Councilman Seymour made a motion to go into closed session. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:04 PM.

At the conclusion of the closed session, Councilman Seymour made a motion to return to open session. Council President Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:11 PM.

OPEN SESSION:

1. NMPD Traffic - Ordinance Revision Requests

The Administrator reviewed the memo from Lt. Justin Pisano, in which he suggested the addition of a stop sign on westbound Ridge Street at Dahlia Drive. She then went on to review the response from the engineer, in which he noted that stop signs should not be used for speed control and additionally questioned the placement of the existing stop sign on northbound Dahlia at Ridge Street.

Mr. Kelly confirmed the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) for Streets and Highways does require the municipal engineer to certify, under seal, that any sign installed has been approved by the engineer and conforms to the current standards prescribed by the MUTCD.

The Administrator said the engineer quoted a price of between \$5,000 and \$10,000 for the traffic study and certification. She said they will do it for \$4,000 if the Police Department can provide crash history reports and perform the volume counts. She said the Police Department

has advised that there have been no accidents at the intersection during the last year and said the suggestion, to add the sign, has been made preemptively.

The Administrator suggested, and the Council agreed, to schedule a meeting between the engineer and the Police Department to discuss the best plan to address the concerns.

2. Administrator's Report

The Administrator reviewed the revisions that had been made since the last meeting of the budget committee, which included the anticipation of an additional \$75,000 in surplus. She said as drafted, the increase in municipal taxes to the average homeowner would be \$59. She said the committee is recommending some additional changes, with a net decrease of \$6,700.

The Administrator then reviewed the recommended capital expenditures, which include \$350,000 for road improvements, \$28,500 for police equipment, \$50,000 for firefighter equipment and \$43,800 for various buildings and grounds improvements. She said \$440,000 would be paid through a capital improvement bond, with an additional \$75,000 for engineering and legal, putting the bond ordinance at just over a half of million dollars. The balance of the items, totaling \$39,500, will be purchased outright through the capital improvement fund.

The Administrator said, barring any comments or objection from the Council, the budget will be prepared for introduction on March 23rd.

The Administrator said representatives from Legislative District 38 will be holding mobile officer hours at the Borough Hall on Wednesday, February 26th from 12 noon until 2:00 PM.

The Administrator said the deadline for the Declaration of Intent for the Bergen County Open Space grant application is April 3rd. She said the Recreation Director has expressed interest in getting covers for the softball team benches; she requested additional information to determine if they would be eligible for the grant. She asked if there were any other ideas anyone would be interested in pursuing. Mayor Putrino suggested resurfacing the cracked tennis court at Sutton Street. The Administrator will look into that as well.

The Administrator reported that the Borough will be receiving the Platinum award for safety from the JIF for 2019.

The Administrator reported that an individual DEP permit will be required for the Madison Avenue sidewalk project because the work proposed is in the floodway. She said the engineer is planning to request a pre-application meeting with the DEP, which will take approximately thirty days to schedule. She said they will also review the Knights Field project with the DEP. at that time, to make sure there are no concerns prior to proceeding.

Councilwoman Duffie asked if the governing body will have the opportunity to provide feedback once the engineer comes back with a concept plan for Knights Field. She was assured that they will.

Councilwoman Sandhusen asked for an update on the insurance issues that need to be resolved for the Roots for Rivers application to move forward. Mr. Kelly said that the Risk Manager is in touch with the DEP and they are being addressed.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to reconvene in Council Chambers. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:58 PM.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no members of the public were present.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS

Council President Grotsky made a motion to approve the consent agenda, consisting of resolutions 2020:80 through 2020:90. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said there will be a speaker from Care Plus at 5:30 tomorrow at the Library. She also announced that the Mayor will be reading a proclamation, on the steps of the Borough Hall, for Black Balloon Day on March 6th at 11:00 AM. She said students from both the Middle School and the High School will be attending. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said there will be two grand marshals for the Memorial Day Parade this year.

Councilman Seymour said the Ambulance Corps is planning a CPR/First Aid course for residents.

Councilwoman Duffie said the new fire truck is being assembled, with delivery expected in March and the wet down scheduled for August. She said the Fire Department 5K is scheduled for Saturday, June 20th. She additionally reported that the 100th Anniversary Committee has been meeting and they are working on a number of ideas, including a mailer to residents.

Council President Grotsky said the Parking Committee will attend the March 9th work session to present their recommendation to the governing body.

Councilwoman Grant said she and Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley have formed a Complete Count Committee for the 2020 Census to ensure that New Milford will receive its fair share of federal funding.

Mayor Putrino said the ribbon cutting ceremony for the renovated section of the borough hall will be held on Friday, April 3rd at 11:30 AM. He additionally reported that New Milford has been named the 25th safest city in the United States by alarms.org.

Mayor Putrino reported on a request from New Milford Little League (NMLL), to install a batting cage on borough property adjacent to the field. He asked Mr. Kelly to provide the governing body with additional information pertinent to the request.

Mr. Kelly said they are looking to place the batting cage between the parkland and the police department building. He said this is outside of the funded area but still subject to certain DEP restrictions. He said the batting cage would have to be open to the public. He suggested licensing the property to NMLL to permit them to use it with the understanding that the batting cage would have to be removed, with reasonable notice, if the DEP had an issue with it. He said there is also a concern from the Risk Manager, as it may be necessary to adopt a resolution approving the design in order to establish immunity. He asked for the Council's permission to open a discussion with NMLL in order to work through these issues.

Councilman Seymour made a motion to authorize the Mr. Kelly to discuss the matter with NMLL. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

ADJOURNMENT

Being no further business before the governing body, Councilwoman Grant made a motion to adjourn. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 8:57 PM.

Public Meeting of the Mayor & Council February 24, 2020

BOARD OF EDUCATION (February 4)

The review of the tentative agenda for the Regular Meeting on Feb.19 was tabled. Lauren Odoksta, the Director of Curriculum

Noted that there are no instances of bullying reported in January.

Project Unified is starting its basketball season,

NMHS now has its own student podcast.

Several new courses are being considered;

AP Comparative Government and Politics - 5 credits

Model United Nations - 2.5 credits

Introduction to Social Justice - 2.5 credits

SIgn Language 1 - 2.5 credits

Sports and Statistics - 2.5 credits

Designing and Creating with Mathematics - 2.5 credits

Teacher Lynn LePage objected to the start of the 2020 school currently scheduled for August 31. It will be reviewed. Business Administrator Bruce Watson says he is working on the budget.

Director of Curriculum Lauren Odoksta reported that a number of academy students are going to a girls business summit at Drew University.

The 2020-2021 school calendar was approved.

Eleven students were approved to participate in internships through Bergen County Special Services for Spring 2020. They will get credit for participating.

The Library is providing space for Census employee recruitment. The first session was on February 19 and 6 people signed up.

AARP volunteers are at the Library 3 days a week to assist senior citizens with their taxes. All appointments are fully booked.
