MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM WORK SESSION MEETING CLOSED SESSION IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING Monday, February 14, 2022



PUBLIC SESSION:

Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statement. The meeting was held by electronic means, in accordance with law. The Mayor read an announcement regarding public comments during remote meetings.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to approve the minutes from the January 24, 2022, Closed, and Work Session meetings. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Historic Trust Grant

The Administrator referenced an email from the Historic Preservation Commission regarding a proposed application to the New Jersey Historic Trust for restoration of nine Revolutionary War tombstones. She said the tombstones were identified as Priority One in the recently completed preservation plan. The project is estimated at a cost of approximately \$15,000 and the grant requires a 40% match or \$6,000. She said the match would be due in 2023 and she asked to confirm the governing body's approval prior to telling the grant company to proceed. The governing body indicated unanimous approval to proceed. A resolution will be drafted to authorize the application.

2. Capital Budget

Councilman Grotsky referenced the final version of the capital budget that had recently been circulated. He said the \$25,000 allocation for the Building Department was reduced to \$3,000 and will be funded through the capital improvement fund. He said the Police Department

repeater was reduced by \$1,000 and will cover both the middle school and Fire Co. #1. He said the DPW lost a 1988 truck during the last storm so \$50,000 was added for a replacement. He said the total capital expenditure request was \$1,703,077 and the committee is proposing to fund \$53,238 from capital improvement and \$885,000 through a capital bond ordinance, for a total of \$938,238.

The Administrator said the balance of the \$25,000 request from the Building Department will need to be added to the operating budget, as the expenses were for things like licensing fees, software installation and training, which do not qualify as capital expenditures.

Councilwoman Grant asked if the YMCA coming to New Milford is a non-profit. Mayor Putrino said it is a non-profit and that they are leasing the space from Ascension Church. He said he will be meeting with the Executive Director of the YMCA next week to discuss partnership and community outreach. He confirmed that there are no plans for housing at the location and that the focus will be on child and adult education programs.

Councilwoman Sandhusen asked if the pedestrian crossing signs will be lighted. She was advised that they will be.

Councilwoman Grant asked about the windows at the library. She was advised that they are not being funded this year because there are other items that are more of a priority. Councilman Grotsky said the proposed budget includes HVAC upgrades at the library.

3. Schedule Updates

The Mayor said the rabies clinic has been postponed until Saturday, March 12th from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM at the DPW. He said he will have dates for some of the 100th Anniversary events as well as the seedling giveaway at the next meeting.

4. Administrator's Report

- COVID Task Force will meet this week on February 17th.
- The budget draft has been sent to the auditor for it to be dropped into the budget document. Once completed the committee will meet to review and will work on a recommendation for introduction.
- The Borough will be closed on Monday, February 21st in observance of President's Day
- Next Meeting will be held virtually, in two weeks, on Monday, 2/28

Councilwoman Grant asked for an update on the COVID situation in New Milford. The Mayor said it has been trending down, with twenty-one confirmed cases during the last seven days and no fatalities.

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2022:05

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$196,000 FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF GRAPHIC BOULEVARD (FROM BIRCH AVENUE TO CHESTNUT STREET) IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM A STATE GRANT

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised, and a public hearing will be held on February 28, 2022.

COUNCIL:

Councilman Seymour said the Recreation Advisory Board is working on the plans for spring sports. He said the NMMA will be meeting later this week to plan their spring activities.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Public Events Committee is working on the plans for the Memorial Day Parade and is looking for old cars to participate. She said the Historic Commission is working with the DPW to move the gate at the cemetery to clear some of the plots.

Councilman Grotsky said the DPW will be filling some holes at the cemetery as well. He said the budget committee has been busy working to finalize the operating budget.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said the Environmental Commission has been working with Millennium Strategies to draft a grant application to Sustainable Jersey to fund an Environmental Resource Inventory. She expressed the EEC's gratitude to the governing body and the administration for their continued support. Councilwoman Sandhusen said the Green Team is looking to do an energy audit on borough buildings and asked for input on which buildings would be a priority. The Council agreed the Library and Senior Center should be the priority as the other buildings have undergone audits more recently than those buildings.

Councilwoman Grant said the Rabies Clinic has been postponed to March 12th. She said the Library Board is working to conclude negotiations on the employee contract, which expired December 31st, 2021. Councilwoman Grant said the Board of Ed has applied for a historic Blue Marker from the Bergen County Historical Society for the African American burial ground at Gibbs School.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have approved increases for service years 2005 through 2008, 2010 through 2014 and 2016 through 2020; and

WHEREAS, there was a 0.0% Consumer Price Index adjustment for service years 2009 and 2015; and

WHEREAS, Local Finance Notice 2022-02 calls for a 5.6% Consumer Price Index adjustment for service year 2021;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Mayor and Council of the Borough of New Milford hereby approve the base amount of \$1,547 for service year 2021.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution and Local Finance Notice 2022-02 be forwarded to the New Milford Volunteer Fire Department.
