Councilman Cabrera made a motion to go into closed session. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:00 PM.

Council President Robalino made a motion to return to open session. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:37 PM.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Street Dedication – Robert Chester

The Administrator said she spoke with the family members and they are available to attend the dedication on Friday, May 13th at 3:30 PM. She said the DPW members will be in attendance and some of the members who worked with Bob will speak in addition to the Mayor. She said there are three signs; one for either end of the street and one for the building. She said she will arrange for coffee and cake to be served at the conclusion.

2. Street Dedication

Councilman Cabrera referenced a suggestion made by a member of the public at a recent meeting regarding, New Milford resident and distinguished veteran, Joseph Cervino.

Vertex present Annual Property		

Councilman Cabrera acknowledged Mr. Cervino was honored as the Grand Marshall in the 2014 Memorial Parade and as such, a sign with his name was placed at the entrance to Borough Hall for that year.

Councilman Cabrera made a motion to permanently place an additional sign, Sgt. Joseph Cervino Way, at the intersection of Duke Road and the Boulevard. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion failed on a roll call vote as follows:

In casting his vote, Councilman Colucci noted there have been similar requests for other notable residents in town. He said he feels, that although Mr. Cervino is a very nice man, it would be too open ended in determining who should or should not have a street dedicated to them.

In casting her vote, Councilwoman Grant said she had mixed feelings but felt that it would open it up to any number of other people that may be deserving.

In casting his vote, Council President Robalino said it would undermine other deserving individuals.

In casting his vote, Councilman Alonso said it is open ended and arbitrary. He said if the Council were to consider it they should establish criteria for those that are to be nominated.

3. Recycling Mailer

The Administrator said she sent the mailer to the Council so they would be aware of what was being mailed out in the event that they were to receive questions from residents; she said the content is being decided by the Recycling Coordinator and the committee. She said the mailer is going out in advance of the Borough taking over the recycling pick-up because we will then have more control and will begin rejecting loads with plastic bags.

4. Centennial Funding

Council President Robalino said in six years we will be celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Borough's founding. He said he would like to see the Council to start preparing now financially. He said he knows that there are restrictions on earmarking funds for future use but he would like to look at the possibility of putting money aside annually for the next six years.

Mayor Subrizi said there was fundraising done for the 75th anniversary. Council President Robalino asked if it was done by committees or by the Borough. Mayor Subrizi said it was done by an employee of the Borough. She asked the liaisons for the Historic Commission

and the Public Events Committee to discuss this with each of their committees. The Administrator said she would speak with the CFO about budgeting for it annually.

Mr. Madaio then recognized a member of the public, Ms. Sheryl Elias, to let her know that he would be contacting her the following day to discuss how the Borough would move forward with taking responsibility for the sewer line running through her and her neighbor's properties.

5. Solar Panels

Councilwoman Grant said she reviewed the ordinance as it was adopted in 2012. She said she does not understand why the amendment was necessary. She said the original ordinance provided for a permit to be issued by the Building Department for valid reason, which would not include vegetation, but would include if installation on the rear roof was proven to be ineffective or impossible. She said she did not understand why the applications for front facing panels were denied since the ordinance permits it for valid reasons.

The Administrator said they were not denied, there was no mechanism in place for the engineer to review the applications. Councilwoman Grant asked why they could not be reviewed in the same manner as the applications for the rear facing panels. The Administrator said because the original ordinance called for applications for front facing panels to be reviewed by the engineer. As there was no provision to pay for the Borough's engineer to review the application the discussion on revising the ordinance started with the suggestion to add a fee for the engineer's review. After further discussion it was decided that the engineer is not the proper authority and the ordinance was revised to prohibit front facing installations outright thereby sending those applications to the Zoning Board for review.

Councilwoman Grant suggested a revision to the original ordinance as an alternative to the revision that has been adopted. The Council asked to see the proposed revision prior to further discussion. Councilwoman Grant agreed to work with Mr. Madaio to draft language for the Council's consideration. The matter will be relisted on the next agenda.

6. Administrator's Report

The Administrator reminded the Council that they need to complete the Elected Official Training by April 30th. She said the Financial Disclosure must also be completed by April 30th.

Council President Robalino made a motion to reconvene in Council Chambers. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

ADOPT ORDINANCE #2016:09

CALENDAR YEAR 2016 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

Councilman Colucci made a motion to open to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on this ordinance.

Councilman Colucci made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Robalino made a motion to approve this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

2016:126 Waive the Reading in Full of 2015 Municipal Budget

Councilman Alonso made a motion to approve resolution 2016:126. Council President Robalino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Borough Auditor Gary Higgins reviewed the proposed budget noting a very positive end to 2015 and concluded by stating that there would be no increase in the municipal tax rate over last year; it will remain .996 for every \$100 in assessed value. For the average home assessed at \$324,500 the municipal tax will remain \$3,232.

Mr. Higgins went on to review the recent bond sale, in which debt from ordinances from 2009 to present were consolidated into a long term bond, thereby decreasing the amount of debt service to be paid in 2016. He said the debt service is just 5% of the \$20,000,000 budget, well under the 25% at which it would be questioned. He said the bond is locked in with very low long term rates of between 1% and 3 1/8%. He said there is statute in local bond law that allows the borough to borrow up to 3 ½% of average equalized valuations over the past three years. He said for New Milford that would be \$62,216,000. He said as of December 31, 2015 the Borough had

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\$18,175,000 in outstanding debt. He said the Borough's percentage of the 3 ½% is 1.02% or just 29% of the maximum borrowing capacity. He said debt is not an issue in New Milford.

Mayor Subrizi said the debt includes the two new firehouses, the Hirschfeld Brook flood mitigation, sewer infrastructure and the funding for the police station. She said while the debt is higher than what it has been it includes a number of things that are only done every fifty years.

PUBLIC HEARING:

2016 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

Councilman Cabrera made a motion to open to the public for questions on the 2016 Municipal Budget. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on the budget.

Councilman Colucci made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Colucci asked if this will reflect favorably on the Borough's credit rating. Mr. Higgins confirmed that it would.

At this point a member of the public asked to be heard.

Councilman Cabrera made a motion to reopen to the public for questions on the budget. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Patrick Crane – 255 Prospect Avenue. Mr. Crane asked how long the rate on the bond is locked in for. Mr. Higgins said the interest on the bond is locked in through 2033 and that it will be between 1% and 2.5 % for the next 10 years; the highest rate is 3.125% in 2033.

Mr. Crane said it was mentioned that there would be no tax increase for the median house valued at \$324,500; he asked if that was true for all homes. He was advised that there will be no increase in municipal taxes for any home this year.

Council President Robalino made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Robalino made a motion the approve resolution 2016:127. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY TO APPROPRIATE AN ADDITIONAL SUM OF \$20,810 FOR THE REHABILITATION OF THE SENIOR CENTER (PHASE III) IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH AND TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH ADDITIONAL SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM CAPITAL SURPLUS OF THE BOROUGH

Councilman Colucci made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

A public hearing will be held on this ordinance on May 9, 2016.

Councilman Colucci reported that there will be a dedication ceremony for both Fire Co. #1 and Fire Co. #2 on June 4th beginning at Fire Co. #2 at 1:00 PM.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Patrick Crane - 255 Prospect Avenue. Mr. Crane said he applauded the Council's decision to deny Pancho's request for an extension of premise on Cinco de Mayo. Mr. Crane went on to say that there has been some benefit from the ordinance to restrict parking on Prospect Street. He said there have been issues on the night's when parking is restricted; residents have had to continually call the Police Department to have the ordinance enforced. He said his neighbor was told that it is the discretion of the officer of how to handle it and that they could go to the restaurant and ask patrons to move their vehicles instead of issuing a ticket. He asked for the Police Department to be instructed to strictly enforce the ordinance. Mr. Crane also referenced

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the American Legion parking lot and noted since it was striped by the town there has been construction equipment and porta johns parked in the lot ever since.

Gwen Dalton – 459 James Street. Ms. Dalton complimented the work of the Beautification Committee on Main Street and asked why there is such a mess behind the hair salon that has been allowed to persist. Mayor Subrizi said it is a commercial property and they have recently gotten approval for development of the property. She said it will likely resolve the problem but in the meantime the Property Maintenance Officer will be sent to inspect.

Council President Robalino made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Mr. Madaio said the Mayor and Council have discussed this and decided not to match the \$550,000 purchase price being offered. He asked if any member of the Council wished to add a resolution to confirm the decision.

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Councilman Colucci made a motion to not exercise the Borough's right to first refusal for the Perrone Farms property. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion was memorialized as resolution 2016:141. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.



WHEREAS, any employee who chooses to participate in the program must also provide proof of duplicate health insurance before approval is given; and

WHEREAS, New Milford's opt out program will conform to Local Finance Notice 2011-20; and

WHEREAS, the payment to be provided to any employee who chooses to participate in the opt out program shall not annually exceed the lesser of twenty-five percent (25%)of the amount saved by New Milford because of the employee's election to opt out of healthcare coverage, or \$5,000, whichever is less; and

WHEREAS, employees who participate in the opt out program will be eligible for payment on a quarterly basis.


