
MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM PUBLIC SESSION MEETING CLOSED SESSION IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING Monday, December 20, 2021



PUBLIC SESSION:

Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statement. The meeting was held by electronic means, in accordance with law. The Mayor read an announcement regarding public comments during remote meetings.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to approve of the minutes from the November 29, 2021 Closed and Public Session meetings. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Environmental & Energy Commission – Year-End Report

Councilwoman Sandhusen introduced Environmental & Energy Chairperson, Lynn Torpie. Ms. Torpie said the commission has retooled to ensure that the work is more in line with its foundational ordinance, which includes a year-end report.

Ms. Torpie reported on the commission's work to make the New Milford Woods more useable with a \$1,500 grant from ANJEC. She said much was accomplished with the collaboration of the DPW and culminated in a dedication day. She said ANJEC was very pleased with the project and the EEC will continue to make improvements, including a trail board, which will be created and installed as part of an upcoming Eagle Scout project.

In addition to the New Milford Woods project, Ms. Torpie said the EEC worked on the creation of bylaws, gathered information for an electronic vehicle charging station and participated in Clean Communities Day. She said future goals include assisting businesses in

the transition from single use plastic bags and the creation of an Environmental Resource Inventory which will help to inform decisions, with regard to development, going forward.

2. NMPD Ordinance Recommendations

The Administrator referenced the memo on the two proposed ordinances, which had been circulated previously. She said the first is for the cutting of plant life within a certain distance of a roadway or intersection. The ordinance currently requires notice to be sent by the Police Chief. She said NMPD is requesting to change the ordinance to permit notice to be sent by the Police Chief or their designee or the Property Maintenance Officer or their designee. She said the second ordinance pertains to overweight vehicles on certain borough roadways. She said the current penalty is significantly less than the state penalty for the same offence. She said NMPD has recommended a penalty of \$250 for vehicles between four and ten tons and a penalty of \$500 for anything over ten tons.

There were no questions or objections on either ordinance. The ordinances will be prepared for introduction on January 10, 2022.

3. Municipal Prosecutor Salary

The Administrator referenced the previously circulated memo from the Court Administrator. She said pre-pandemic court was held twice per month and the prosecutor was paid \$12,000 annually. She said court has been being held weekly and will continue in this manner for the foreseeable future. The Prosecutor has requested an increase to \$18,000.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to authorize a salary of \$18,000 annually for the Prosecutor. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

4. Warren Street Park

Mayor Putrino said the governing body discussed and approved a recommendation in March to add parking and an ADA accessible space at Warren Street Park. He said last week construction got underway and was met with some concern by residents in the area. He said he met with some of the Sheridan Street residents who asked for something less intrusive. As a result, an alternative has been proposed to eliminate the parking spaces in the park and create just one ADA accessible space on Sheridan Street with an ADA accessible curb cut and walkway. He asked the Council to weigh in on whether they wished to move forward with the original plan or would prefer to go with the alternate plan.

Council President Grant said we should go with the alternate plan, which fulfills the ADA requirements, since the original plan is not desired or necessary. Councilman Seymour concurred saying we should accommodate the legitimate concerns of the residents of the neighborhood, while meeting the ADA requirements.

Mayor Putrino credited the DPW for recognizing deficiencies and offering alternative solutions when other issues are brought forth. He then asked for a motion.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to create one accessible space on the street and install a curb cut and pathway with no additional spaces being added to the park. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote as follows:

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said she has a family member who resides in the neighborhood, which is why she abstained.

5. Schedule Updates

Mayor Putrino said the Reorganization meeting of the Mayor and Council will be held virtually on January 3, 2022 at 7:00 PM. He said Mayor and Council meetings will continue virtually for the first quarter of 2022.

He said the NMFD will be holding a private ceremony on January 1, 2022 to swear in the new officers. He said the event will be open only to family members of the officers.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley thanked everyone who participated in the Tree Lighting/Winter Wonderland event.

Councilwoman Sandhusen expressed her appreciation to all the volunteers and families of volunteers who serve the community and thanked everyone for the response to the Police Department and Fire Department toy drives.

Mayor Putrino also thanked the Lions and the Elks for recent donations to the social services department for the benefit of residents in need.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley asked for anyone who may be discarding holiday decorations to consider donating them for next year's Winter Wonderland.

Mayor Putrino reported there will be a swearing in ceremony for three new police officers and a promotion to Captain for Det. Lt. Van Saders on December 30th at 6:00 PM. He said this event will be held privately and is not open to the public. He further reported on the retirement walkout for Captain Jones on December 29th at 1:00 PM, which is open to the public as it will be held outdoors.

6. Administrator's Report

• RFQs for the 2022 Rent Leveling Attorney position were due today. Two responses were received and will be forwarded to the governing body for their review and consideration.

- Borough officials will be meeting with USDA tomorrow to look at areas that may qualify for Emergency Watershed Protection Program grant money to address Ida damage. The two areas being considered are Hirschfeld Brook off of Carlton Place and the French Brook at Korfitsen.
- The Borough will be closed on Friday, December 24th and Friday, December 31st.
- The annual reorganization meeting which will be held virtually on Monday, 1/3 followed by the January work session on January 10th.

Councilwoman Sandhusen asked to have resolution 2021:284 removed from the consent agenda.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Council President Grant made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Grotsky commended the DPW on their solution for Warren Park.

Council President Grant said the library remains open to the public but will be closed for the upcoming holidays and the day before Christmas and New Year's. She wished everyone happy holidays and a happy New Year.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Senior Center remains open, with restrictions. She said the borough is in need of volunteers for the following committees: Stigma Free, Public Events, Sr. Advisory Board and the Historic Commission.

Mayor Putrino said anyone interested in volunteering should send an email to volunteer@newmilfordboro.com.

Councilman Seymour thanked the DPW for being responsive to resident concerns and he thanked the residents for coming forward with their concerns. He thanked the schools and congratulated them on their winter concerts and wished everyone happy holidays.

Councilwoman Sandhusen thanked all volunteers and said this was a foundational year for some committees and they are building momentum. She said both the Environmental Commission and the Green Team are in need of volunteers.

Mayor Putrino thanked the NMPD for keeping New Milford one of the safest communities. He thanked the parents, coaches, and coordinators for a great year of sports. He said there will be a number of events next year for the 100th Anniversary of New Milford in addition to the dedication of Knights Field.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Sandra Kahak – 1117 Warren Street. Ms. Kahak thanked the governing body for deciding to go with an alternate plan at Warren Street Park. She asked if the trench would be repaired now or at a later date. The Administrator said it would be dependent upon the contractor's schedule but that we would ask to have it restored as soon as possible. She asked where the accessible parking space would be located. Mayor Putrino said it would be near the existing electrical box. Ms. Kahak said the signage, which provides the hours for the park, has gone missing. The Administrator said it will be replaced.

Being no other member of the public who wished to speak, Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to close to the public. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS

Regarding resolution 2021:284, Councilwoman Sandhusen asked if there was a date for the planned installation. The Administrator said it has not been scheduled. Councilwoman Sandhusen asked how many receivers the cell tower would accommodate. The Administrator said at one point there were five co-locaters; currently there is only one.

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the consent agenda consisting of resolutions 2021:263 through 2021:283. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Grant made a motion to approve resolution 2021:284. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, except Councilwoman Sandhusen who abstained.

Mayor Putrino said the governing body would be going into closed session and will take no further action. He said the meeting will be adjourned upon return to open session.

Council President Grant made a motion to go into closed session. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:53 PM.

The grant will provide iPads to libraries for patriots to use for low-cost telemedicine appointments, to consult with a doctor, interview for a job and obtain authoritative health information.
