLED "JUNIOR FIREMEN"

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised, and a public hearing will be held on August 23, 2021.

1. Eagle Scout Project Request

Councilman Seymour asked to table this topic and relist it on the next agenda.

2. SUEZ Right of Entry Agreement - NMFD

The Administrator referenced the agreement, drafted by Suez Water New Jersey, Inc., which had been circulated previously. She said Suez requires the agreement for NMFD to be permitted to train on the reservoir. She said the agreement has been reviewed by the Borough Attorney and the Risk Manager. Mr. Kelly said his concern was the indemnification

Council President Grant made a motion to add resolution 2021:193 to the consent agenda. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

• The Administrator asked for a motion to add an item for discussion in closed session under the heading of potential litigation.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to add the topic of potential litigation to the closed session agenda. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

• Regarding resolution 2021:191 to approve the Jr. FD Auxiliary Rules and Regulations, the Administrator said she got a call from Chief Calnan asking to modify section 4C to permit members to reside within two miles of the New Milford border, as opposed to one mile as it currently reads. Chief Calnan said they have two candidates who wish to join and have been waiting for the age of eligibility to be lowered — one is from Paramus and the other is from Haworth, neither of which offer a Jr. program. No member of the Fire Department was in attendance to discuss this request.

Mr. Kelly said he recommends going forward with the resolution to approve the Rules and Regulations as presented, because the State requires Rules and Regulations to be in place prior to adopting the ordinance.

- Bergen County Mosquito Control will be performing an early morning ULV Truck Spray
  in New Milford on Wednesday, July 28, 2021 between the hours of 4 and 6 AM.
  Residents are asked to keep their windows closed. In the event of rain, the spray will be
  postponed until the following day. The map of the spray area and additional information
  can be found on both the borough website and the Office of the Mayor Facebook page.
- NM Little League has requested permission to hold a car wash in the Borough Hall's south parking lot on August 8<sup>th</sup>, with a rain date of August 15<sup>th</sup>. The Administrator checked with DPW, Recreation, and PD and as there are no conflicts or concerns, the request has been approved.
- Mayor and Council meetings are scheduled to resume in-person on September 13th. All
  meetings will be held in Council Chambers and will continue to be streamed on the
  Borough's website and later posted to YouTube.
- The Senior Center is scheduled for a Phase 1 reopening on Tuesday September 7th. The center will be open for specific activities and registration will be required.
- Sr. Van service is scheduled to resume, on a modified schedule, for doctor's appointments only, on Tuesday, September 7th.
- The November 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the Mayor and Council has been rescheduled to November 29<sup>th</sup> as the week of November 22<sup>nd</sup> is a short week due to the holiday.

### **COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Council President Grant made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Grant said she had nothing further to report.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said she had nothing further to report.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said the Environmental Commission has been working, with the assistance of the DPW, to complete the trail space in the New Milford Woods. Signs have been posted and dog waste stations have been added. She reminded everyone that the trail space is carry-in, carry-out. Councilwoman Sandhusen said the Green Team has received feedback on their application for Sustainable Jersey Bronze certification, with approval of seventy points, bringing them just about halfway to certification. She said they will be working through the

revisions with the next review scheduled for mid-September. She said both the Green Team and the Environmental Commission will be participating in National Night Out.

Councilman Seymour said he had nothing further to report.

Councilman Grotsky said he had nothing further to report.

Councilwoman Duffie said she attended the wake for former New Milford Firefighter/Chief Martin Stroosnyder. She said he served for more than forty years and was honored in a moving ceremony by the NMFD. Councilwoman Duffie said the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee is underway with a fundraiser, selling banners for display on River Road and Main Street, which has been well received by the businesses in town. She thanked the Deputy Administrator/Deputy Clerk for her assistance with the committee's efforts.

Mayor Putrino said the 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Coach's Softball Fundraiser is tentatively scheduled for August 21<sup>st</sup>, with proceeds to benefit the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. Mayor Putrino said Historic New Bridge Landing had discussed the conditions on the New Milford side of the bridge and he thanked the DPW for their assistance in repairing a sign and getting it cleaned up. Referencing resolution 2021:188, Mayor Putrino said he is scaling back many of the provisions of the Borough's Emergency Declaration and will revisit the remaining items in September. He said the Borough continues to maintain consistency with the recommendations from the CDC and the State.

### RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE NJ DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION'S PURSUIT OF THE DESIGNATION OF THE LOWER HACKENSACK RIVER AS A FEDERAL SUPERFUND SITE

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) Acting Commissioner Shawn M. LaTourette and Congressional leaders including U.S. Representatives Josh Gottheimer and Bill Pascrell, Jr. have announced that New Jersey will pursue the designation and cleanup of the Lower Hackensack River as a federal Superfund site; and

**WHEREAS**, this is the first time a New Jersey river itself would be proposed for Superfund listing; and

WHEREAS, this is a critical step toward remediation of river sediments contaminated with mercury, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons and other pollutants from past industrial practices; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey's decision to pursue Superfund listing will enable the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to propose adding 23 miles of tidally influenced river from the Oradell Dam to Newark Bay in accordance with Superfund legislation (the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act or CERCLA); and

WHEREAS, this designation will provide a path "to restoring the river as a clean and vibrant asset for the people who live, work and recreate in the communities along this important natural resources, including those that have been disproportionately burdened by environmental degradation," according to N.J. Governor Phil Murphy; and

WHEREAS, "By restoring the Hackensack through the federal Superfund program, the river will be able to reach its full potential as an ecological and economic asset for this region," according to U.S. Senator Cory Booker.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of New Milford, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey supports the designation of the Lower Hackensack River from the Oradell Dam to Newark Bay as a federal Superfund site.
