COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to open to the public. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Randi Duffie -120 California Avenue. Ms. Duffie asked the Council to recognize Scouts who worked with the Beautification Committee on a project on the corner of River Road and Harrison Street. She also thanked the DPW for their help and guidance. The Council agreed to acknowledge them at the September meeting.

Ms. Duffie referenced the proposed Eagle Scout project for the area near the gazebo and suggested that detailed drawings are submitted. Mayor Subrizi said we should ask, as part of his presentation to the Council, that he provide a picture of the benches and the Council should withhold the approval until it is submitted. She said the plans should also be submitted to the building department for their approval.

Darlene Minko -477 Marion. Ms. Minko said Mr. Di Marchi has been asked to be an honorary tree lighter in December and he has accepted.

Ms. Minko said the town's 100th anniversary is just 5 ½ years away. She suggested a "buy a brick" program to help fund the celebration. She said a brick that would cost \$100, which is 4" x 8" with three lines, the town would receive \$46 out of the \$100. Council President Robalino said he has already discussed the need to include funding in future budgets for the 100th anniversary. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley suggested setting up a table at National Night Out to sell the bricks.

Public Meeting of the Mayor & Council June 27, 2016

LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES - June 16

- *There will be a full-day trustee workshop on September 10 in East Windsor.
- *The children's mural will be installed in late June. There will be a dedication ceremony in September.
- *The Friends' Tea was a tremendous success and raised about \$400, which will go towards to the mural in the children's room. The NMHS choir sang and danced.
- *Registration for summer programs has started.
- *Miss Mary is out for a month or so for medical reasons.
- *Brianna a former assistant in the children's room is now a member of the Peace Corps.
- *\$980 was given in the memory of the late Mrs. Vassilakis for the children's room.
- *The library director will meet with a sculptor in late June to discuss placing sculptures outside. Sculptor Natalie Frier has offered a piece.
- *The library director noted that bill A1427, which passed in the Assembly on June 7, wold allow towns to give libraries more than the amount mandated by the state. It must be done by refrendum.

AMBULANCE CORPS (NMVAC)- Feb. 15

- *There were no new applications.
- *The next drill will be on July 6.
- *A fundraising letter will go out in July.
- *Kelly Dunbar is no longer a member. The borough will be notified so an adjustment to LOSAP can be made.

JIF (JOINT INSURANCE FUND) - June 16

An interesting item: New Milford had 16 claims from 1.1.16 to 4.16 This compares to 2 in River Edge, 6 in Oradell, 17 in Dumont and 5 in Emerson.

AUDIT AND ACTUARY VALUATION REPORT AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2015: The financial audit for the period ending December 31, 2015 was ready for review and approval and will be filed with the Departments of Insurance and

Community Affairs by the June 30th deadline. Enclosed separately was a copy of the audit and the actuary's valuation as of 12/31/15.

Fund Auditor reviewed the Comparative Statements of Net Position (Exhibit A-1) and said as of 12/31/15 the fund had a total net position of \$3.5. Fund Auditor reviewed the Historical Operating Results (Exhibit C) and said both Fund Year 2014 and 2015 have deficits, but all other noted years are operating in a positive position.

Commissioner Hoffmann said the change in net position from Fund Year 2014 to Fund Year 2015 resulted in a difference of \$832,850 or a 19% decrease and asked if the fund is trending downward or is the difference resulted from a position taken by the board/management. In response, Fund Auditor said a portion of the difference is comprised of the approximately \$500,000 dividend released back to members, which was a fund decision. Additionally, Fund Auditor said the deficits to Fund Year 2014 and Fund Year 2015 both have Case Reserves and Incurred But Not Reserved (IBNR) noting that as claims are paid out the case reserves and IBNR will decrease.

Executive Director said Commissioner Hoffmann's question is on target as the fund office is currently reviewing the accident rate over the last 4 years to identify any trends that ultimately affect the financial position of this fund, the South Bergen JIF and the other local JIFs. Executive Director said when there is a winter with relatively low snow or ice than there is a large surplus and the converse is true. Executive Director said in the last two years the accident frequency rate increased by approximately 10% and can be casually related to the harsh winter conditions. Executive Director said the accident rate of the first three month of this year dropped significantly in comparison due to the mild winter.

Commissioner Hoffmann noted the fund's cash deposits increased from 2014 to 2015 and said a deficit position typically means decreased cash-on-hand. Executive Director said the deficits of Fund Year 2014 and Fund Year 2015 – both approximately in the range of \$300,000 - are not as significant when compared to the fund's total budget and total assets.

Executive Director said studying the long-term cash flow projections indicate that cash balances will remain positive as long as membership remains stable; additionally claim reserving patterns must also remain stable. Fund Auditor said although individual fund years are in a deficit, overall the fund is healthy financial position and referred to Exhibits B-1 and B-2 to highlight the total assets. Fund Auditor said the cash position for 2015 will increase when the 4 quarter 2015 assessments, noted as receivables, are paid in the first quarter of 2016.

Fund Treasurer referred to the distributed Financial Fast Track as of March 31, 2016 and noted the monthly and year-to-date changes in the surplus/deficits by fund year. Executive Director said this Financial Fast Track includes the changes in actuarial figures as a result of the study of weather and the effect on the LTAF. Executive Director reiterated that this pattern was noted not just in this fund, but statewide and was reviewed by two separate actuarial firms. Executive Director said one trend that was noted during the study is that claim reserves practices have changed, which is not a cause for concern, but only an indicator that BRM places higher reserves on a claim much earlier than other local TPAs. Commissioner Hoffmann thanked the Auditor and the Executive Director for their explanation.

Fund Auditor said the only comment was that Fund Year 2014 and Fund Year 2015 ended the year with deficits in the net position of \$342,026 and \$377,258 respectively; the recommendation is that these years be monitored to ensure sufficient funds are available to eliminate the operating deficits.

APPROVED YEAR-END FINANCIALS, ADOPT RESOLUTION NO. 14- 16 AND EXECUTE GROUP AFFIDAVIT INDICATING THAT THE FUND COMMISSIONERS HAVE READ THE GENERAL COMMENTS SECTION OF THE AUDIT REPORT.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

SAFETY & AWARD COMMITTEE: CAROL BYRNE, CHAIR: Enclosed in the agenda were the minutes from the May 10, 2016 meeting for information. Chairwoman Byrne said the committee discussed safety related events and/or community programs that municipalities hold which could be submitted for potential credit as part of the Safety Incentive Program. Chairwoman Byrne said members could submit events they have held for consideration by the committee for recognition at the annual safety breakfast.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

DUE DILIGENCE REPORTS: Monthly reports submitted to the Executive Committee including monthly Financial Fast Track, Loss Ratio, Lost Time Accident Frequency, Investment Summary and Rate Comparison, Expected Loss Ratio by Town Report and the Claim Activity Report.

Executive Director referred to the distributed the Financial Fast Track as of March 31, 2016 and said the statutory surplus is \$3.6 million. Executive Director reviewed the Lost Time Accident Frequency (LTAF) as of March 31, 2016 and said the fund's LTAF is 1.20 and the overall LTAF for local JIFs is 1.41, which is a direct result of the mild winter.

MEL MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL: Executive Director said the Fund is scheduled to renew their MEL membership effective July 1, 2016. Enclosed in the agenda was Resolution 14-16 renewing the Fund's membership in the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2019.

ADOPTED RESOLUTION 15-16 RENEWING THE FUND'S MEMBERSHIP IN THE MUNICIPAL EXCESS LIABILITY JOINT INSURANCE FUND FOR THE PERIOD OF JULY 1, 2016 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2017

ELECTED OFFICIALS TRAINING SEMINARS: As a reminder, to supplement live presentations of this year's Elected Officials seminar, the MEL posted an online version on www.njmel.org. Enclosed in the agenda was another copy of instructions to access the program.

EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES PROGRAM: As a reminder, changes to the 2017 POL/EPL Program are posted on the MEL's webpage - www.nimel.org - which details changes to the MEL's Model Personnel Manual and information on

training program requirements. Executive Director said members have until October 1 st to submit checklist to qualify and/ or maintain deductible and co-pay incentives. Compliance includes updating Personnel Manuals, Training Managers & Supervisors, Police Command Staff and offering training to non-supervisory personnel.

Police Command Staff – Four sessions were conducted in the Bergen County area and to date 33 out of 38 member Police Chiefs/Officer in Charge have attended a session. The fund office is reviewing attendance and will schedule a final session if necessary for this fund and the South Bergen fund.

Manager & Supervisor – The Manager & Supervisor Trainings are being scheduled by the Fund Attorney's office; enclosed in the agenda was a listing of scheduled seminars as of 5/12/16.

2017 RENEWAL ONLINE UNDERWRITING DATABASE: Members and Risk Managers will receive an email when the database is set up to begin the 2017 underwriting renewal – which is expected to begin on or near June 1, 2016.

2016 FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE FORMS: The fund office has provided all Fund Commissioners and Professionals with the login information they need to complete their Financial Disclosure filing for the Bergen County Municipal JIF.

The filing deadline was April 30 th; all but 3 fund commissioners have filed and all fund professionals have filed.

CYBER SECURITY TRAINING: Executive Director said an email was distributed on a regional training for Cybersecurity and Technology Risk Management Considerations for Municipalities with speaker Marc Pfeiffer; a session will be held on May 24 th and May 25 th in Fair Lawn from 9am-10am.

APPROVED RESOLUTION 16-16 VOUCHER LIST FOR MAY 2016, APPROVEE RESOLUION 17-16 DISPOSING OF PERSONAL PROPERTY AND APPROVEE CERTIFICATION OF CLAIMS/CONFIRMATION OF CLAIM PAYMENTS FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL 2016.

JIF CASUALTY & CRIME ENDORSEMENT: Underwriting Manager said included in this month's agenda are two JIF endorsements to the policy: 1) Cyber Social Engineering endorsement and 2) Failure to obtain insurance; these were previously reviewed and approved by the MEL Coverage Committee and will require approval by this fund to include in the 2016 coverage documents.

Underwriting Manager said coverage under the Cyber Social Engineering endorsement will provide coverage when an employee intentionally transfers money, but does so because he or she has been duped into doing so by a fraudulent email; Underwriting Manager used an "email scam" as an example. Underwriting Manager said this endorsement is to the JIF crime policy, which has a limit of \$50,000, and said the MEL expects to adopt their endorsement at their June meeting. Executive Director said these local JIF endorsements are being presented in advance of the MEL June meeting so the 2016 coverage manuals can be generated soon after.

Underwriting Manager said the failure to obtain insurance endorsement is an enhancement to the policy that will provide coverage to member towns using vendors to provide online services, such as registration for recreation events, at a \$25,000 sub-limit.

Executive Director said the protocol for changes to the JIF policies would first be reviewed by the risk managers and the Coverage Committee to make a recommendation for the Executive Committee to take action. Risk Managers present at the meeting did not have an issue with the endorsements.

APPROVED THE ENDORSEMENTS TO THE JIF POLICY.

SAFETY DIRECTOR:

REPORT: Safety Director's report was included in the agenda for review, which included the April activities, the MSI classes, Safety Director bulletin on Comprehensive Playground Inspections and the announcement on the Cyber Liability Training sessions discussed earlier. Safety Director said the new online program for Safe Patient Lifting for Emergency Responders has been released and access instructions are included in the report.
