7:00 PM WORK SESSION MEETING
Monday, June 13, 2022**

WORK SESSION:

Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statement.

APPOINTMENTS:

MERVIN MALIG – BOARD OF HEALTH

Council President Duffie made a motion to approve the appointment to the Board of Health. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to approve the minutes from the May 23, 2022, Closed and Public Session meetings. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Flood Advisory Committee

The Mayor referenced the draft document, which was sent to the governing body earlier in the day. He said he would like to add reference to the county in paragraph one and to revise the last two sections in paragraph one to eliminate some duplicate language. He suggested adding the words, "in a timely manner" to the end of paragraph eleven. Councilwoman Grant suggested that both references in section two of paragraph one should include the terms county, state and federal.

The governing body agreed with the suggested revisions. Mr. Kelly said the document should be formatted in the form of a resolution for adoption at a future meeting.

Mayor Putrino said he is appointing Councilman Seymour as the liaison to this ad hoc committee.

2. Dedications

Mayor Putrino referenced the list of dedications he forwarded earlier and reviewed them as follows:

IN MEMORY OF:

Thomas J. Weisenbach - November 7, 1941

LINE OF DUTY Suffered a fatal stroke while riding on a fire truck enroute to a fire call.

DEDICATE: Eagle Avenue (between Center Street and Grand Street) "Firefighter Thomas Weisenbach Memorial Lane"

Philip Kerr - November 29, 1943

LINE OF DUTY Was killed enroute to a fire when an Interstate bus collided with the fire truck on the corner of River Road and Main Street.

DEDICATE: Unnamed River Road bridge that crosses Hirschfeld Brook (between Cleveland Street and Fulton Street) "Firefighter Philip Kerr Memorial Bridge"

George Lester Michels - March 21, 1966

United States Marines - Staff Sergeant Killed in service during Vietnam

DEDICATE: Unnamed Milford Ave bridge that crosses Hirschfeld Brook (between Main Street and Neumaier Drive) "George Lester Michels Memorial Bridge"

IN HONOR OF:

Carl Behrens - 1st Mayor of New Milford

DEDICATE: Unnamed pocket park on the corner Northwest corner of River Road and Harrison Street

American Legion Post - The former site of the American Legion Building

DEDICATE: Unnamed municipal parking lot between River Road and Prospect Avenue

The governing body unanimously agreed with the Mayor's proposal for the dedications.

3. Madison Avenue Sidewalk Project

Council President Duffie said she asked for a review of the project as there have been numerous updates and budget revisions, the most recent a request for an additional \$10,000 in design fees for modifications requested by the County.

The Administrator said when the project was originally conceived, the construction estimate was approximately \$135,000. She said the Borough received a \$117,000 grant from the DOT and a \$195,000 ordinance was adopted to cover the cost of engineering and construction. She said a subsequent review by the new engineer identified the need for a DEP permit; the cost estimate was revised and an additional \$95,000 was allocated by ordinance. She said the Borough has spent approximately \$80,000 to date.

After discussion, the governing body agreed to continue with the project as it is a matter of safety. A purchase order will be issued from the road program to cover the additional engineering fees.

Councilman Seymour said the Elks are sponsoring an Adult Night Out on Friday, June 17th from 7:00 PM to 11:00 PM.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Mad Science Program, which was scheduled for July 2nd, has been postponed. She said Public Events is interested in organizing a bike parade for children; details to follow.

Councilwoman Grant asked for the status of the Fishing Derby. Councilman Seymour said NMMA decided not to hold the event this year.

5. Administrator's Report

 - Pacific Street Improvement Project (Reichelt to Faller) – Work to be completed the week of June 20th, weather permitting
 - Graphic Boulevard Improvement Project (Chestnut to Birch) – Concrete work began June 8th, milling and paving are scheduled for the end of this week
 - 2022 Road Program – Library Parking lot will be paved tomorrow with milling and paving of Charles, Salem, Grove, Linden and Hoffman to follow beginning on Wednesday, June 15th
- The FEMA FMA application informational meeting was held 6/6 with eligible homeowners. Anyone who wants to be included in the application must submit the required paperwork by July 11th.

COUNCIL

Council President Duffie said the Board of Health is moving forward to hire a part-time public health nurse and they are currently reviewing their own performance. She said she attended the 100th Anniversary Hall of Fame Dinner, which was both enjoyable and successful.

Councilwoman Grant said she and Peggy Norris recently made a presentation to the Bergen County Genealogical Society on the African American burial ground, which she said was well attended.

Councilman Seymour said the Board of Education recognized Mayor Putrino and the NMPD and Chief Clancy for their contributions to public safety and particularly for their commitment to the safety of the New Milford schools, at their last meeting. He said the registration deadline for fall soccer is June 30th.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Senior Center was closed briefly but is back up and running and continues to offer a wide variety of programming, in addition to outdoor exercise. She said the Senior Advisory Board would be meeting later this week.

Mayor Putrino reported on the ribbon cutting ceremony for the new softball field at Knights Field, which took place on June 12th. He thanked the DPW, John Heinemann, Debbie Yeager, and the coaches for their contributions to the day.

Councilwoman Grant asked for an update on the Knights Field pavilion. Mayor Putrino said the concrete work is scheduled to take place in June with delivery of the pavilion expected in July.

Mayor Putrino said the Oradell Avenue closure is coming to conclusion and Oradell Avenue is expected to be fully open by the following day.



RESOLUTION CALLING FOR REVIEW AND REFORM OF OPRA

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Open Public Records Act (OPRA), N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1 et seq., enacted in 2002, has been in effect long enough to review the impact on Municipalities; and

WHEREAS, it is the position of the Borough of New Milford, that OPRA can and must be improved upon to make it less onerous on municipalities and protect the safety and welfare of the public; and

WHEREAS, municipal staff and budgets are increasingly utilized to accommodate the requestors and commercial entities who bombard municipalities with public records requests to the extent that in some instances, additional personnel are hired primarily to handle such requests; and

WHEREAS, municipalities are already required by state law to post and provide certain information and documentation on their municipal websites, including but not limited to, annual budgets, annual financial statements, annual audits, public meeting notices and meeting minutes; and

WHEREAS, under existing law, OPRA fees are woefully inadequate for the time and effort needed to search for documents; taking valuable time away from staff — not only in the Clerk's office — but also among other departments that may be involved in the request; and

WHEREAS, OPRA is broadly construed in favor of access and the requestor and, a requestor who prevails in appealing a denial of access is permitted to collect exorbitant attorney's fees; conversely, however, the resources and guidance available to record custodians and municipal counsel tasked with responding to such requests has narrowed drastically in the ever-changing OPRA arena, muddled by subsequent, voluminous and often-conflicting court decisions that contradict the original intent of the law and will continue to do so in the absence of necessary legislative reform; and

WHEREAS, OPRA law allows outside businesses, and activist groups to utilize municipal time and services for marketing leads or private commercial gain, and for litigants to use OPRA as a method of discovery; and

WHEREAS, a clear distinction needs to be made between individual and commercial and discovery requests; and

WHEREAS, serious concerns about breaches or misuse of personal information exist along with the potential for OPRA to be exploited and abused by requestors, as a threat, harassment, or retaliatory measure to bury local governments in hundreds of requests, not necessarily because the requested records are of any particular interest, but merely because they can and have been emboldened by the courts to do so, to the significant detriment of all other municipal business; and

WHEREAS, most importantly, OPRA must be reformed to enable municipalities, their respective record custodians, and legal counsels to protect the safety and welfare of the general public; and

WHEREAS, over the years, court decisions have chipped away at the reasonable expectation of privacy provision of the law, thus allowing the law to be molded and wielded as a tool that severs any sensible balance of transparency, and instead, now perpetuates rampant and dangerous degrees of for-profit data-mining, unsolicited marketing and uncontrolled publications of records on internet search engines specifically designed to circumvent and bypass what few protective measures currently exist under OPRA, and all while allowing the requestor to remain cloaked in anonymity, should they choose to exercise that option; and

WHEREAS, the pandemic has resulted in a startling and exponential rise in fraud and identity theft, crimes that were already notoriously difficult to investigate, track and prosecute; OPRA, left unchecked and unreformed, continues to add fuel to this already dangerous fire; and

WHEREAS, in a most reprehensible instance in the midst of the pandemic, the unthinkable happened when the young son of a U.S. District Court Judge was senselessly killed by an individual who had managed to compile a dossier of personal information about the Judge including a home address, ushering in the passage of Daniel's Law; and

WHEREAS, while this law as intentioned provides for necessary strides and long overdue amendments to OPRA, the scope of protection provided is critically deficient, the implementation creates challenges for custodians and municipal officials that remain unaddressed by law, with limited channels for guidance, while the vast remainder of the Open Public Records Act continues to be left recklessly unreformed, potentially leaving any officials not covered under Daniel's Law or even, the general public at-large exposed to the whim of any nefarious OPRA requestor lurking in the shadows of those demanding transparency at any cost; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. 4894, introduced January 17, 2019, calling for the creation of a study commission to review OPRA, to-date, has been left negligently stagnant and, to-date the legislative approach to addressing the dangers of OPRA have been fragmented, haphazard and contradictory at best, leading to a dire need for streamlined overhaul and reform, which, at a minimum should include the following:

- Immediate creation of a study commission on OPRA.
- Uniformity under the law: municipalities shall not be subject to any provision under OPRA that the legislature or other state agencies are, by contrast, exempt from.
- Provide a universal platform for clear and concise guidance for records custodians. Such guidance should be in place prior to any laws that impact OPRA going into effect.
- Require that official OPRA Request forms be used to be considered valid, including certifications by the requestor of (1) non-conviction of an indictable offense and (2) that information obtained will not be used for profit, solicitation, marketing or commercial gain, or published as part of a separate internet database or search engine.
- Prohibit OPRA requestors from remaining anonymous.
- Require that requestors provide a State of New Jersey address to be valid (OPRA should not apply to out-of-state requests).
- Prohibit requests for commercial purposes.
- Exempt email addresses (also serves as a deterrent to spoofing, phishing and other cyber scams and crimes).
- Exempt information maintained for emergency notification purposes.
- Exempt any information related to minor individuals, disabled persons and senior citizens as well as classes of citizens who are vulnerable to exploitation of their information.
- Exempt personal identifying information from Motor Vehicle Accident Reports, including driver's license numbers, dates of birth (DOBs), home addresses, VINs and registration/plate numbers, unless the requestor is a subject of the record, or their designated legal or insurance representative.
- Exempt pet license information to a need-to-know basis only (health department, police department, veterinarian of record, hospital, bite victim) to deter rising pet thefts and potential for targeted thefts of non-large-breed dog owners.
- Reaffirm exemption of unlisted telephone numbers, including personal cell phones.
- Exempt property owner names, CAMA Data and reaffirm the exemption of property record cards.
- Protections afforded under Daniel's Law should be afforded to all government officials, employees, volunteers, and members of the general public as the threats from the disclosure of personal information is not unique to those rightfully protected under Daniel's Law.

- Provide a carve out for fee-shifting where a municipality in good faith and without clear guidance through Statute or case law denies a request or redacts information which could reasonably be interpreted as not subject to disclosure.
