#### WORK SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

#### **OPEN SESSION:**

1. Hose Dryer Donation

The Administrator read the memo from the Fire Department requesting permission to donate an old hose dryer to a fire company in need. The dryer is being replaced as part of the renovation of Fire Co. #2. The Council had no objection to the donation.

2. Road Resurfacing 2015 - Riverside Coop Bid Result

The Administrator said our portion of the Riverside Co-op bid came in at \$311,990; the amount budgeted is only \$325,000. If we award with the Riverside Co-op we will not have the intended \$25,000 for micro-surfacing, nor will we have enough to cover the CDBG grant shortfall to pave Berkley Street from Linden Place to the Faller Circle. She said we could reject the Riverside Co-op bid and go out to bid on our own or we can award with Riverside, skip the micro-surfacing for this year and take the balance for the CDBG project from the capital improvement fund.

Mayor Subrizi said the CDBG project cannot be reduced and in order to accept the grant funds we have committed to pay the balance in order to complete the project.

The Council agreed to award the Riverside Co-op bid. The Administrator said she has the resolution prepared but that it cannot be awarded until the next meeting as we are still within the twenty-day estoppel period.

#### 3. PD Body Cameras

The topic was held for discussion later in the meeting.

#### 4. Administrator's Report

The Administrator explained that resolution 2015:167 has been withdrawn by the Tax Collector. The resolution incorrectly stated that the 2015 taxes had been paid in full and the money was to be refunded. In fact the 2015 taxes have not been paid in full and the reduction will be credited against the outstanding 2015 taxes.

The Administrator reminded the Council of a discussion from the last meeting at which time the Council authorized a letter of intent to express interest in the County's Technical Assistance Grant for Floodplain Acquisition Plan and Floodplain Conservation and Restoration Planning. She said the requirement has been modified since the last discussion and a declaration of interest, bearing the Mayor's signature is now required. She said she has prepared a resolution authorizing the declaration and the Mayor's signature. The resolution was added to the agenda as resolution 2015:169.

The Administrator read an email from Chief Ramaci regarding traffic patrols and idling in which he advised the officers will be mindful of the issue. He also advised of changes he has made with regard to the positioning of barricades and easily navigated detour routes.

The Administrator referenced a question that had been raised as to whether or not the lease with Little League would need to be nullified in order to be eligible for BCOS grant funding. She said she has been in touch with BCOS and has provided them with additional information to enable them to review it fully and she is awaiting their response.

The Administrator referenced a letter from the Beautification Committee, addressed to United Water, regarding access to a water supply on the Borough owned property at the intersection of River Edge and Holland Avenue. The letter had been emailed to the Council in advance and she asked if there would be any objection to allowing the Beautification Committee to send the letter. The Council had no objection.

Mr. Madaio reported that he had sent a letter to both PSE&G and New Jersey Transit with regard to idling vehicles on borough streets.

Mr. Madaio said that he is expecting to receive a draft lease, for the use of Berkley field, from the BOE attorney within the week.

Councilman Putrino made motion to open to the public. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Wendy Mackey – 796 Plympton Street. Ms. Mackey said she was attending the meeting with the Bridge family to inquire about a letter received by a number of families in town instructing them to remove basketball hoops. Mayor Subrizi said the letter was sent to 110 families by the Property Maintenance Officer and the ordinance referenced in the letter pertains to access to the right-of-way. Mayor Subrizi said the hoops, placed on curbs or in the street are a danger to the snow plow and the street sweeper. She said the PMO is not looking to ticket people but is primarily interested in compliance. She said hoops that are no longer in use and those permanently affixed are to be removed; all others need be kept off the sidewalk, out of the right-

of-way and should be brought in during the winter. The Mayor said specific questions should be directed to the PMO.

Being no further comment from the public, Councilman Putrino made a motion to close to the public. Council President Colucci seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Robalino made a motion to go into closed session. Council President Colucci seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:23 PM.

Mayor Subrizi told him that he could not use the area on June 14<sup>th</sup> because of the motorcycle run and she asked if anyone on the Council had any objection to the request. Being no objection the Mayor said she would speak with the Superintendent of Schools before giving Father Hadado permission to use the street for parking.

Councilman Alonso noted that resolution 2015:164 had not been offered or seconded by any member of the Council. Councilman Putrino made a motion to table the ordinance until such time as Councilman Cabrera could be present. Councilman Ashley seconded the motion. No vote was taken as Councilman Cabrera joined the meeting at 8:18 PM

#### COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilman Putrino made a motion to open to the public. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Donna Tomasini – Charles Street. Ms. Tomasini referenced the previously introduced bond ordinance for the paving of the Boulevard and asked if the PSE&G work on the Boulevard would encompass any of the same area. She was advised that it would not. Ms. Tomasini asked if PSE&G would be repaving all of the roads that have been compromised as part of this project. Mayor Subrizi said they said they would at the pre-construction meeting. She said nothing would be done in the short-term; they will be replacing the mains and then all the laterals to the homes. Nothing will be paved until the entire project has been completed.

Phil Felleti – 308 Monmouth Avenue. Mr. Felletti referenced a letter he received regarding his basketball hoop. Mr. Madaio said the letter was sent by the Property Maintenance Officer, not the Mayor and Council. Mr. Madaio said the issue addressed is a real one for the borough. He explained that nets no longer in use must be removed, nets permanently affixed at the curb must be removed, any net within the public right-of-way on either the sidewalk or the street must be removed and all others should be rolled back in, away from the curb, in the winter.

Mayor Subrizi noted that Council President Colucci had returned to the meeting at 8:23 PM.

Councilman Robalino made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

#### VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS

Mr. Madaio noted the consent agenda, as agreed previously, would consist of resolutions 2015:159 through 2015:163, resolution 2015:165 through 2015:166, and resolution 2015:168 through 2015:169. Councilman Robalino made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Councilman Alonso seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Mayor Subrizi referenced resolution 2015:164 saying it is a resolution of support for an existing state law that prevents idling. Councilman Alonso questioned the intent of the third item listed and asked how it would be enforced. He said he is in favor of sending a message but concerned that this may be intrusive. The Mayor said we are looking for compliance and this resolution supports State law.

Councilman Cabrera made a motion to approve resolution 2015:164. Councilman Ashley

seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote as follows: For the motion:

Councilman Robalino referenced a previous conversation regarding whether or not there is an ordinance to prohibit smoking on borough property and particularly at recreation fields. He said there is no ordinance but he believes there is a State law. He said for this reason he does not believe it is necessary to pass an ordinance in order to place a sign by the Recreation building. Mayor Subrizi said if State law provides for the prohibition we should place the signs. Mr. Madaio said he will look into it to confirm the State law exists and if so will provide Councilman Robalino with the statute number.

Councilman Cabrera asked if the topic of body cameras was discussed at the work session. Mr. Madaio said there has been some discussion on whether or not body cameras can be used interchangeably with the dash cameras. He said he is trying to get an answer from someone at the attorney general's office.

Mayor Subrizi asked why Councilman Cabrera had asked for it to be listed on the agenda. Councilman Cabrera said money could be saved by substituting body cameras for dash cameras. He said he believes body cameras are more reliable. Mayor Subrizi said that this is probably something that not everyone would agree upon. She said before deciding anything we would need to meet with the Chief.

Councilman Alonso said if the police department does not want to use body cameras it is a waste of time for the Council to discuss it; we can buy body cameras but we can't make the police department use them. He said before making any decisions we would need direction from the police department as to whether or not they have any interest in using body cameras.

Mr. Madaio asked if we are likely to purchase anything in the near future. The Administrator said she has spoken with the Chief and although there is money allocated in the budget and although it is a requirement for all new vehicles he has no intention to purchase anything until such time as the attorney general issues a guideline on the requirements for the cameras. Mr. Madaio said there will be directives from law enforcement at the highest level in the State and the Chief has indicated that he is reluctant to do anything in advance of those directives. He asked if there is really anything the Council needs to do until we get those directives. Councilman Cabrera said we could ask the Chief to look into both body cameras and dashboard cameras. He suggested setting up a pilot program similar to the one set up in the County.

Mayor Subrizi suggested continuing the discussion at a later date when we have more facts. The Council agreed to list it for discussion at the next work session and to have the Chief attend to get his input as to what he feels is the next step. Councilman Cabrera asked to have the discussion in closed session stating there was a particular personnel matter he wished to reference. Mayor Subrizi said personnel matters can be discussed in closed but if it is about a specific person the person would need to be provided a Rice notice. The Mayor said a discussion about the purchase of cameras would have to be held in open. Mr. Madaio said if Councilman Cabrera has something he believes should be discussed in closed he should speak privately to him about it and they could review the nine exceptions allowed to be discussed in closed.

Mr. Madaio said if the goal is to have a plan a committee should meet with the Chief to determine the Council's preference and the Chief's preference. He said we would then need to determine if the Council disagrees with the department if the Council can impose their will.

Mayor Subrizi said Councilman Cabrera's comment regarding personnel concerns her in that he seems to have some other agenda. Councilman Cabrera said he has no other agenda; he is aware of an incident that if the officer had a camera on the outcome may have been different.

#### 2. Library Board of Trustees Meeting May 21, 2015

The President made note of the Personnel policy & procedures manual needs to be reviewed. The Directors report included issues regarding B&G. HVAC attic unit leaked in the biography section. Repairs were made and the damage did not rise to the level of an insurance claim. The tree planting revealed a sink hole in the front of the building. DW was called in to help. The remedy will be executed as soon as the sprinkler connections are repaired. We will be participating in the 1000 books before Kindergarten program. Terrie McColl was given an award for her work as the President of the NJ Library Association in 2014. The Paramus Library will be hosting BooksNJ on June 14 from 1 - 5. The Circulation Desk and the Meeting Room Floor projects are moving along slowly. The floor will be done on June 16th following abatement of the linoleum tiles. The plans for the circulation desk are to be finalized, with a hopeful start date of September 2015. Funds from the Library's Gif Account will be used to have both areas and the hallways painted. I had to leave the meeting at 5:30, but the board stayed tocomplete work on the policies and procedures manual.

#### 3. Police Department May 2015

Interviews have been completed and four new Police Officers will be hired in June. Three sergeants will be promoted to LT. to fill the gaps created by Det/Lt. Ramaci's promotion to Chief; Lt. John Kiene's promotion to Captain; and the retirement of Lt. Stephen Littlefield. The new hires and the promotions will fill the table of organization requirements and bring us to a force of 35 officers. The Police construction committee met on May 7th. We asked for a more comprehensive needs assessment document from Robbie Conley in order to proceed with committee talks on the new construction of headquarters. We are working on a codifying the promotion policy.

<u>Police Auxiliary</u> met on May 5th. I was unable to attend because I was at the wake of Bob Chester.

#### 4. Planning Board

The Planning Board did not meet on May 19th. There have been no applications or issues. I was not able to attend the meeting on May 26th due to a conflict with the Girl Scouts Awards program. A meeting on June 16th will include our planner and updates on COAH.

#### 5. Labor negotiations

All labor union s are working under the terms of their last contract.

**RWDSU 108** has filed for mediation which is scheduled on Friday, June 5th. At this time we hope to find out why their Union Rep walked out of the last meeting.

**PBA** has filed for mediation. We are trying to set up one last meeting before that in an attempt to resolve issues before the next step.

**DPW** has been silent on any further talks.

6. <u>Energy Strong</u> is barreling through our neighborhoods installing new gas mains. There are two different constructions companies working on the project simultaneously. It is straining our police overtime resources. The project is scheduled to be done before the end of the year.

#### Miscellaneous

May 16 - I met with Marlene Casey at her home. I delivered the planner's study and the letter the council agreed upon which concluded our attempts to purchase her historic home.

May 16 - I attended a tree planting at the Middle School in honor of Steve LePage.

May 17 - The NMHS anti human trafficking Color Fun 5K took place. IF this is to be an annual event we will need to ask them to provide better notification regarding road closures to the affected neighborhoods.

May 17 - I went to the Hermitage in Hohokus to help honor New Milford Girl Scout, Rachel Vasquez, for her Gold Award Project which was a sensory herb garden.

May 21 - Thanks to the Public Events Committee, the Historic Preservation Commission, and the New Milford Boy/Cub Scouts for their recognition of the Revolutionary and Civil War veterans who are buried at the French Hugenot Cemetery. It has grown to enjoy a much larger crowd over the years.

The improved Boulevard crossing at Vomel has now been painted, the curb cuts are complete, and the bus stop was moved. This week we added crosswalk signs and a beat up little green man to help with visibility.
