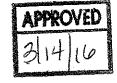
MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM WORK SESSION OPEN SESSION immediately following

WORK SESSION:

Council President Robalino read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to go into closed session. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:00 PM.

At the conclusion of the closed session, Councilman Cabrera made a motion to return to open session. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 8:01 PM.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Capital Budget

Councilwoman Grant asked about the proposed increase to the road improvement line. She also noted the Council's previous suggestion to eliminate one of the electronic signs from the Police Department's request and again asked about the cost for the five training tables requested by the Fire Department.

Councilman Cabrera asked about the premium from the bond. The Administrator explained this premium was given to the Borough as part of the bond financing recently approved. The money is available to use and can therefore reduce the need to bond for some of the items requested through the capital budget.

Councilman Colucci referenced the proposed fencing for Williams Field and said he had spoken to the Recreation Director and the field use has been restricted to youth sports thereby eliminating the need for the fencing.

2. Trensch Drive Drainage

The Administrator referenced an email from the engineer in which she noted that neither of the issues recently discussed is related to the improvements done a few years ago. The engineer said the flooding near 323 Trensch appears to be caused by insufficient pipe capacity. She said there is a drainage system that starts near this address and runs between the properties to Jordan Road and then again between the properties to Lacey. She suggested the DPW should check to see when the pipes were last cleaned as they could be filled with sediment. The Administrator said she spoke with the DPW and the Superintendent confirmed the sewer line was a third full with sediment, it has been cleaned and the pipes will also be cleaned over the next week. She said once this is complete we will be able to determine if this will alleviate the flooding in this area.

The engineer went on to explain the other issue, a depression in the road on Trensch between Hirschfeld and Leonard. She said the problem may be alleviated with the construction of catch basins and pipes but it may not be possible to install them as the area is very flat and may conflict with sewer laterals. She said that if a catch basin is not possible a seepage pit, at the lowest point, may be possible. In a later email she indicated that she spoke with the DPW Superintendent and he believes the problem could be eliminated by repaving a portion of the roadway to eliminate the depression in the street. Councilman Colucci said it may be best to try the seepage pit before paving the road.

Councilman Cabrera said he had asked if there were any grants available such as the one we used for the drainage project on Cherry Street. The Administrator said there is not a drainage project that the engineer has proposed that she believes would be helpful to the situation. She said she did speak with the grants consultant and was advised that the only funding available would be for a discretionary DOT grant for which we would need a cost estimate from the engineer and a solution for the problem. She said the grants consultant went on to say that the application would need to be submitted by mid-March to be considered before the DOT runs out of money.

3. Green Acres Application – Next Steps

The Administrator reviewed the advice from the grants consultant whereby she suggested we revise our resolution to reflect the different funding levels and to provide more specific plans on the building design to reflect the green technology to be used in the buildings. The Administrator said she was asked to check with the engineer to see if this would be something they could provide and the engineer responded that it would need to be done by an architect.

Councilman Alonso said the reason he asked to have this topic listed on the agenda is because the Field Committee had recently been reinstated and they are going to begin discussions

again. He said originally we asked for a grant to cover 75% of the cost and were approved for up to 25%. He said we are also eligible to apply for a grant through Bergen County Open Space but the application will not be available until the spring. He said the committee wants to move forward in designing the field and outlining the uses. Up until now it has just been a conceptual plan. He said they would be discussing all issues including the structural issues which may actually be removed from the plan at this time. Councilman Alonso said, with regard to the High School, the original plan was to allow them to apply for permits like anyone else who would use the field. He said they would use the field for High School football and there is potential for injuries. He asked if it would be necessary to have a memorandum of understanding or some other type of agreement which would indemnify the Borough. Mr. Madaio said we should have whatever agreement that will form the basis of our relationship for use should be underway before we go much further. The Administrator said this would apply to Little League and Jr. Football as well. Councilman Alonso asked the Council to authorize Mr. Madaio to start working on an agreement. He said he would ask the Council not to take any further action other than what has been discussed until we have more information. He said the reason for the request is that there is a lot of speculation; there are people in favor of the field and people who are not in favor of the field.

Councilwoman Grant asked what the design phase will cost. Councilman Alonso said there would be no cost; it is being done by the committee members. Councilwoman Grant asked if they would talk about the buildings as well. Councilman Alonso said the buildings will need to be redone, the question is whether they need to be redone now as a part of this.

Councilman Cabrera asked for the timeframe in which this will be completed. Councilman Alonso said it would depend in part on how long the attorney would need to draft the agreement. Councilman Cabrera asked when Green Acres would need more information. Councilman Alonso said the resolution has already been revised and if the buildings are eliminated from the proposal there is nothing else that would need to be done for Green Acres.

Councilwoman Grant asked if any of the private entities that will be using the field have offered to contribute to the cost. She was advised that they have not. Mr. Madaio said we will need to fix the costs of the permits, for use by outside entities, which would be put in a fund for the future replacement of the turf.

The Council agreed to have Mr. Madaio begin working on the draft agreement.

4. Green Acres

Councilman Cabrera acknowledged the Council's full support of the field improvement but said he is concerned with the people who are not in favor of the proposal. He made a motion to put the turf field on the ballot as a referendum question to let the public decide if they want it or not.

Councilman Alonso said this is very different than what was proposed previously. He said that was on a Board of Education field, there was no grant money available and the estimated cost was 3.6 million. He also questioned what would be on the referendum noting we do not

have all of the information. Councilman Cabrera said we have until August to draft the referendum question and if the field committee has the design finalized it can be presented to the public and the question could be drafted based upon what is presented.

Mr. Madaio asked if we need this motion now because we do not have enough information at this time. He said there are a number of meetings between now and August to consider a motion for a referendum. Councilman Cabrera acknowledged we would need to work on drafting the question but said his motion is just to agree to put the issue on the ballot.

Councilman Alonso said it is premature to agree to put something on the ballot if we do not know the specifics of what is being put on the ballot. He said the Council needs to vote on the specific question.

Councilwoman Grant said she thinks it is worth pursuing but agreed it may be premature to vote on it tonight.

Mr. Madaio asked when we would have information on the grants that will be approved. The Administrator said we do not have a definitive date that we will have the information; she said we would definitely not have a decision from BCOS before August and Green Acres has already stated that if we get money they would fund up to 25%, we do not know if or when this will happen.

Council President Robalino suggested drafting a suggested question for the Council's consideration. Councilman Cabrera said he was not sure if a question could be drafted without all of the details. He said again, he is not motioning on a specific question but just for the Council's agreement to put a question on the ballot.

Councilwoman Grant suggested amending the motion to state that the Council will pursue the idea of putting it out to referendum. Councilman Alonso said there is no need for a motion to agree to pursue something.

Councilman Alonso said the reason the committee wants to work on the design is to see if the costs can be reduced even further.

There was no second to the motion.

5. Borough Signs

Councilman Cabrera referenced the borough owned lot on the corner of River Road and Harrison Street. The Beautification Committee has asked for the Council's approval to clean up the lot and would like to place a town welcome sign in that location. The DPW has indicated that there are grants available through Clean Communities which could pay for the sign. Councilman Cabrera asked Mr. Cahill how many signs we could apply for through the grant and was advised that we could apply for four. Mr. Cahill is in the process of getting estimates for the signs. Councilman Cabrera said he does not like the signs we currently have and passed out what he is suggesting as a replacement. He said he used an image from the

Bergen County Historical Society sign on New Bridge Landing. He added the Borough website to the sign and suggested identifying the three historical districts of New Bridge, Old Bridge, and Peetzburg on the signs in each of those respective areas.

The Administrator said the blue is not traditionally associated with New Milford. She said the brown follows the historic theme and green is representative of New Milford. Council President Robalino and Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley agreed that the blue is not associated with New Milford. Councilwoman Grant said the historic markers are blue and Councilman Cabrera said that is how it ties in with the blue and said we are trying to promote the history in town.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley asked when the application would need to be submitted. Councilman Cabrera said we could have the money by June. He asked for the Council to email him with any suggestions.

6. Administrator's Report

The Administrator referenced the discussion held earlier in closed session and noted the Council agreed to add resolution to approve the memorandum of understanding to add the position of Landscaping Crew Chief to the table of organization in the DPW. She said it was added as resolution 2016:85.

Councilwoman Grant reported that the rabies clinic, held on February 13th, was a success and she thanked Mr. Cahill and Tree Forman, Norman Krause, for reconfiguring the setup of the clinic in the DPW garage so that no one had to wait outside in the freezing temperatures.

Councilman Alonso made a motion to reconvene in the Council Chambers. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 8:43 PM.

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2016:06

AN ORDINANCE TO RESCIND ORDINANCE 2015:23 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER VII OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "TRAFFIC," THEREBY AMENDING SECTION 7-9 ENTITLED "BUS STOPS""

Councilman Colucci made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilman Alonso made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Dan Ferretti – 163 River Road. Mr. Ferretti expressed interest in purchasing a piece of property, adjacent to his own, that is owned by the Borough. He asked how he should go about pursuing this purchase. Mr. Madaio asked if the property is undersized. He said if it is undersized it must be offered to all the contiguous owners. He said if it is buildable it would be sold to the highest bidder in the event that the Borough wished to entertain the sale. He suggested Mr. Ferretti formalize his desire to purchase in a letter to the Borough. He said the engineer will then determine if the lot is buildable.

Josephine McEwan – 184 Trotta Drive. Ms. McEwan referenced the 25% anticipated from Green Acres for the Kennedy Field Improvements and asked how much that would be in dollars. Councilman Alonso said 25% is approximately \$700,000. Ms. McEwan asked if the Borough would still pursue the improvements if no other grant money is received. Councilman Alonso said ultimately it is the Council's vote as to whether or not it will be funded. He said he does not think the subject was ever fully investigated and his plan is to work with the committee to investigate all of the impacts and bring a full report back to the Council for a decision. Ms. McEwan said the Center for Disease Control is doing an investigation on crumb rubber. Councilman Alonso said the Borough would be doing their own due diligence on this as well. Ms. McEwan said she is in favor of bringing the question of whether or not to proceed with the proposed improvements to a referendum.

Being no further comment, Councilwoman Grant made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES - Feb. 18

The submitted design for the proposed mural in the Children's Room was discussed. The Board would like it to be more imaginative and colorful.

The new doors will be installed when the weather gets warmer. Heavier-duty glass will be used to counteract the sun's rays.

The new circulation desk will be installed over a period of 2 days in March. Library patrons will still be able to take out books either in the children's room or in the main reading room.

The 4th HVAC unit will not need to be replaced and the other 3 HVAC units will be replaced with money set aside in the borough's 2015 budget. This project is currently out for bid. It was reported that DPW head Vince Cahill does not think the roof needs to be replaced at this time.

Makers' Day will be on Saturday, March 19 from 2 - 4 pm. Activities will include origami, crocheting and beading.

The Historic Preservation Commission added a plaque to the historic map noting the map was donated by Marlene Casey and her late husband, Tim. The Commission also provided the library with a picture of the area in New Milford where Woodcrest Nursing Home now stands. The picture is a gift from Marlene Casey and her late husband, Tim.

The Friends of the Library donated funds to make it possible to project images from a laptop or other device onto a screen for easier viewing by a group of people. The Friends also donated some funds towards the Children's Room project.

AARP is providing free tax return assistance to seniors.

The Brunetti Foundation donated \$500.

Reviewed a section of the Personnel Policy Manual.

Liaison Reports

Board of Education:

On Tuesday, 02/16 the Director of Special Services, Whitney Perro gave a detailed overview of the plans for the 18 – 21 Years Old Program starting next September for 2016- 2017 school year.

In order to better serve the students with special needs in our District, she presented the Board the idea of purchasing a house in town to be used for these young adults since by State Law, we are responsible for them until age 21.

The project is to prepare them for a future of independence in everyday chores such as maintaining the house clean, light cooking, laundry and other (soft skills) everyday activities that we take for granted. These will be taught along with helping them learn how to use their time alone in a productive way.

The house will be open during school months and school schedule only, where possible, they will also try to place them at different local companies so that they can have a 16 hour / work week. Teach them how to take the bus back and forth from work and/or home as well.

There will also be plans in place to bring in up to two students from other Districts to help absorb any added costs in personnel, etc.

The house they are looking into is walking distance from the high school and will need to be modified to meet ADA requirements on the first floor only since the second floor will be dedicated for offices.

A traditional mortgage is not being sought, but rather a 5 year capital lease purchase instead. Sending the kids out of District would have cost the town \$35,000 per student per year IF there was room in Creskill, which is at capacity. We have 7 children that would have needed then to go to the County, at \$70,000 per student for each of the 3 years, so this is more cost effective.

There will be no sleeping quarters at the house and it will be able to handle up to 9 students at any one time.

Recreation: I was unable to attend because of a conflict in scheduling where I was at the Academies Induction Ceremony at the H.S. for my son.

Municipal Drug Alliance: The February meeting is scheduled for this coming Wednesday 24th.
