#### 2. Administrator's Report

- RFP's for the borough revaluation were received on Friday, May 6<sup>th</sup>. One response was received and has been forwarded to the Tax Assessor for review.
- The Mayor and Administrator met with the representative from Tetra Tech last week who will be helping to draft our application for the FEMA Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant. We will be sending out letters to homeowners in the next week to invite them to an informational meeting, which will be held virtually, on June 6<sup>th</sup>.
- We have completed the set-up of the Amazon business account, which will broaden our resources for purchases. Any committees interested in purchasing with Amazon can coordinate it through the Borough Clerk's office.
- Next Meeting public session, to be held in person, two weeks from tonight, on Monday, 5/23

#### **INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2022:14**

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$170,000 FOR THE INSTALLATION OF LIGHTING AT THE SUTTON PLACE TENNIS COURT IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM A COUNTY GRANT AND FROM THE OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

Council President Duffie made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised, and a public hearing will be held on May 23, 2022.

#### COUNCIL:

Councilwoman Duffie said she is looking forward to meeting the recently appointed member of the Board of Health. She said she supports the JIF certification for the Fire Department and will encourage their participation.

Councilwoman Grant said New Milford was recently featured on the cover of New Jersey Municipalities, a magazine distributed by the NJ League of Municipalities. She said in addition to the cover, the Library Sculpture Garden was featured as the lead article of the May 2022 edition.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Stigma Free Committee is happy to be back in action. She said they are sponsoring Yoga on the Lawn on May 24<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM at the Borough Hall. Albert Colon, the owner of the Raw Squeeze, offered to supply natural juices for the event. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley thanked Mr. Colon and said she would pass the information along to the committee chair. She said Public Events has been busy with plans for the Memorial Day Parade and the Sr. Center has been keeping busy with a variety of exercise classes.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said Senator Bob Smith has formed a Forest Stewardship Task Force and she attended an informational meeting; she said they will be discussing things such as climate change and forestry management of the more than 800 acres of publicly owned state forest. She said the Environmental Commission is working on a grant application to "It Pays to Plug In" for two, level two charging stations, to be located at Knights Field. She said the goal is for the charging stations to be self-sustaining and asked how the Environmental Commission could obtain data on usage and if there is a way to track expenditures. Council President Duffie suggested they look to other towns that have already installed charging stations to ask how they collect data and monitor the fees. She said Oradell has a charging station on public property and may be able to offer some insight.

Councilman Seymour complimented Councilwoman Grant on bringing the Sculpture Garden to New Milford. He mentioned the NMMA/Stigma Free Wellness Event scheduled for May 15<sup>th</sup> during Mental Health Awareness Month. He said the Board of Ed recently passed their budget and honored varsity wrestling and cheer athletes. Councilman Seymour said as a result of the success of the New Milford Domestic Violence Symposium he has been asked to assist with a similar event being sponsored by the County of Bergen and Ramapo College on May 24<sup>th</sup>.

Councilman Grotsky said the Shade Tree Commission is finalizing their recommendation for the update of the Shade Tree Ordinance. He said it is similar to the ordinance just passed by the Village of Ridgewood.

Mayor Putrino said he will be out of town May 11<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> and Council President Duffie would be acting in his absence.

Mayor Putrino outlined the following borough storm initiatives:

- Met with FEMA to explore grant opportunities for home elevations
- Met with County Executive, River Edge, Oradell and Suez/Veolia to discuss storm impacts and communication issues
- Will be meeting with the DEP with the goal of lowering the level of the reservoir

- OEM personnel from the county and affected towns met with Suez/Veolia to discuss the development of a state-of-the-art communication system
- The Borough's continued participation in the State's Blue Acres Program with the acquisition of thirty-seven homes
- Maintaining or exceeding all stormwater management requirements
- Governor Murphy is trying to secure federal investments with the Army Corps of Engineers and the borough supported the designation of the Hackensack River as a superfund site with a resolution
- The borough's emergency notification system, Swift 911, suggesting all residents should sign up for notifications
- Contemplating the resumption of the Flood Advisory Task Force; will report on the plan at a future meeting after giving some thought to the goal/mission

#### **COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC:**

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Rudy Sanchez -154 River Edge Avenue. Mr. Sanchez said flooding is not an act of God, it is bad management by a private company.

Albert Colon – 576 Columbia Street. Mr. Colon asked if the goal of the Blue Acres program was to move homeowners out or to find a solution. Mayor Putrino said the Blue Acres program was an option for homeowners who do not wish to stay in their homes. He said the FEMA program is for the elevation of homes. Mr. Kelly said the Blue Acres program is a state program. He said it is not the borough's intention to encourage homeowners leave, it was offered as an alternative. He said the administration is committed to trying to make Suez/Veolia accountable.

Evelyn De La Rosa -154 River Edge Avenue. Ms. De La Rosa asked for more information on the elevation program. Mayor Putrino said the program has been successful in some other towns. He said the Borough is applying for a grant, and dependent on a property's eligibility based upon FEMA's determination, homeowners may be reimbursed for up to 100% of the cost to elevate the structure.

Mr. Colon asked how the water company can be held accountable if it is privately owned and they have immunity. Mayor Putrino said they are regulated by the DEP. Mr. Kelly said the BPU has jurisdiction over the renewal of their permit to manage water supply. He said the best way to get attention is through public outcry.

John Jelenick – 591 Columbia Street. Mr. Jelenick asked why FEMA does not attempt to subrogate against the insurance carrier for the water company. Mr. Kelly said FEMA is charged with providing aid in the event of a disaster.

Jonan Paredes – 579 Columbia Street. Mr. Paredes said the last time this was discussed at a meeting there was mention of data being requested. He asked for the outcome of that request. Mr. Kelly said he submitted an OPRA request to the DEP asking for information on any notifications that were provided to the DEP by Suez/Veolia, and he was told there was none. Mr. Paredes says he follows the information on the USGS website, and the reservoir routinely reaches capacity. He said water regenerates quickly and they should be able to create and maintain a buffer.

Harolyn Paredes – 579 Columbia Street. Ms. Paredes said she has witnessed the governing body's support and thanked them for it. She asked about the limits on participation for the elevation program and about those who may not qualify. The Administrator said she will be sending a letter, with an invitation to the meeting, to anyone who has reached out in the past, regardless of whether they are on the list from FEMA. Ms. Paredes asked how they would know if they are on the list or not. The Administrator said she would meet with those in attendance after the meeting to advise as to their eligibility.

India Branch – 596 Columbia Street. Ms. Branch asked about those who were not in attendance at this meeting; how would they find out about the program. The Administrator said she would be sending letters to all the property owners on the list who were identified as repetitive loss or severe repetitive loss. Ms. Branch asked about those who are not on the list. The Administrator said anyone not in attendance can contact her in the office for more information.

Mr. Paredes suggested posting the meeting information on the website. The Administrator said she would be reluctant to post the information as there is a very limited pool of homeowners that are eligible for the program.

Sharon Hillmer – 563 Columbia Street. Ms. Hillmer asked about the notification system. She said people who are not in the flood area sometimes get the messages hours before those that are in the areas that flood. Mayor Putrino explained that the messages go out in batches but said they are often targeted specifically to the areas that may be affected. Councilwoman Sandhusen said Oradell and River Edge use a similar but different system called Nixle and suggested that there may be a benefit to signing up for those messages as well. Ms. Hillmer asked what is being done at the County and State level. Mayor Putrino reiterated the items he mentioned earlier in the meeting.

Mr. Sanchez asked why it would not be of benefit to get FEMA involved in the fight. Mr. Kelly said the BPU regulates the license and the rates, and the DEP regulates the release of water. He said FEMA provides aid.

Mr. Paredes asked if there has ever been any consideration given to putting up a wall. Mr. Kelly said, cost aside, it would be a major DEP undertaking with permitting that could take decades.

Being no further comment from the public, Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

#### **VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS**

Council President Duffie made a motion to approve the consent agenda, consisting of resolutions 2022:234 through 2022:251. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

#### ADJOURNMENT

Being no further business before the governing body, Councilman Seymour made a motion to adjourn. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 8:33 PM.
