COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to file Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Grant said she had nothing to report, as her committees have not met.

Councilman Grotsky said the Shade Tree Commission is continuing their work on the revision of the shade tree ordinance.

Council President Duffie reported on the Fire Department activity for the month of June. She said the NMFD will be focusing their efforts on recruitment, at the junior level, and will have information available at National Night Out.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the 100th Anniversary Committee will be burying a time capsule at the end of the year, and they are looking for suggestions on items to be included. She said the committee is also sponsoring the brick paver project and order forms can be found on the borough website. She said the Senior Center has a full calendar of upcoming events including a swim day, a trip to Atlantic City, field day and the county picnic. She said the Public Events committee has started planning for the tree lighting.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said both the Environmental and Energy Commission and the Green Team will be in attendance at National Night Out and she asked for people to stop by and to consider volunteering.

Mayor Putrino suggested anyone looking for things to do this summer should log onto the Historic New Bridge Landing website as they have a number of activities to offer including walking tours and other educational opportunities.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC:

Councilwoman Sandhusen made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Robert Byrnes – 382 Luhmann Drive, Mr. Byrnes reported on an incident that took place in the brook behind his home on July 18th. Mr. Byrnes said hazardous materials had been dumped and Bergen County Haz Mat was called to respond. He said a determination was made that Bergenfield High School has been dumping hazardous materials in the brook for a number of years. Mr. Byrnes said the NJDEP has assigned a case number, 22-07-18-111109.

Harolyn Paredes – 579 Columbia Street. Ms. Paredes said the Flood Mitigation Advisory Committee held its first meeting on July 11th, at which she was nominated as the chairperson. She said the committee will be working on activites in the FEMA Community Rating System, a

voluntary incentive program that encourages floodplain management practices, which could result in a 5% to 45% discount in flood insurance premiums.

Being no other member of the public who wished to comment, Councilwoman Grant made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.
