Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to approve the minutes from the May 9, 2022, Work Session meeting. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2022:14

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$170,000 FOR THE INSTALLATION OF LIGHTING AT THE SUTTON PLACE TENNIS COURT IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM A COUNTY GRANT AND FROM THE OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

Councilwoman Sandhusen made a motion to open the meeting for public comment on this ordinance. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on this ordinance.

Council President Duffie made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Duffie made a motion to adopt this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Flood Advisory Committee

Mayor Putrino said he mentioned the possible formation of a Flood Advisory Committee at the last meeting and over the past two weeks he has been doing some research and looking at things that are in place in other towns. He said he will have a proposal for the governing body's review at the next work session.

Councilman Seymour said the County will be holding a Domestic Violence Symposium at 6:00 PM on May 24th at Ramapo College. He said the program was inspired by and modeled after the New Milford Domestic Violence Symposium, which is held in the fall.

Councilwoman Grant said both the Library Sculpture Garden and the Art Center of Northern New Jersey will be part of the annual Arts Amble, which will be taking place June 10th through 12th and will include stops throughout Bergen County.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Stigma Free Committee will be sponsoring a Mad Scientist Program on July 2nd as part of New Milford Day.

3. Administrator's Report

 The Administrator referenced a resolution authorizing a closed session that was sent to the governing body earlier in the day. She asked for a motion to add this resolution to the agenda.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to add the resolution, authorizing a closed session, to the consent agenda as resolution 2022:257. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

• Letters went out on May 12th to eligible homeowners with registration information for the FEMA Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant informational meeting, which will be held virtually, on June 6th. So far 22 have registered to attend.

• Engineering Report

- Knights Field Final restoration for seeded area was completed the week of 4/25, cracked concrete path was repaired and light fixture was replaced. Change order for additional work is under review by engineer.
- Knights Field Pavilion delivery scheduled for week of 7/11, site work to begin prior to delivery, currently scheduled for mid-June.
- Madison Avenue Sidewalks second round of county comments reviewed, and plans are being revised. Second request for extension submitted to DOT. Anticipated bid date October pending NJDEP review and permits.
- NJDOT Culvert Project Design is complete. Signatures from DEP and private property owners are pending. Anticipated bid date September pending NJDEP review and permits.
- Kennedy Field Bench Covers Construction scheduled for July/August, following spring sports.
- Sutton Place Tennis Court Lighting Design complete, to be purchased through a cooperative, anticipated construction start – August.
- Pacific Street Improvement Project (Reichelt to Faller) Project awarded 5/9 anticipated construction start – June.
- Graphic Boulevard Improvement Project (Chestnut to Birch) Project awarded 5/9 anticipated construction start June.
- Warren Park ADA Improvements Layout Plan approved. Construction scheduled to be completed by the end of May, weather permitting.
- Graphic Boulevard Signalization Project Design Authorized. Survey work scheduled for May/June. Anticipated bid date October.

- Having an issue with compliance for JIF required annual cybersecurity training from some board members it is required for anyone with a borough email address. On the advice of the borough attorney, a notice will be sent out giving them until June 1st to comply, at which time, they will no longer have access to a borough email address.
- The Borough Hall will be closed on Monday, May 30th in observance of Memorial Day.
- The Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 7th. Polls will be open from 6:00 AM to 8:00 PM.
- Next Meeting work session to be held in person, three weeks from tonight, on Monday, 6/13.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Seymour made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk, to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Grant reported that the Library Board of Trustees has elected Armeney Urena as their Vice President.

Councilman Seymour thanked and congratulated the Stigma Free Committee and the NMMA for the recent wellness day event and said it was very well attended.

Council President Duffie encouraged the members of the public to come out for the Memorial Day Parade and the Hall of Fame Dinner at which she said New Milford's own Ed Marinara is expected to attend.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley reported that veteran photos, which are displayed on the Borough Hall lawn on Memorial Day, will also be carried in the parade by the scouts.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said she had the honor of representing New Milford at the Sustainable Jersey/PSE&G grant award ceremony luncheon earlier in the day. She said New Milford was the

recipient of a \$20,000 grant, which will be used to complete an Environmental Resource Inventory. She also reported that she has been invited to be a panelist at the Sustainable Energy Summit, which will take place on June 24th in Holmdel, NJ; members of the public are invited to attend.

Mayor Putrino said last week was National Police Week and he thanked and recognized the NMPD for their contributions to the town.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC:

Councilman Seymour made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Ann Lamorte – Haworth, NJ – Ms. Lamorte said she recently inherited a home at 300 Birchwood Road and was unaware, until she applied for a CCO, that a concrete apron is required. She asked for the reason for this ordinance and suggested that it should be changed, or exceptions should be made in certain circumstances.

Mr. Kelly said the ordinance has been in place for more than a decade and that homeowners are notified as a result of a triggering event, such as a sale. He said it is a valid law that is currently on the books and there can be no exceptions.

Being no other member of the public who wished to comment, Councilwoman Grant made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to approve the consent agenda, consisting of resolutions 2022:252 through 2022:257. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.
