MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM WORK SESSION OPEN SESSION immediately following 7:45 PM PUBLIC MEETING Monday, August 24, 2015



WORK SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

Mayor Subrizi asked for a motion to add a fourth item to the closed session agenda, the Police Chief's contract. Councilman Robalino made a motion to add it to the agenda. Councilman Alonso seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Robalino made a motion to go into closed session. Council President Colucci seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

CLOSED SESSION:

At the conclusion of the closed session Councilman Putrino made a motion to return to open session. Councilman Ashley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

OPEN SESSION:

1. American Legion Parking Lot

The Council discussed the two alternatives presented by the Engineer; to work with the existing macadam or to resurface completely. They also discussed Lt. Jones recommendations for the parking in the surrounding neighborhood.

The Council decided to work with the existing lot, which would produce approximately fifteen parking spots. The DPW will work with the Engineer to stripe the lot appropriately, a guard rail will be installed and appropriate signage will be placed outlining the permitted hours for parking.

The Council also agreed to introduce an ordinance to restrict parking to one side of Prospect Avenue between Main and Demarest and on Cleveland between Prospect and Summit. The ordinance will be prepared for introduction at the September public meeting.

2. Interlocal Agreement - CFO

The Administrator said the Interlocal Agreement with Wyckoff will expire at the end of the year and she recommended renewing it as outlined in the proposed draft agreement. The Council unanimously agreed. Resolution 2015:250 was added to the agenda to authorize Mayor Subrizi to sign the agreement.

3. NJ Transit Update

Mayor Subrizi reported that she, Councilman Cabrera and the Administrator recently met with three representatives from New Jersey Transit. She said a number of issues were discussed including the reduction in the number of buses traveling on Madison Avenue back to the garage, idling, layovers throughout town and layovers on Madison Avenue behind the High School.

She said in order to reduce the number of buses traveling on Madison back to the garage they would need to be rerouted on Milford Avenue in Dumont to Main Street in New Milford. She said that Dumont has prohibited buses to use New Milford Avenue and even if they were to allow it we would then be routing buses through neighborhoods in New Milford that do not currently have bus traffic. The Mayor said she would be contacting the Mayor of Dumont to see if they would even entertain the idea of lifting the New Milford Avenue restriction.

Regarding idling it was noted that bus drivers receive tickets that go on their individual licenses for all motor vehicle infractions and that after they receive two violations they are given time off without pay.

The Mayor listed the various locations throughout town in which buses have been known to layover – Madison Avenue by the liquor store and in front of the VFW, the 7-11 at the south end of town; across the street from the Top Stone Church. She said that NJ Transit has acknowledged that drivers should not be laying over in these locations and they encouraged the Police Department to enforce the infractions and asked for them to be reported to Transit. Reports must be made within 72 hours in order for a violation to be issued to the driver.

Regarding the layover on Madison Avenue behind the High School representatives from NJ Transit said this was agreed to by a prior borough administration. The Transit representative claimed that if buses were to return to the garage instead of laying over on Madison Avenue it

may result in reduced service in New Milford. The Council discussed the safety concerns in allowing the buses to layover in this location. They also discussed how these concerns could be alleviated with the installation of a sidewalk and a cut-in where the bus could park.

Mayor Subrizi said NJ Transit has asked to be allowed to let this practice continue. She asked for the Council to weigh in. Councilman Cabrera made a motion to discontinue the practice, thereby prohibiting NJ Transit buses from laying over on Madison Avenue until such time as a sidewalk could be installed. Councilman Ashley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote as follows:

In casting his vote, Councilman Robalino said he did not think the layover on Madison should be eliminated without offering an alternative.

The Administrator will send a letter to NJ Transit notifying them to discontinue layovers on Madison Avenue.

4. Land Use Boards

Council President Colucci said he was made aware that information may have been put out to the applicant at a Zoning Board meeting that may have been premature. He suggested that both land use attorneys should give semi-annual refreshers to the board members of what should and should not be said during meetings. The Council agreed. Mr. Madaio will contact the land use attorneys to make the suggestion.

5. Shared Services

Councilman Cabrera read a statement, regarding shared services, into the record (copy attached). Councilman Cabrera made a motion to halt the proposed new police headquarters until such time as a discussion can be held with Dumont regarding shared services. He suggested forming a committee on which he would like to serve. He said the goal is to share the police station with Dumont and everything is on the table including the possibility of merging the two police departments.

Councilman Alonso said it has taken two years to get to this point. He asked how long a study would take, how much it would cost and who would pay for it. Councilman Cabrera said we won't know until we have the discussion. Councilman Alonso asked how he could vote for the motion without this information.

Mayor Subrizi said the idea of a centralized court was considered in the proposed design and this is something that has already been discussed with Dumont. She said the building has been designed to house New Milford's staff and cannot be designed any bigger to accommodate another department. She said she believes that Councilman Cabrera's suggestion is unrealistic. She asked where the perceived savings would come from and noted

the railroad divides the two towns. She said we did look into sharing services with Dumont before we got into the planning stages.

Councilman Ashley seconded Councilman Cabrera's motion.

Councilman Alonso said the Council cannot discuss sharing the facility unless we consolidate the departments. Councilman Cabrera said everything is on the table.

Mayor Subrizi said the Police Department's needs are urgent and the building was designed for the possible shared service of the Court.

The motion failed to carry on a roll call vote as follows:

In casting his vote Councilman Alonso said he is favor of saving money and a proponent of consolidating services but said there is nothing on the table to suggest there would be a cost savings.

Council President Colucci asked if the Councilman from Dumont who wrote the letter to the Twin Boro News is up for reelection. Councilman Cabrera said he did not know but that he does not believe so.

6. Administrator's Report

The Administrator reported that there was a problem with the master contract for the Riverside Cooperative 2015 Road Program; the insurance requirements in the contract did not match the bid specification. The Cooperative was the cause of the problem, not the contractor. By the time it was resolved and we met with the contractor for a pre-construction meeting on August 6th he was scheduling the work with an October start date. This would not be good for the Borough during leaf season. The contractor has offered to hold his pricing to the Spring and with the Council's approval we would schedule an early April start. This would benefit the Borough because the PSE&G work should be completed by the end of the year. The Council agreed to hold off until the Spring.

PUBLIC SESSION:

Councilman Putrino confirmed there were no members of the public waiting in the Council Chambers. Mayor Subrizi stated the meeting would continue with the Public Session in the upstairs meeting room.

PUBLIC HEARING: BCOS BERKLEY FIELD APPLICATION

Councilman Ashley made a motion to open to the public for comment on the application. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on the application.

Councilman Putrino made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Alonso seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Putrino made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Council President Colucci made a motion to approve of the minutes from the July 27, 2015 Work and Public Sessions. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2015:16

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$123,700 FOR THE REHABILITATION OF THE BASKETBALL COURTS AT PROSPECT PARK IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM A COUNTY GRANT AND FROM THE OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

Mayor Subrizi said resolution 2015:250 was added to the agenda to approve the renewal of the Interlocal agreement for the services of the CFO.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilman Cabrera made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Council President Colucci seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

John Bigger – 325 William Street.

Mr. Bigger asked for clarification on where the NJ Transit buses are parking.

Mr. Bigger offered his perspective on the proposed consolidation of the Police Department. He said it worked in Nassau and Suffolk counties because each municipality became a precinct. He said until Bergen County decides to do something similar, merging contracts with one or more towns will result in a cost. He referenced the merging of a Hudson County Fire Department as an example.

John Rutledge – 335 River Road.

Mr. Rutledge said he applauds Councilman Cabrera on his vision but agrees with Mr. Bigger on the potential costs. He suggested looking for other shared service opportunities with neighboring towns.

Donna Tomasini – 411 Charles Street.

Ms. Tomasini thanked the Council for working the NJ Transit to alleviate some of the ongoing issues. She suggested posting something on the Borough website to alert residents to the potential infractions and to ask them to report them.

Mr. Rutledge asked if anyone has suggested to NJ Transit that they request permission to use a portion of the United Water Company property for layovers.

Councilman Cabrera said he thinks the school buses should layover on Cecchino Drive not on Madison Avenue. Mayor Subrizi said they are off the street but asked Councilman Robalino to mention this at the next BOE meeting.

Thea Sirocchi – 455 Ryeside.

Ms. Sirocchi said she does not think the Borough needs to accommodate the bus company but that the school buses are different; they need be able to park to be available to serve the kids.

Councilman Cabrera made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Alonso seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL:

Council President Colucci said we have had shared service discussion with Oradell in the past and they will be digging up their fuel tanks and have expressed interest in a shared service for fuel. He said perhaps they can share in the expense for the relocation of our fuel tanks as well.

Mayor Subrizi said she has explored the possibility of a shared service with the Board of Education for the use of equipment and perhaps personnel to clean and buff the Borough Hall floors.

Council President Colucci said Saddle River has implemented fines for illegal enrollment in their school system. Mayor Subrizi said that is a function of the BOE and they have an elaborate system in place to deter illegal enrollment. Mr. Madaio said he would research the issue.

Councilman Cabrera said he was approached by co-workers interested in using a Borough field. He was referred to the Recreation Director.

Councilman Cabrera apologized if he was rude to anyone during his earlier comments.

Mayor Subrizi apologized as well.

ADJOURNMENT

Councilman Robalino made a motion to adjourn. Councilman Alonso seconded the motion.

Prior to the motion being decided Councilman Putrino said some towns have a shared services committee; he asked to have this listed as a topic for discussion at the next meeting.

The motion to adjourn carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 9:08 PM.

LEGAL AUTHORITY:

WHEREAS, N.J.S. 40A:11-11(5), specifically authorizes two or more contracting units to enter into a Cooperative Pricing System and Agreement for the purchase of work, materials and supplies; and

WORK TO BE PERFORMED:

WHEREAS, the County of Somerset has been conducting a Cooperative Pricing System with Participating Contracting Units, utilizing administrative purchasing services and facilities of the County of Somerset; and this Cooperative Pricing Agreement is to effect substantial economies in the purchase of goods and supplies; and

WHEREAS, the County wishes to continue the Cooperative Pricing System with current members as well as other appropriate Public Agencies within the State of New Jersey or contingent to Somerset County; and

WHEREAS, all parties hereto have approved the within Agreement by Ordinance or Resolution as appropriate, in accordance with the aforesaid statute; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of all parties to enter into such Agreement for said purposes:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the conditions hereinafter set forth, it is mutually agreed as follows:

The goods or supplies to be priced cooperatively may include but are not limited to vehicles and trucks, road and bridge construction and maintenance materials, office supplies, furniture, lubricants, building materials, janitorial supplies, fuel, office equipment, maintenance and service and such other items as two or more participating contracting units in the system agree can be purchased on a cooperative basis, providing the County consents to these other items.

The items and classes of items which may be designated by the participating contracting units hereto may be purchased cooperatively for the period commencing with the execution of this Agreement and continuing until terminated as hereinafter provided.

ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATION OF SYSTEM:

- 2. The County, on behalf of all participating contracting units, at the beginning of participating in the Cooperative Pricing System, and during each January thereafter, shall publish a legal advertisement in such format as required by the State Division of Local Government Services in a newspaper normally used for such purposes by it to include such information as:
 - (1) The name of the participating contracting units, and
 - (2) The name of the County soliciting competitive bids or informal quotations, and
 - (3) The address and telephone number of the County, and
 - (4) The State Identification Code for the Cooperative Pricing System, and
 - (5) The expiration date of the Cooperative Pricing Agreement.
- 3. The specifications shall be prepared and approved by the County and filed as required by law, and no changes shall thereafter be made except as permitted by law. Nothing herein shall be deemed to prevent changes in specifications for subsequent purchases.
- 4. The County may provide the Participating Units with the copies of the specifications at least thirty (30) days prior to seeking bids and will notify the Participating Contracting Units, in writing, of the item(s) on which it will seek bids or notice of open end cooperative contracts which have been awarded on their behalf. For certain commodities, fifteen (15) days prior to advertising, each of the participating contracting units shall designate, in writing, to the County, the items to be purchased and indicate therein the approximate quantities desired, the location for delivery and other requirements, to permit the preparation and filing of specifications as provided by law.

The County will call a meeting of all Participating Contracting Units annually in order to provide the participants with an opportunity to discuss the goods or services to be priced cooperatively and the terms of the specifications for the next calendar year.

- 5. A single advertisement for bids or the solicitation of informal quotations for the goods or services to be purchased shall be presented on behalf of all of the Participating Contracting Units desiring to purchase any item by the County in the Cooperative Pricing System.
- In seeking bids the County will include in the specifications two categories upon which bids are sought: (a) the County's requirements, stated in definite quantities; and (b) the Participating Contracting Units, stated as an estimated total quantity of the needs of all the other Participating Contracting Units, which total shall not be exceeded in the aggregate by more than 20 percent of the total cost awarded for that Category. The specification for this category shall list the other Participating Contracting Units, their delivery address, their estimated maximum quantities and other relevant information to permit the bidder to understand what is potentially involved. The bids will contain: (1) a provision stating that contracts shall be in compliance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-5.5 (B), openend contract rules; and (2) language requiring the bid price(s) to be stated so that it is uniform with respect to both categories (the County and other Participating Contracting Units).

The provision with respect to the other contracting units' category will allow the bidder to indicate if it is willing to provide the item(s) bid upon to other participating contracting units in the system; or if it is not willing to extend prices to other participating units in the systems.

- 7. The County shall advertise for bids or the solicitation of informal quotations and shall receive bids or quotations on behalf of all Participating Contracting Units. Following the receipt of bids, the County shall review said bids and on behalf of all Participating Contracting Units, either reject all or certain of the bids or make an award to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders for each separate item. This award shall result in the County entering into a master contract with the successful bidder(s) providing for two categories or purchases:
 - (1) The quantities ordered for the County's own needs and
 - (2) The estimated aggregate quantities to be ordered by other Participating Contracting Units by separate contract, subject to the specifications and prices set forth in the County's overall master contract.
- The County shall enter into a formal written contract(s), when required by law, directly 8. with the successful bidder(s) only after it has certified the funds available only for its own needs ordered. Each Participating Contracting Unit shall also certify the funds available only for its own needs ordered; enter into a formal written contract, when required by law, directly with the successful bidder(s); issue purchase orders in its own name directly to the successful bidder(s) against said contract; accept its own deliveries; be invoiced by and receive statements from the successful bidder(s); make payment directly to the successful bidder(s); and be responsible for any tax liability. No Participating Contracting Unit in the Cooperative Pricing System shall be responsible for payment for any items ordered or for performance generally, by any other Participating Contracting Units and shall accordingly be liable only for its own performance and for items ordered and received by it and none assumes any additional responsibility or liability. The provisions of this paragraph shall be quoted or referred to and sufficiently described in all advertisements for bids by the County so that each bidder shall be on notice as to the respective responsibilities and liabilities of the Participating Contracting Units.

The County shall supply the Participating Contracting Units with copies of the specifications, name of successful bidder, prices awarded and the contract identification number. Each Participating Contracting Unit may then order directly from that vendor by purchase order if under the appropriate statutory bid limit or by contract of the governing body or agency if over the appropriate statutory bid limit. The identification number shall be affixed to each purchase order or contract and shown on all forms pertaining thereto.

- 9. If the lowest responsible bidder declines to extend prices to the Participating Contracting Units the contract for the County's needs (Primary) will be awarded, and (Secondary) bids may be awarded on behalf of the Participating Contracting Units.
- 10. A bidder shall not be required or permitted to extend his bid prices to Participating Contracting Units unless he has voluntarily agreed to do so as part of his bid.
- 11. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent any Participating Contracting Unit from awarding contracts of purchase, with or without advertising, individually and on its own behalf, provided, however, that invitations for such individual bids shall not be advertised, nor shall bids be received individually, during the period in which the County is advertising for and receiving bids for the same goods or services, except in the case of emergency or hardship.

- 12. No purchase order or contract shall be issued by any Participating Contracting Unit for a price which exceeds any other price available to it from any other such system in which it is authorized to participate or from bids which it has itself received.
- 13. The County reserves the right to exclude any goods or services from within said system if, in its opinion, the pooling of purchasing requirements or needs of the Participating Contracting Units is either not beneficial or not workable.

ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS:

14. The County shall bear all costs associated with administering the Cooperative Pricing system and bidding process including cost of advertising and administration and the Participating Contracting Units shall not be obligated for any part of such expenses.

DURATION AND TERMINATION:

- 15. This Agreement shall become effective the date executed, subject to the approval of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services and shall continue in effect for a period not to exceed five (5) years from said date or the term of the current approval unless any party to this Agreement shall give written notice of its intention to terminate its participation at least 30 days prior to the succeeding four (4) years. The County may choose to terminate registration of the system no later than 30 days prior to the expiration date of the system. Renewal of the system will be in accordance with the provisions of N.JA.C. 5:34-17.6, as may be amended.
- This Agreement and the Cooperative Pricing System will not terminate nor be invalidated by the County or the withdrawal or addition of any Participating Contracting Unit. However, this Agreement and the Cooperative Pricing System shall be terminable and invalidated at the instance of the County upon written notice to the Participating Contracting Unit and without recourse against the County for any reason or if continuance of the within system becomes unlawful for any reason.

DOCUMENTATION:

- 17. All records and documents maintained or utilized pursuant to the terms of this Agreement shall be identified by the code number assigned by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, and such other numbers as are assigned by the County for purposes identifying each contract and item awarded, in this case #2 SOCCP
- 18. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto.
- 19. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which, when so executed, shall be deemed to be an original, but such counterparts shall together constitute but one and the same instrument.
