At the conclusion of the closed session, Councilwoman Greco-Langschultz made a motion to return to open session. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

**OPEN SESSION:**

Councilman Grotzky made a motion to add resolution 2019:137 to the agenda to appoint William Reardon to the Police Department. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

1. Administrator's Report

The Administrator reported that she has advertised for bids for the Borough Hall renovation with bid return date of June 19<sup>th</sup>.

The Administrator said the Bergen County Community Development appointments for 2019-2020 must be made at the next meeting. She said one representative is appointed by the Council with an alternate and the other is appointed by the Mayor with an alternate. The Council selected Councilwoman Grant as the representative and Council President Duffie as the alternate. Mayor Putrino named himself as the representative and Councilwoman Greco-Langschultz as the alternate. The resolution will be prepared for the next meeting.

The Administrator said she has confirmed with the Board of Education that they would like to renew the agreement for the SLEO III officers for the 2019-2020 school year. She said she will have a resolution for the Council to authorize the agreement on the next agenda.

#### **COUNCIL:**

Councilwoman Grant said four photos were recently placed in the main hallway as part of the Art in Borough Hall program. She said the photos were taken by two NMHS graduating seniors and will be displayed through the summer.

Council President Duffie said she and Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley will soon be scheduling a meeting with the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley commented on the success of the Memorial Day Parade and said the Public Events Committee is short staffed and needs volunteers. The Administrator will post a notice, requesting volunteers, on the Borough website and the electronic sign.

Councilman Grotsky said the EOC is now operational.

Councilman Seymour acknowledged the Recycling Coordinator and great artwork from the elementary and middle schools that has now been added to the recycling trucks.

Councilwoman Greco-Langschultz reminded everyone of the Fire Department 5K scheduled for Saturday, June 15<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor Putrino mentioned the Shop Rite ribbon cutting scheduled for June 12<sup>th</sup> and the grand opening on June 13<sup>th</sup>.

He said he has been invited to attend the Solomon Schechter graduation on June 13<sup>th</sup> but is unable to attend. Councilman Seymour volunteered to attend on the Mayor's behalf.

Mayor Putrino said Suez is hosting an event on June 11<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 PM at the Haworth treatment plant at which they will provide information about the lead in the water locally.

Mayor Putrino said he received a letter from the Red Cross and they offer training geared to specific groups such as seniors. Councilman Grotsky said OEM is working on an MOU with the Red Cross.

Mayor Putrino said the Hackensack Riverkeeper Reservoir Challenge is on June 8<sup>th</sup> and asked if anyone would be interested in participating. There were no takers.

Mayor Putrino mentioned the Music Department Showcase Concert being held at 1:30 PM on June 8<sup>th</sup> at the Library and the Girl Scout Awards on June 12<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM.

**PRESENTATION:         HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION**

Commission Chair Nancy Varettoni came forward to address the Mayor and Council. Ms. Varettoni said New Milford was honored in the category of Preservation Leadership by the Bergen County Historic Preservation Board for the town's efforts to transfer the ownership of the French Huguenot Cemetery to the town. She said it was a community effort, which took hard work and the support of the Borough. She said the Commission specifically recognized the

efforts of the Borough Attorney, Kevin Kelly, and former Mayor Ann Subrizi. Ms. Varettoni presented former Mayor Subrizi with a certificate from the Bergen County Freeholders.

**WHEREAS**, the original VCF operated from 2001-2004; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 2, 2011, President Obama signed into law the James Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act of 2010 (Zadroga Act), Title II which reactivated the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the reactivated VCF opened in October 2011 and was authorized to operate for a period of five years, ending in October 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, On December 18, 2015, President Obama signed into law a bill reauthorizing the James Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act of 2010, which included the reauthorization of the VCF for five years, allowing individuals to submit their claims until December 18, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, in February 2019, Rupa Bhattacharyya, the VCF Special Master, announced funding cuts up to 50% for pending claims and up to 70% for any future claims that had yet to be filed because the fund is running low on money; and
