

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER XXX OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "LAND USE REGULATIONS" THEREBY AMENDING SUBSECTIONS 30-3 THROUGH 30-17

Council President Grant made a motion to open the meeting to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on this ordinance.

#### **ADOPT ORDINANCE 2021:16**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER II OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION" THEREBY AMENDING SUBSECTION 2-20.6A ENTITLED "JUNIOR FIREMEN"

Council President Grant said she contacted the Borough Attorney earlier in the day to question the use of the term "firemen" as opposed to the term "firefighter."

Mr. Kelly said he reviewed the ordinance and confirmed that the term "firefighter" is used throughout. He said the term "firemen" shows up in a few places in the rules and regulations, which are referenced in the ordinance. He said he believes it was an oversight and has instructed the Fire Department to revise the rules and regulations, so the term "firefighter" is used consistently throughout.

Council President Grant made a motion to open the meeting to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on this ordinance.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to approve this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

### **INTRODUCE 2021:17**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER II, ARTICLE VII OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES AND POLICIES" TO ADD SECTION 2-54D, ENTITLED "ANTI-NEPOTISM POLICY"

Council President Grant made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised, and a public hearing will be held on September 13, 2021.

### 1. Eagle Scout Project Request

Councilman Seymour introduced Eagle Scout candidate, Garrick Sandhusen. Mr. Sandhusen said he is going to be a senior at NMHS and is a scout with Troop 78. He said the first step in the process to become an Eagle Scout is to have his project approved by the governing body. He said he would like to build a trail board, to be placed at the entrance of the New Milford Woods. The board's purpose would be to provide information on wildlife that can be found in the woods, along with warnings and other information. He said it would consist of corkboard behind plexiglass with a shingle roof to provide shade.

Council President Grant asked for the dimensions. Mr. Sandhusen said the roof would be 2'x8', the board would be 4'x8' and would be secured in concrete on 4'posts. He said the materials will be fire treated and weather treated so the board could be easily maintained.

Mayor Putrino asked Mr. Sandhusen to forward a sketch of the design once it is completed.

Council President Grant asked when the project would be installed. Mr. Sandhusen said he would like to have his materials ready in November but would not start the construction until the spring because he will need to dig to install the footings.

The Administrator said a building permit would be required. Mr. Sandhusen asked to have the permit fee waived. A resolution, to waive the fee, will be prepared the next meeting.

Councilman Seymour made a motion to approve the project. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, except Councilwoman Sandhusen, who abstained.

### 2. Schedule Updates

Mayor Putrino said there will be a ceremony, on Saturday, September 11<sup>th</sup> at 8:30 AM to acknowledge the twentieth anniversary of 9/11. He said once the details are finalized the information will be posted on the borough website and the Office of the Mayor Facebook page.

Councilman Seymour said the NMMA will be holding the annual Fishing Derby on September 12<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 AM to 12:00 Noon at Hardcastle Pond.

Council President Grant said the Library Sculpture Garden Dedication is scheduled for September 18<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 PM. She said the Friends of the Library Book Sale and town wide garage sale will be held on Saturday, September 25<sup>th</sup>.

Councilwoman Duffie asked if the Friends would be accepting book donations. Council President Grant confirmed that they would be accepting donations after Labor Day.

Councilman Seymour said plans are underway for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Domestic Violence Symposium, which is tentatively scheduled for the last week in October.

Councilman Grotsky said two shade trees on Cedar Road will be designated as heritage trees at a ceremony scheduled to take place in either September or October.

### 3. Administrator's Report

- Finance Committee met on 7/29 expenditures on track. Some revenues are down Court, life hazard fees and interest
- The FD Daytime Response committee continues to meet and has made significant progress. The eligible employees will be reviewing the FD responses to their concerns and The FD committee will then meet to finalize their recommendation for the M&C.
- Bergen County Mosquito Control will be performing an early morning ULV Truck Spray in New Milford on Wednesday, August 25, 2021 between the hours of 4 and 6 AM. Residents are asked to keep their windows closed. In the event of rain, the spray will be postponed until the following day. The map of the spray area and additional information can be found on both the borough website and the Office of the Mayor Facebook page.

- Kennedy Basketball Court Resurfacing Complete
- DOT Culvert Project Design in progress. Anticipated start February 2022
- Sutton Place Tennis Court Resurfacing Complete. Reviewing options for the addition of an adjustable net
- DOT Road Project (Boulevard) Resolution to Award on tonight's agenda.

Regarding the Sutton Place Tennis Courts, Mayor Putrino said the courts are lined for both tennis and pickleball and we are looking into adding adjustable nets to accommodate volleyball.

- Sr. Van service is scheduled to resume, on a modified schedule, for medical/dental appointments only, on Tuesday, September 7th. Masks are required to ride.

Councilwoman Duffie extended thanks and congratulations to the NMPD for a job well done on the recent National Night Out. She said the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee has been selling sponsorship banners and there are only a few left.

Councilman Grotsky said he had nothing further to report.

Council President Grant said she had nothing further to report.

Councilwoman Sandhusen extended her thanks to the NMPD for their efforts on National Night Out and said both the Environmental Commission and the Green Team participated in the event.

Councilman Seymour said he is working with Bergen County Commissioner Tracy Zur on Hunger Action Month and with Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley and the BOE on the upcoming Cereal Box Challenge. He thanked both the Ascension Church and Unitarian Church for their generous donation of food over the weekend and thanked Maura Henyecz and Recreation for organizing the Coaches Charity Softball Game, which raised \$795 for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee. Mayor Putrino added thanks for Debbie Yaeger and John Heinemann for their part in arranging the charity game. He said it was the first annual, as the plan is to do it every year.

Mayor Putrino said Little League had a successful car wash event, raising enough to send another player, at no cost, to Cooperstown. He said he will have a proclamation for Hunger Action Month at the next Council meeting.
