WORK SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

CLOSED SESSION:

The record reflects that no closed session was held.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Eagle Scout Project - Benches/Gazebo

The Administrator referenced the revised proposal sent previously to the Council. She noted the tables and benches originally proposed by the playground have been relocated to the Senior Center. She asked if the project could now be approved. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said she spoke with some seniors who suggested that the second table be moved closer to the first table. The Administrator said she will ask the scout to reconfirm with the Senior Center Director on the placement of the tables. The Council authorized approval of the project.

2. Social Services Director Search – Progress

The Administrator briefed the Council on the steps taken to fill the position. She said that it is a difficult position to fill given the hours and responsibilities. She said there was very little response to the advertising and those that were interviewed were either not qualified or were not interested in the position. She said she then resorted to outreach by contacting all of the Social Services departments in the other Bergen municipalities. Only one person expressed interest and came in and interviewed. She said this person is very well qualified and interested in the position however she works full-time in another municipality. The candidate has indicated that there is a possibility that her hours will be changing leaving her available to fulfill the daytime hours of this position. She has also indicated that if she could provide the

seven hours office time in the evening she would accept the position immediately. The Council discussed the needs of the position. Councilwoman Grant expressed concern for older residents who may find it difficult to come in during the evening. The Administrator explained that the Director does outreach and much of what is done can be accomplished by telephone. She also explained that if we are unable to fill the position we would then be referring residents to the Bergen County Social Services Department which would be far less convenient. It was noted that the current director would be leaving as of August 31st. The Council agreed to offer the position on an interim basis through the end of the year at which time the hours would be evaluated. Resolution 2016:222 was added to the consent agenda to appoint Irene Maury to position of Social Services Director on an interim basis.

3. Public Art Proposal

The Administrator referenced the proposal which had been forwarded to the Council previously. The Council discussed the idea of placing art on public property. It was noted that approval of this proposal could lead to other requests and concern was expressed regarding the type and permanency of the artwork. Councilwoman Grant noted the Art Center of New Jersey is currently working with the New Milford Public Library on the placement of artwork at the Library. She offered to speak with Mr. Griffiths to discuss his proposal and said she will report back to the Council.

4. Building Department - Salary Increase Request

The Council discussed the request. It was noted that the plumbing and electrical inspectors are currently making \$9,477 annually and the increase would bring them to \$10,777. Councilman Colucci said it is becoming more and more difficult to find qualified people to take the positions and he made a motion to approve the request. Council President Robalino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Resolution 2016:223 was added to the consent agenda to approve the salary increase.

5. Recreation - Assistant Director

The Administrator reviewed the attorney's email in which he explained that the governing body's only role is in funding the position. He said to do so the Council would need to amend the salary ordinance.

Councilman Alonso said there are ongoing issues within the Recreation Commission that need to be addressed before funding an additional position which may only to perpetuate the problems. He said he thinks the Council should review what is going on and make recommendations to the Recreation Commission.

Councilman Colucci said he did not believe there was adequate discussion on how the duties of the new position differ from the duties of the Recreation Director.

Councilman Cabrera said that other towns hire full-time directors and pay more for that one position than we would be paying for both.

Councilwoman Grant said she would like some accountability in the form of a progress report on the person filling the position.

The Council discussed the proposed salary for the position and agreed on a salary of \$11,700 which equates to \$15 per hour for fifteen hours per week. It was agreed that the position will be advertised. Councilman Cabrera made a motion to advertise for the position under those terms. It was agreed the range for the salary ordinance introduction could be kept at \$10,000 to \$15,000. Council President Robalino seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote as follows:

In casting his vote, Councilman Cabrera commented that towns 1/3 the size of New Milford employ full-time Recreation Directors.

In casting his vote, Councilman Alonso said he would like the governing body to have the opportunity to review the Commission's Policies and Procedures prior to making a decision to fund the position.

6. Grants - Community Development/Open Space/DOT-TAP

The Administrator referenced the Council's previous discussion regarding the Community Development application and noted that accessible bathrooms would only be considered if they were new; updating the existing accessible bathrooms at the recreation building will not qualify. She said the other option discussed by the Council was the resurfacing of Faller Drive from River Road to the circle. She said this application would qualify. The Council agreed to move forward with the Faller Drive application.

The Administrator reviewed the status of the BCOS letter of intent. The letter was submitted but the proposed project of scoreboards is ineligible. She said the Director of BCOS has agreed to accept a late admission if the Borough would like to submit for another project. The Council discussed possible projects and agreed to pursue an application for dugouts at the softball fields. If it is determined that dugouts are ineligible we will submit a letter of intent for the replacement of the infield at Warren Street Park.

The Administrator reported a new round of funding has been announced for the 2016 Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) through the DOT. She said the last application, submitted in July 2014 for the Gateway to Historic New Bridge Landing River Road Streetscape, was denied in March 2015. She said Ms. Casey has suggested we resubmit this application and resolutions are on tonight's agenda to authorize the application.

7. BOE Zoning Board Application Fees

The Council discussed the request from the Board of Education to waive the application and/or escrow fees associated with their application before the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

Councilman Cabrera made a motion to waive the application fee. Council President Robalino seconded the motion. The motion failed on a roll call vote as follows:

Councilman Alonso made a motion not to waive the escrow fees for the BOE application. Councilman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

8. Police Department Bids

Councilwoman Grant expressed concern about the low bidder noting their bid was more than \$500,000 less than the next lowest bidder. She said they are licensed to do three things and none of them have anything to do with general construction. She said they have only recently hired people with a background in construction. She said this contractor has never done work on this scale. She also noted that the electrical contractor specializes in residential work. Councilwoman Grant said she understands we are required to give the job to the lowest bidder but they must be responsible and some of these points may indicate that they are not responsible enough to take on this project. She said the contract indicates liquidated damages of \$350 per day, which she said she believes is insufficient. She said it is unclear as to whether or not the site plan work is included in the bid. Councilwoman Grant suggested we put off awarding the bid until we can get more information to confirm that this is a responsible bid.

Mr. Placek said the bid has been fully vetted by the architect retained by the Borough. He said to find a company is not responsible there must be a finding under Local Public Contracts Law that there is a prior negative work history. He said the finding must be specific and then the contractor can request a hearing to challenge the finding.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley asked if anyone can submit a bid whether they have relevant experience or not. Mr. Placek said the purpose of Local Public Contract Law is to maintain the greatest level of competition while getting the best price possible.

Mayor Subrizi suggested that the discussion should be continued in Council Chambers.

9. Administrator's Report

The Administrator said the Public Events Chairperson has suggested putting out the flags and buntings at the Borough Hall in observance of September 11th. She said the DPW Superintendent said they could be put out the Friday before and kept up for a week. The Council unanimously agreed.

Councilman Alonso made a motion to reconvene in council chambers. Council President Robalino seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 8:07 PM.

Mayor Subrizi called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection, and led the flag salute. Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statements and pointed out the fire exits in the Council Chambers.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Colucci made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Councilman Colucci made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 25, 2016 Closed, Work/Public Sessions. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, except Council President Robalino who abstained.

Councilwoman Grant reiterated the concerns she outlined earlier at the work session with regard to the low bid for the Police Station. She said this would be the first major building the contractor would be building. She said they have no experience and have only just recently hired individuals with experience. She said the electrical subcontractor has not yet supplied their certificate of employee information and they specialize in residential electrical work. She said the bid does not indicate if the site work and parking lot are included and it does not indicate that union labor will be used. She said the contract indicates \$350 per day in liquidated damages, which she believes is inadequate. She said the results from the soil sample were reported to be "okay" but she does not know what that means. She said the bid is irresponsible and non-responsive.

Councilman Colucci said we obligated by law to hire the low bidder but he asked if we could hire an independent project manager to oversee the project. Mr. Placek said the Borough would be within its rights to hire a project manager but that there may be a duplication of efforts with the architect.

Mr. Placek then explained the process of awarding a bid and said that it must be awarded to the lowest, complying, responsible bidder. He said in order to find someone irresponsible there must be a specific finding of prior negative work history which requires a resolution that references specific incidents and the rejected bidder would be given the opportunity to request a hearing on those findings. He said through the resolution process the Borough has hired the architect who has been in charge of this process and the architect has done the vetting and due diligence. They were authorized to do the soil investigation and to work with the borough engineer to develop the site plan. He said this is not a situation where the architect has presented the Council with any concerns of any findings. He said Councilwoman Grant is asking to go back and repeat what has been done but the outcome will be the same. He said there has been nothing presented that would be a sufficient basis legally for rejection of the bid.

Mayor Subrizi asked if we were to exclude the low bidder without some significant demonstration of their irresponsibility would the Borough be sued. Mr. Placek said he believes the Borough would unquestionably be met with litigation.

Mr. Placek went on further to explain that regardless of whether or not union labor would be employed the application of the New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act would apply; he said even though it may be non-union labor a livable wage must be provided, they must meet the salaries set by the State at the prevailing wage level for this area.

Mr. Placek said the Council has everything before them and he would recommend going to a vote.

Councilwoman Grant said the issues she raised are not her feelings they are specific issues. Mr. Placek said the points raised are not point specific enough to find a prior negative experience. He said Local Public Contracts Law has a purpose to find the balance between the interests of the taxpayers while being open and fair. Councilwoman Grant asked what the Borough would do if the contractor were to go bankrupt or do a poor quality job. She was advised that they would be contractually obligated to post a performance bond among other obligations to ensure the completion of the job. Councilwoman Grant said she is not aware of what Mr. Conley did in terms of due diligence to vet the bid. Mr. Placek said the Council tasked Mr. Conley with doing the work necessary to come to a conclusion. He being a professional and this being his area of expertise he did what he would do in the normal course, which is what was presumed he would do by awarding the contract to him to get the Borough to where it is today. He said if the Council wishes to revisit what Mr. Conley has done they can do so but there is a window of time within which the contract must be awarded. Mr. Placek said the laws of the State of New Jersey give the contractor the opportunity to do their first project in the public arena.

Councilman Colucci asked how the Council would go about hiring a project manager. Mr. Placek said it would be done separately with the issuance of a RFQ (Request for Qualification). Councilman Colucci asked to have the topic of hiring a project manager added to the September Work Session agenda.

Councilman Cabrera said he believes the concerns raised by Councilwoman Grant were backed up with facts. He said the approach to the design of the building and the choice of architect were mistakes. He said that he thinks the Council should vet this contractor independently.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to table resolution 2016:219 until such time as the Borough could do further investigation. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion failed on a roll call vote as follows:

Councilman Colucci made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Robalino made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised and a public hearing will be held on September 26, 2016.

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2016:23

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO CANCEL VARIOUS ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS AND TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$50,636.02 FOR SUCH PROJECTS IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND AND THE OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

Council President Robalino made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised and a public hearing will be held on September 26, 2016.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Joe Zampackorta – 329 Salem Street and Raymond Wetzel – 333 Salem Street. Mr. Wetzel said there were signs posted on Milford Avenue and Madison Avenue prohibiting thru traffic on Salem Street. He said Salem Street is often used as a way to avoid the traffic lights on Madison and Milford and when he spoke with the traffic officer he was advised that the signs prohibiting through traffic are unenforceable. He said he would like for "no left turn" signs to be placed West on Milford and East on Madison and suggested they should be in effect from 6:00 AM to 9:00 AM and from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM. He was advised that the matter will be referred to the Police Department for review.

Michael Gadaleta – 270 Demarest Avenue. Mr. Gadaleta said he has been a licensed architect since 1982. He said he is not a fan of the architect on the Police Station project and has seen his missteps over the past year. He said Mr. Conley developed plans that Mr. Gadaleta believes are greatly flawed. He said he disagrees with the attorney that the job must be awarded to the low bidder; they have no track record and therefore are not responsible. He said the Borough could easily save a half million dollars if the plans were redesigned. He said there is no sprinkler system on the plans, there are areas that are uninsulated and all of the mechanical systems are located in the attic which is only accessible through a small hatch. He said the Council should not fear litigation because the contractor is not responsible. He said he is not suggesting the project be abandoned, just postponed until the plans can be reviewed, suggesting they could be reviewed by local contractors. He also questioned that the costs are not broken down by item. Mr. Placek said Local Public Contract Law does not allow the governing body to pursue projects in the private sector. Mr. Placek said the project is awarded as a whole, it can't be parsed out by individual items. Mr. Gadaleta said the architect should give a breakdown of the costs by bidder and the project should be value engineered.

Edward Kilarjian – 465 River Road. Mr. Kilarjian spoke about the recent passing of a New Milford resident. He mentioned an encounter at Burger King and also mentioned seeing Lt. Duby recently.

Frank DeBari – 120 River Road. Mr. DeBari said that based upon what was discussed tonight, resolution 2016:219 should be pulled from the consent agenda for a separate vote. He said the Borough should cancel the bid and have a conversation with the architect. He said if the decision to hire a project manager is made the Council should discuss it with Boswell Engineering.

Mayor Subrizi said she understands that there are those who do not want to see the project move forward but that to subvert the process any further would be an injustice to the project. She said

the bids have been fully vetted and she thinks it is time to vote within the guidelines of public bidding law.

Council President Robalino made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Mayor Subrizi said that resolution 2016:219 would be pulled from the consent agenda for a separate vote. She said resolution 2016:222 was added to appoint the Social Services Director and resolution 2016:223 was added to approve salary increases for the Plumbing and Electrical Sub-Code Officials.

VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Colucci made a motion to approve the consent agenda consisting of resolution 2016:208 through 2016:218 and resolutions 2016:220 through 2016:223. Councilman Alonso seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Robalino made a motion to approve resolution 2016:219. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote as follows:

For the motion: Colucci, Robalino, Alonso, Subrizi Against the motion: Sirocchi-Hurley, Grant, Cabrera

Abstain: None

In casting her vote, Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley expressed concern over the contractor's lack of experience.

In casting his vote, Councilman Colucci confirmed that there is a sprinkler system in the plans and said that he wants to see the project move forward. He further stated that he would like to have an RFQ issued for a project manager to oversee the project on a daily basis. He said the Council does not have the right to withhold the bid award based upon the contractor's lack of experience.

In casting her vote, Councilwoman Grant said she has expressed her support for the Police Department but she wants a building the Borough can be proud of and that the issues she has raised are valid concerns.

In casting his vote, Council President Robalino said the process has dragged on for so long and the bids have been fully vetted. He said you can't claim to support the Police Department and not vote to move forward.

In casting his vote, Councilman Cabrera said all the members of the Council agree that there is a need for a new Police Station but the Borough has hired the wrong architect and the architect is hiring the wrong contractor.

In casting his vote, Councilman Alonso said the Borough is bound by State law to award the bid and there is no legal basis to reject the low bidder.

In casting her vote, Mayor Subrizi said there is no real evidence to support the rejection of the low bid; it is just another attempt to stop the project. She said legally the Borough can't reject the low bid.

ADJOURNMENT

Being no further business before the Council, Councilwoman Grant made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Cabrera seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 9:22 PM.
