Council President Grant administered the oath of office to the new members of the New Milford Police Auxiliary.

APPOINTMENT: TYLER COSS YLEON FIRE COMPANY #2

A motion was made by Councilwoman Langschultz to approve the appointment. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

PUBLIC HEARING: BERGEN COUNTY OPEN SPACE APPLICATION KENNEDY FIELD IMPROVEMENTS

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to open the public for a hearing on the application. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on the application.

Council President Grant made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

A motion was made by Council President Grant to file the Council Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Langschultz. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from May 8, 2017 Closed and Work Session meetings. Councilwoman Langschultz seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2017:07

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER VII OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "TRAFFIC," THEREBY AMENDING SECTION 7-9 ENTITLED "BUS STOPS"

Councilman Alonso made a motion to open to public for comment on this ordinance. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on this ordinance.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to close to the public Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to adopt this ordinance on the second and final reading. Council Present Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Field Committee Update

The Deputy Clerk stated all Council members were emailed a copy of the report on May 19th. Mayor Subrizi confirmed with Field Committee members in the audience that section 11 on page 13 was changed by the Committee to include "Prospective Field United Water." Council President Grant asked to include a correction in that section. She said the last sentence of the third paragraph should read "...up to a reimbursement of \$75,000 towards costs associated with the substrate" instead of "...an additional \$75,000 towards costs associated with the substrate."

A corrected copy of the report will be posted on the borough website.

2. Disbandment of Recreation Commission

Mr. Kelly said based upon a motion made at the borough's prior public meeting work session, he has prepared a draft ordinance for introduction at this meeting to convert the Recreation Commission to a Recreation Department. The ordinance was taken from an ordinance previously adopted by the borough in 2010. It provides for a department director to run the Recreation Department and hire employees as needed, including an assistant director. A seven member Advisory Committee would be appointed with advice and consent, in staggered terms, to provide input to the Director in terms of department operations. He said the current Director is prepared to operate in this fashion if the Council decides to enact the ordinance and the transition should be seamless with all resources in place at this time.

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2017:09

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL ORDINANCE 2-31, "BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS", AND REPLACE IT IN ITS ENTIRETY WITH ORDINANCE 2-31, "DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION"

Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised and a public hearing will be held on June 12th.

3. Library Sculpture Garden – Council President Grant said that she hoped the Governing Body had reviewed the pictures and information disseminated and is prepared to allow the project move forward.

Mayor Subrizi said she thought it is wonderful and as long as insurance and liability is covered she is looking forward to the sculpture garden.

Councilman Alonso asked if the installation would run for a finite period of time or if it is permanent. Council President Grant stated the details have not been finalized. Some sculptures will be given to the Borough while others will be on loan. Councilman Alonso asked who will make the decision regarding which sculptures are displayed. Council President Grant said the Library Board of Trustees approves the work. Seven pieces are being considered at this time.

Councilman Alonso described the Library grounds which are considered Open Space and asked if the sculpture garden would be limited to a certain area. He said the garden will improve certain open space with artistic value but reduce open space for active recreation. Council President Grant said the area has not been determined yet but will be located in the front and back of the property. Councilwoman Langschultz stated the back of the property is used actively.

Mayor Subrizi asked if there is a written policy or resolution to be voted on regarding area location, number of pieces on display, or if it is still in discussion. Council President Grant offered to create a memorandum of this discussion to be memorialized. Councilman Alonso requested a renewable sunset provision be included.

Councilwoman Duffie said she applauds the Library Board and New Milford Art Center for the suggestion of the Sculpture Garden. She said she recently observed games going on in the sports field behind the library not much action around the library grounds. Councilman Alonso stated he feels the Governing Body should have answers to questions before making decisions. Mayor Subrizi said not everything needs to be laid out but there should be something in writing before a vote is taken. She expressed her concern for safety and liability. Council President Grant said the Borough's Risk Manager was satisfied there would not be problems.

Councilwoman Langschultz asked if a definite location could be given for the sake of not only children playing behind the library, but room for equipment to be moved onto the field through the open space, including portable lights and trucks. Council President Grant said the Board of Trustees have not mapped out the sculpture garden yet as they are waiting for Mayor and Council approval. A discussion ensued regarding field equipment access as well as obtaining a diagram of sculpture placement on the property. Council President Grant said she will supply a diagram for review.

4. Administrator's Report

- On behalf of PSE&G, Tilcon will be milling and repaving Demarest Avenue the week of May 30th. They will pave the other half of Prospect, Summit and Eagle as compensation for the price differential of repaving Demarest in asphalt instead of concrete.
- At the May 8th meeting a question was raised by a member of the public regarding the green initiatives incorporated into the construction of the new Police Station. Robbie Conley Architect, LLC addressed the question in a letter dated May 15, 2017, giving a brief list of sustainable design items included in the project.

Council President Grant stated there is nothing in the letter regarding materials with an energy star rating, additional insulation, solar panels or roof gardens. She asked for information regarding additional green technology that can be incorporated within the current stage of the project.

Councilwoman Duffie asked if the Borough Engineer and DPW Supervisor could weigh in on the topic. Mayor Subrizi said she would like to research what was decided initially as it is hard to make changes in the middle of a project. Councilwoman Duffie said what was agreed to initially was never enough. She would like another opportunity to see if more green technology can be added. Mayor Subrizi said that some of the suggested green technology was initially examined and it was determined it would raise the cost of the building. Councilwoman Duffie stated that some opinions have changed and some Council Members want to see more green technology added.

Council President Grant said she would like to reach out to Boswell to see what can be done to the building at this stage to make it more energy efficient. She wants ideas, information and costs. Mayor Subrizi said she would get information and asked the Deputy Clerk to find out from the Architect where the local materials referenced were from.

- If new Police Officers are approved, they will be sworn in on Monday June 26th.
- County issued ID forms need to be filled out by Council members and returned to the Police Department in order to have new County Cards issued. The forms will be emailed.
- The Change Orders on the agenda were questioned by several Council members on Friday, May 19th. In answer to the question of an added charge for a connection to roof drainage and the catch basin, the Borough Engineer and Clerk of the Works agree that both were shown in the original plan and therefore the extra cost is not justified. Change Order GC-06 should have been included in the original bid price.

Mayor Subrizi went over the three change orders on the Consent Agenda. Change Order 1 was necessary due to a change in a two inch copper domestic water pipe to a four inch pipe as per Suez Water. Change Order 2 is to reflect the relocation of the new electric service as per PSE&G. Change Order 3 is to reflect the relocation of the new gas service,

also as per PSE&G. Combined, the total of the Change Orders is approximately thirty thousand dollars. The building of the new Police Department is still on budget. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley asked that the Council receive update reports every four to six weeks on the new Police Department project.

Mayor Subrizi gave an explanation on resolutions 2017:156, 2017:157 and 2017:158 regarding new Police hires. Permission had been given to hire one patrol officer to round out the new twelve hour schedule roster and the other two officers are replacements for police who are no longer on the force. She noted for the record that Brian Ciavaglia is Kevin Van Saders' first cousin. Many candidates were interviewed and Mr. Ciavaglia came out number one. The interviews were conducted by Chief Ramaci and his committee of four officers of different ranks. In the past, the Council was sometimes involved in the hiring process but there is no specific policy on who makes up a hiring committee for the Police Department.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley questioned a line on the bill list showing \$312.51 for lunch for inmates. The Borough Attorney explained the expense. She questioned a \$6,000 bill for auto body repair.

Council President Grant announced that on June 10 the Library will dedicate the mural in the children's room in honor of Dan and Selma Harmatz. It was noted that Dan chaired the Library Board of Trustees for several decades. She said the Historic Preservation Commission will be celebrating New Milford's birthday on the same date.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley stated that on May 26th the French Cemetery will be open for touring and the Boy Scouts will place flags on the gravesites of the three Revolutionary War soldiers and one Civil War soldier buried there.

Councilwoman Langschultz stated the Drug Alliance Fishing Derby will be held on June 17th from 10am to noon. She noted the New Milford Fire Department 5K is also on June 17th.

Mr. Kelly said the he spoke to Chief Ramaci regarding a complaint about parking. Officers have picked up efforts to curtail improper parking resulting in additional summons being issued. He said some overnight parking rules are lifted for a handful of reasons. Councilman Alonso reported that Julia Burdge is stepping down from the Recycling Committee and acknowledged her accomplishments during her time on the committee.

Mayor Subrizi stated that on March 13th the Council adopted a resolution allowing the Police Department to participate in a program to buy excess military supplies and equipment. At that time Police Chief Ramaci said he would not acquire any vehicle or item without Mayor and Council permission. Recently Hasbrouck Heights bought a number of vehicles and there is a box truck type vehicle that they are offering to New Milford at no cost to the Borough. A picture of the truck was circulated to Council members. Mayor Subrizi explained the many uses and features of the truck. It can be utilized by the Police, Fire Rescue, OEM and DPW. It is valued at one hundred and twenty thousand dollars and has four thousand miles on it. The vehicle can be painted and will be stored at the DPW. The Borough mechanic and several other Borough employees will inspect it prior to accepting ownership.

Councilman Alonso made a motion to acquire the truck, Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2017:08

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER XVIII, SECTION 18-4 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED "CONSTRUCTION OF CONCRETE CURBS, SIDEWALKS AND DRIVEWAYS"

Council President Grant made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Langschultz seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilwoman Langschultz made a motion to open to the public. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

George Adelung – 723 Berkley Street. Mr. Adelung spoke about the change order process in general. He asked how the recommendations are weighted and who the buffer in the borough is when the change order request comes from the same professional who worked on the plans. The Borough Attorney said they change order is brought to the Borough Representative and if they are questioned, are brought to the Borough Attorney's attention also. He explained why the current change orders occurred. Mr. Adelung said that he is faced with similar circumstances in the private sector and is interested in the inner workings of the borough project.

Mayor Subrizi spoke about how at one point Suez Water had mandated the borough to put in an air conditioned/heated large structure on the front lawn of Borough Hall for drawing water to the new building. After negotiating with Suez, the current Change Order is a less expensive and less obtrusive solution.

Mr. Adelung said he wanted to clarify, as Chairman of the Field Committee that the committee would like to continue on as a committee and be part of the design and build process of the new field, to see the project through from beginning to end.

Cheryll Calderon -675 William Bliss Drive. Ms. Calderon stated she is Vice Chairperson of the Kennedy Field Committee. She said that the field report referred to earlier in the meeting was sent in pdf format. She agreed to make the changes with the language prescribed and resend the document to be posted to the website.

Ms. Calderon commented that, although an admirer of art, her children play in the grassy area in the back portion of the library. She requested the sculptures not to be placed in the grassy area around the picnic table.

Ms. Calderon congratulated the UGALS14 team and Christen Becker for managing so many teams this year.

Joe Ricadelli – 225 Voorhes Avenue Mr. Ricadelli thanked everyone for allowing the Recreation Commission to serve in their capacity. He read the following prepared statement:

Welcome everyone. I wanted to first thank the town and the people in charge for allowing each of us on the rec department to serve New Milford. While it seems like there is more negative than positive lately, I can certainly attest to the strides we have made regarding programs added and number of participants in rec as well as travel sports the last few years. I am not here to defend, absolve or blame anyone for any of the recent occurrences but I am here to state that we acknowledge that there have been some mistakes. The commission as it is constituted does understand that changes had to be made and were recently as December. Procedures such as a no cash policy and online registration are the just the beginning. The commission formed a committee to interview for both director positions as well. Having an advisory committee that cannot make decisions and only advise does not serve the best interests of the children of New Milford. We ask you to make any decisions regarding the commission with that in mind.

Jose Correa – 265 Cedar Road Mr. Correa, a member of the Recreation Board said the Recreation Board has experience in all the sports programs and it is not the board who needs replacing, it is the person who had the access and control of the cash flow.

Kevin Young – 161 Grand Street. Mr. Young said he is on the Recreation Commission. The Commission knew there were money issues and that has now been addressed. He said the Commission does a good service for the town and kids. He questioned why the previous director reported to the administration. Mr. Kelly explained the director answered to the Recreation Board.

Edward Kilarjian – 3030 Edwin Avenue Fort Lee. Mr. Kilarjian said in March of this year he was ordered by a Bergen County judge not to enter public buildings in New Milford for 30 days. The judge has now stated Mr. Kilarjian can have limited, specific and controlled communication within the Borough Hall.

Councilman Alonso made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.



Public Meeting of the Mayor & Council May 22, 2017

POLICE AUXILIARY (May 2)

The members were thanked for their assistance at the wake for the mother of Dave and John Stormer.

May events were discussed, notably the Memorial Day parade (5/29) and the HS Color Run (5/21).

June events noted were the NMHS prom (6/15); NMHS graduation; and the FD 5k Run (6/17)

The availability of new uniforms was discussed as was the dress code beginning this month, which is short-sleeved shirts and no ties.

The two new members who will have to take the blood pathogen course.

The annual appreciation dinner will be on June 23 at the Back Street Cafe.

The new OEM- sponsored CERT (Certified Emergency Response Team) was discussed. CERT will deal with transporting people to shelters when necessary during emergency situations. CART provides shelter for people with their pets. Larry Mintz is the OEM representative.

Office of Emergency Management (OEM) (May 9)

The OEM reviewed the site plan for the NMRA development. It will provide its assessment to the Planning Board and suggest modifications.

The OEM is in the process of determining how and when to move the antennas from Borough Hall to the new PD.

OEM members are learning the new computer Salamander system. This new county-wide system tracks personnel, equipment and victims/patients. It will be used for the first time in New Milford at the FD's 5k run in June. The program has been made available to the Fire Chiefs throughout the county.

OEM Chief Denise Brunner will meet with Chief Ramaci. It is expected to be up and running this summer. Larry Mintz and Cathy will run summer CERT.

PLANNING BOARD (May 16)

The Planning Board discussed and approved the minor changes requested by the developer of the Gramercy property.

Revisions to the Master Plan were approved.

Definitions of "story," "half-story," "cellar" and "basement" were discussed.

The necessity or lack of necessity for approvals for ramps was discussed.

A possible ordinance regarding lighting on properties was discussed.
