Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statement. The meeting was held by electronic means, in accordance with law. The Mayor read an announcement regarding public comments during remote meetings.

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from the November 8, 2021, Closed and Work Session meetings. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2021:20

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER XXX OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "LAND USE" THEREBY AMENDING ARTICLE IV ENTITLED "ZONING" TO ADD SECTION 30-28.19 "ELECTRIC VEHICLE SUPPLY/SERVICE EQUIPMENT (EVSE) & MAKE-READY PARKING SPACES

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "SALARY," ADOPTED AS ORDINANCE 91:01 AND AMENDED ANNUALLY BY ORDINANCE UP TO AND INCLUDING ORDINANCE 2019:03

Council President Grant made a motion to open to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on this ordinance.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to close to the public. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Grant made a motion to adopt this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Green Team 2021 Review

Councilwoman Sandhusen introduced Green Team members, Michael Sermabekian and Anita Pinto. She said the Green Team got up and running in the summer of 2020 and recently obtained bronze certification, and was named Rookie of the Year, by Sustainable Jersey.

Mr. Sermabekian reviewed their completed actions and discussed the plan for reaching silver and eventually gold. He said New Milford currently has 190 points and needs 350 to obtain silver certification.

Ms. Pinto talked about the energy tracking that is underway and said this will be instrumental to New Milford reaching gold. She said New Milford is one of few towns in northern New Jersey to undertake energy tracking.

Mayor Putrino thanked the Green Team for their efforts and asked if there was a timeline for reaching silver. Mr. Sermabekian said it may be possible in 2022 but if not, by 2023.

2. Schedule Updates

- Santa Landing by Helicopter – December 4th – NMHS Football Field – Gates open at 8:45 AM and Santa is scheduled to land at 10:00 AM.

- Holiday Tree Lighting/Winter Wonderland – December 5th the tree lighting will take place at 5:30 along with the lighting of the last candle of the menorah. The Winter Wonderland drive-by will run from 6:00 to 8:00 PM – enter on Trotta Drive, exiting on Patrolman Ray Woods Drive
- The Santa Mailbox has been placed in front of NMPD and will be out 11/27 through 12/24
- Senior Transportation is up and running – Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday for medical appointments and Thursday for Shop Rite.

3. Administrator's Report

- The Public Safety Leadership Team, formed in 2020 and consisting of representatives from NMPD, NMFD, DPW, OEM, Police Auxiliary, NMVAC, and Administration met for the first time in more than a year on 11/18. The purpose of the group is to increase and maintain communication between public safety organizations and to promote quality, cost-effective measures to safeguard life and property in the borough. Meetings were suspended since the onset of COVID, as the COVID Task Force, consisting of many of the same members, was meeting every two weeks. Going forward, the group will meet on a quarterly basis.
- RFQs for 2022 professionals have come in. We did not receive any responses for the Rent Leveling Attorney position. The position will be advertised again on both the website and in the newspaper, with a return date of 12/20.
- Engineering Report
 - Knights Field – Field netting is the only item remaining prior to the contractor obtaining substantial completion – estimated for December. A pavilion has been ordered and will be installed next spring.
 - Madison Avenue Sidewalk – Current construction cost estimate \$185,000, as opposed to the \$117,000 estimate used for the grant application. The engineer has also recommended LED rapid flashing beacons, which will add \$25,000 to the construction costs and result in additional design costs. We will need to allocate an additional \$110,000, which will be funded through capital improvement.
 - DOT Culvert Project – there is a discrepancy with the limits of the borough's right of way – a title search and property line delineation are required. Anticipated start – May 2022
 - DOT Road Project (Boulevard) – Construction completion notice sent to NJDOT 10/27/21.
 - Kennedy Field Bench Covers – Preconstruction meeting held 11/19. Work tentatively scheduled to begin in January, pending the receipt of the materials.

Councilwoman Grant asked if all the previous caveats apply to resolution 2021:251. The Administrator said that all the items proposed for acquisition are outlined in the body of the resolution.

Mr. Kelly said he needed more information regarding resolution 2021:260 and asked to postpone consideration of this resolution until the next meeting.

Councilwoman Duffie asked who would be using the vehicle referenced in resolution 2021:260; if it would be part of the regular fleet and if it is replacing a vehicle that will no longer be used. Mr. Kelly said he believed that it was a replacement for a previously damaged vehicle. Councilwoman Duffie asked if we limited the number of cars we carry. Mayor Putrino said it is not limited by ordinance. Councilwoman Duffie said she has been questioned on the number of cars parked adjacent to the police station. Councilman Grotsky said we usually replace two cars per year because they take a beating.

Council President Grant made a motion to remove resolution 2021:260 from the consent agenda and postpone consideration until the next meeting. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Seymour made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Grotsky said the Shade Tree Commission has revised the welcome letter that goes out to new residents, to update the tree information.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said she attended the recent ADAM event and she extended condolences to all affected.

Councilman Seymour reported on the 3rd annual ADAM event and complimented the NMMA on the important and touching tribute. He thanked co-chair Mel Urena's daughter and the NMHS chorus for singing at the event and commented on the efforts of Chair, Alyssa Loonam and Co-Chair Mel Urena. Councilman Seymour thanked the Recreation Department for the recently completed soccer season. Mayor Putrino extended thanks to the volunteers and coordinators as well.

Councilwoman Duffie said she and the Beautification Committee would be taking part in the upcoming Winter Wonderland event. She said planning for the 100th Anniversary is moving along with announcements coming regarding the events that have been planned for the upcoming year. She said the street light banners have sold out. Mayor Putrino said 100th anniversary flags have been ordered and will be displayed as well.

Council President Grant said the library has hired three new part-time employees. She said the library has ordered a plaque to commemorate the dedication of the sculpture garden. Council President Grant said she attended the Sr. Center Hanukah celebration, which was simulcast on Zoom. She also reported on a recent article in the Record on black cemeteries. She said that New Milford was not mentioned in the article but that there is one in New Milford, and she will soon have more to report.




