WORK SESSION:

Council President Putrino read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to go into closed session. Councilwoman Langschultz seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:03 PM.

At the conclusion of the closed session, Councilman Grotsky made a motion to return to open session. Councilwoman Langschultz seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:23 PM.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Shade Tree Ordinance

Councilman Grotsky reported that the Shade Tree Commission had recently approved the five-year Community Forestry Plan. He thanked DPW Director Cahill for his assistance in completing the plan and thanked Mr. Cahill and Mr. Campion for their assistance with the revisions to the Shade Tree ordinance.

Shade Tree Commission (STC) Chair Steve Perrone reviewed the proposed changes to the ordinance, which have been approved by the Commission. He said after additional discussion the STC would like to further revise the section on escrow to allow for it to be held for five years. Mr. Kelly said he would need to research whether or not that would be permitted, noting that two years is common practice. STC member Hittel suggested the ordinance should specify what would be a permitted use for the money held in escrow. Councilwoman Grant noted some typographical and grammatical errors.

Mr. Kelly will revise the ordinance accordingly and it will be relisted for further review by the Council on the October 22nd agenda.

2. Bond Ordinance - Fire Truck

The Administrator reported that the Finance Committee and Fire Department liaison met with the CFO to review the proposed financing for the truck. She said as proposed, the borough would be able to take advantage of the discounted pricing for prepayment. The total appropriation of \$1,284,000 will consist of the \$750,000 AFG grant, a \$25,500 down payment, which will come from the Borough's capital improvement fund, and the authorization of \$508,500 in new debt. She said the ordinance will be prepared for introduction on October 22nd with adoption scheduled for November 19th. The effective date of the ordinance will be December 14th, after the mandatory estoppel period. She said the contract for the truck can be awarded in January, with the first prepayment due in either April or May. She said the CFO would be issuing a new note in April that would include the debt authorized for the new truck.

3. Approval of the minutes from the September 24, 2018 Closed, Work and Public Sessions

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from the September 24, 2018 Closed, Work and Public Sessions. Councilwoman Langschultz seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

4. Administrator's Report

The Administrator noted the resolution on the agenda to authorize the Request for Quotations (RFQ) for the 2019 professional appointments. She said the RFQ would be posted on the Borough's website the following day.

The Administrator said she and the Mayor would be meeting with representatives of NJ DEP Blue Acres to discuss a subsequent application for acquisition of flood prone homes. She said this would include homes that did not opt in for the original application and homes that were not included in the first round of funding but have since contacted the DEP.

The Administrator said bids for the CDBG Faller Drive project will be received on October 31st.

Councilwoman Langschultz made a motion to approve the appointment of Patrick Deighan to Fire Company #2. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Grant asked about resolution 2018:258; she said she thought the bid for the Borough Hall roof was going to be combined with the Library and Senior Center. She was advised that the Borough Hall roof project was already put out to bid and was too far along in the process.

COUNCIL:

Councilwoman Grant reported that a concert of the All Season Chamber Players would be taking place on October 21st at the Library. She additionally reported that the first sculpture had been placed at the Library.

Councilman Grotsky reported on the resignation of Lauren Maeherlein from the Shade Tree Commission. He said the Mayor has met with someone who is interested in serving on the STC and the appointment will be on the next agenda.

Councilwoman Langschultz reminded everyone of Fire Awareness Day, scheduled for October 14th, with a rain date of October 21st. She also reported that Congressman Gottheimer is sponsoring a seminar on the AFG grant at Fire Co. #2 on October 12th at 10:30 AM.

Council President Putrino reported on the success of Clean Communities Day, which took place on October 6th. He also reported on the number of users and subscribers to the RecycleCoach app and encouraged everyone to download the app.

Councilwoman Grant reported that the New Milford Volunteer Ambulance Corps just received a \$14,000 grant for CPR equipment.

Councilwoman Langschultz reported that the Recreation Advisory Board has changed its meeting time from 7:30 to 7:00 PM.

Mr. Kelly reported on a matter referred to him by Chief Ramaci whereby Xin Spa was investigated for compliance with New Milford Borough ordinance. He said the investigation came about as a result of a joint investigation between NMPD and the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office. Based upon the results of the investigation by Det. Lt. Van Saders and Health Inspector Joanna Adamiak, Chief Ramaci asked for their spa license to be revoked. Per ordinance, the spa owner was afforded a hearing in which the Borough Administrator ruled there was just cause to revoke the license. The license has been revoked and the owner has 45 days in which to appeal the decision.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Joanne Prisendorf – 317 River Road. Ms. Prisendorf asked about the size, location and liability associated with sculptures being placed at the Library. Councilwoman Grant said they vary in size and it has been completely vetted through the Library Board of Trustees, the Mayor and Council and the Risk Manager. Mr. Kelly said the pieces are being placed far enough from the parking lot and field that they will not be an attractive nuisance.

Rita Conforti – 176 Trotta Drive. Ms. Conforti referenced the music played at Kennedy Field on the previous two Saturdays. She said it was so loud she was unable to hold a conversation in her home with the windows and doors closed. Council President Putrino said he has spoken with the Recreation Director and he is working with New Milford Junior Football to address this issue. George Adelung, President of NMJFL, said they would move the speakers and adjust the volume. He assured Ms. Conforti that the matter would be resolved to her satisfaction.

Councilwoman Langschultz made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.
