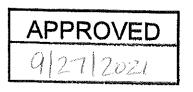
MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM WORK SESSION MEETING Monday, September 13, 2021



WORK SESSION:

Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statement. The meeting was held by electronic means, in accordance with law. The Mayor read an announcement regarding public comments during remote meetings.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from the August 23, 2021 Work/Public and Closed Session meetings. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, except Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley, who abstained.

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2021:17

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER II, ARTICLE VII OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES AND POLICIES" TO ADD SECTION 2-54D, ENTITLED "ANTI-NEPOTISM POLICY"

Council President Grant made a motion to open to the public for a hearing on this ordinance. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on this ordinance.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to close to the public. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Grant made a motion to adopt this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Police Department

Councilman Grotsky reported the following promotions and assignments which will become effective on October 1st:

Lt. DiGenio will be promoted to Captain and become the Operations Captain.

Lt. Pisano will become the Traffic Safety Lieutenant.

D/Sgt. Perez will be promoted to Lieutenant and be assigned to Patrol Squad 1. Detective Mattessich will be promoted to Sergeant and continue his assignment in the

Detective Bureau.

In addition, Councilman Grotsky reported that Captain Jones will be retiring at the end of the year and effective January 1, 2022, D/Lt. Van Saders will be promoted to Captain.

2. Schedule Updates

Councilwoman Grant said the grand opening ceremony for the Library Sculpture Garden will be held on Saturday, September 18th at 2:00 PM. She said the event will be held rain or shine.

Councilman Seymour said the Domestic Violence Awareness Symposium will be held on Wednesday, October 27th. He said it will follow the same format as last year, with the panelists and speakers live and the event livestreamed for members of the public.

Mayor Putrino said Clean Communities Day is scheduled for Saturday, October 2nd. He encouraged people to volunteer as the need is great.

Mayor Putrino said he spoke with Congressman Gottheimer who advised that the Small Business Administration will be setting up a disaster recovery center at the Bergen Community College Phillip Ciarco Jr. Learning Center located at 355 Main Street in Hackensack. He said the center is intended to assist business owners affected by Ida and will be open weekdays from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM and Saturdays from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

3. Administrator's Report

The Administrator reported as follows:

Periodic meetings have been held immediately following and since Tropical Storm Ida to
discuss response from the various departments. The meetings were led by the Mayor
with reports from Police, Fire, DPW, OEM and the Administration regarding topics such
as evacuations, debris removal, available resources, and assistance to residents.

- The Senior Center reopened, on a limited basis, on Tuesday September 7th. The center is open for specific activities and preregistration and masks are required.
- Sr. Van service resumed on a modified schedule, for doctor's appointments only, on Tuesday, September 7th. Masks are required to ride.
- A mobile DMV unit will be at the Borough Hall Tuesday, 9/14, from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Preregistration is required.
- A pre-construction meeting for the resurfacing of the Boulevard from McKinley Avenue to Main Street is scheduled for Friday, 9/17.
- Borough Hall will be closed Tuesday, 9/14, from 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM, for employee training.
- Next Meeting of the Mayor and Council is scheduled for Monday, 9/27.

Councilwoman Sandhusen asked to have resolution 2021:209 pulled from the consent agenda for a separate vote.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Seymour made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Sandhusen thanked all the borough personnel that worked throughout and following the storm. She gave a shout out to the community volunteers, in particular Marie Demler and Danielle LaPorto, and mentioned the collaboration with the Elks to collect and distribute donations to those in need.

Councilman Seymour echoed Councilwoman Sandhusen's comments, acknowledging the many groups that came together including the New Milford Mom's Facebook group that collected and distributed food, the NMPD delivering water, the DPW working around the clock, the NMFD with water rescues, and the businesses who generously offered support. He also commented on the success of the Fishing Derby and complimented the NMMA on a job well done. He reported that Berkley and Gibbs were among the first schools to sign up for the Cereal Box Challenge sponsored by Bergen County Commissioner Tracy Zur, and the recent BOE meeting at which the new Superintendent, Danielle Shanley, presided.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Senior Center has reopened on a limited basis. She said letters went out to both residents and non-residents in August, which outlined the new format, which includes some in-person activities that require registration, and the continuation of some of the virtual and outdoor activities that have become popular. Councilwoman Sirochhi-Hurley also extended her thanks to NMPD, NMFD and the DPW along with Shop Rite, who provided a place for the collection of food and cleaning supplies and the Ascension food pantry.

Councilwoman Duffie also offered her thanks to all who have come together, and she commented on how seamlessly the employees and volunteers have worked together to support the community. She said over the three-day period, NMFD evacuated over 160 residents from 55 homes and answered 96 calls related to the storm. She said the department has suffered some equipment losses as a result of their efforts during the storm. She also thanked Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley for her efforts to assist residents after the storm.

Council President Grant extended her thanks to all the individuals and groups previously mentioned. She said she was impressed by the coordination of efforts and was surprised to see this storm affected areas that normally do not flood. She commented on the DPW working overnight to counter the long wait times at the transfer station.

Councilman Grotsky said the DPW has removed 309 tons of flood damaged materials to date, with 12 containers, in the most heavily affected areas, being unloaded daily. He said crews are working overnight and weekends and have logged 295 hours of overtime so far. He said NMPD coordinated with NMFD throughout the storm, using their high-water rescue vehicle to evacuate more than 200 people from homes and cars and responded to more than 120 calls during the storm event. He said they have more than \$150,000 in equipment losses as a result of the storm.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley encouraged people to volunteer for Clean Community Day as there is a lot of work still left to be done.

Mayor Putrino said the Borough has just received seventy-five, 5-gallon containers with cleaning supplies from the Red Cross, which are available to residents and can be picked up at the DPW. He too thanked borough personnel and volunteers who worked together to bring relief to the

community. He thanked Congressman Gottheimer, Senator Lagana, Assemblywoman Swain and Assemblyman Tully for the open line of communication and their support. He thanked FEMA for bringing a mobile unit to the Borough on September 10th to assist residents. He thanked residents for the patience with garbage pick-up, noting that wait times at transfer stations were up to eight hours. Mayor Putrino also thanked all who attended the 20th anniversary 9/11 ceremony, with special thanks to Chief Clancy for arranging a bagpiper, the NMFD and the Honor Guard, and New Milford resident and retired U.S. Air Force member, James Conner, for leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to speak.

Council President Grant made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the consent agenda, consisting of resolutions 2021:207, 2021:208 and 2021:210 through 2021:2018. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to approve resolution 2021:209. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, except Councilwoman Sandhusen who abstained.

Council President Grant called attention to resolution 2021:214, which waives building department permit fees for all work related to the restoration or replacement of flood damaged property.

ADJOURNMENT

Being no further business before the governing body, Council President Grant made a motion to adjourn. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:48 PM.

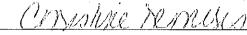

RESOLUTION EXTENDING TIME REQUIREMENTS PER §11-3. (ESTABLISHMENT OF RENTS.) SUBSECTION (d) AND §11-8.1 (TAX SURCHARGE) OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization designated the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for the entire United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to the Coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of New Jersey has declared a state of emergency to exist as a result of the spread of the COVID-19 virus in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of 2021 County and Municipal budgets were delayed in response to the passing of the Federal American Rescue Plan Act as both the County of Bergen and Borough of New Milford postponed the adoption of their respective budgets in order to incorporate their respective share from the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (LFRF); and

WHEREAS, as a result of the decision to postpone the 2021 budget adoption, the County of Bergen has not yet struck the 2021 tax rate, resulting in Landlord's not yet receiving final 2021 municipal tax bills;

WHEREAS, Section 11-d (below) of the Borough's Rent Control Ordinance (the "Ordinance") requires Landlords seeking annual rent increases to provide Tenants with at least forty-five (45) days prior notice, and the Rent Leveling Board or the Borough fifteen (15) days after receipt of such notice of increase to advise a Landlord of the approval or disapproval of such increase:

Any landlord seeking an increase in rent shall notify the tenant at least 45 days prior to the increase becoming effective, of the present rent and of the calculations involved in computing the increase and the proposed rent. The notices shall also be filed with the Rent Leveling Board 45 days prior to the effective date of any increase. The Rent Leveling Board shall advise the landlord of the approval or disapproval of such increase within 15 days after receipt of such notice of increase. The landlord shall then notify the tenant of the current rental. No increases shall become effective without the prior approval of the Rent Leveling Board or its designee.

WHEREAS, Section 11-8.1 (TAX SURCHARGE) of the Ordinance provides, in relevant part (below), that any tax surcharge imposed upon a Tenant is to accompany the rent increase notice:

At the time of a rental increase, a landlord may seek a tax surcharge from a tenant because of an increase in municipal property taxes.

WHEREAS, as a result of the aforementioned issues, the Borough of New Milford, together with other New Jersey boroughs, has not yet issued 2021 municipal tax bills, resulting in Landlord's not being able to deliver notices of tax surcharges together with annual rent increase notices.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the governing body of the Borough of New Milford hereby:

- 1. Extends the Landlord's deadline to issue Tax Surcharge statements to Tenants as required pursuant to Section 11-8.1 of the Ordinance for a period of Forty-Five (45) days from Landlord's receipt of its Municipal Tax bill, which Landlord's receipt shall be deemed to have occurred within three (3) business days of the date such bills are issued by the Borough; and
- 2. Extends the deadline of the Rent Leveling Board to approve rent increases pursuant to Section 11-d of the Ordinance, for a period of fifteen (15) days after receipt of Landlords' notice; and
- 3. Authorizes the Mayor, the Council, members of the Administration, and the Rent Leveling Board, to take all actions necessary to effectuate the purpose of this Resolution.
