WORK SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to go into closed session. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:02 PM.

At the conclusion of the closed session, Councilwoman Langschultz made a motion to return to open session. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 8:43 PM.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Borough Hall Renovation

Mr. Cahill said he met with three architectural firms to get an initial evaluation and quotation for service. Each of the quotes includes design, plans, specifications, construction documents and construction management. He said RSC Architects from Hackensack came in with the lowest price of \$36,000. He said the plan is to have them meet with all of the department heads to do a needs assessment, review the available square footage and draft the design concept. Mr. Cahill said he is going to ask for an alternate to the bid to replace all of the windows in the Borough Hall.

Mr. Cahill will work with the Administrator and CFO to secure the financing and will then retain the architect.

2. Background Check Ordinance

Councilman Alonso commented on the following:

- 3-10A.2 a. should be edited to remove "direct unsupervised"
- 3-10A.3 b. all references to "including by not limited" should be corrected to read "including but not limited"
- 3-10A.6 a. Councilman Alonso said recognizing that constitutionally there is a presumption of innocence until proven guilty, we should err on the side of caution and disqualify anyone who has been charged until the matter is concluded. Mr. Kelly said he does not believe the Borough could limit constitutional protections but he will attempt to tighten the language to address Councilman Alonso's concern.
- 3-10A.6 c. Councilman Alonso said he does not believe the Review Committee should have the discretion to determine if a person has affirmatively demonstrated rehabilitation. He said anyone disqualified should remain disqualified regardless of any demonstration of rehabilitation. He said leaving it to the Review Committee opens the process up to abuse or favoritism. The Council discussed the matter in depth.
- 3-10A.6 d. Councilwoman Langschultz asked to have the term "organization" clarified. It was agreed that it refers to the Recreation Department and it will be updated accordingly.
- 3-10A.2 c. Councilwoman Langschultz asked for clarification on the word "challenge(s)". Mr. Kelly said this would refer to any cost incurred by the Borough in terms of litigation.
- 3-10A.3 b. Councilwoman Langschultz asked to add the words "but not limited to" after the word any.
- 3-10A.4 Councilwoman Langschultz said in addition to background checks every three years, there will be a code of conduct that will require disclosure of any convictions of crimes that take place after the background check has been completed.

Mr. Kelly asked for guidance from the Council as to whether or not the section regarding rehabilitation should be included or excluded from the ordinance. The Council opted to retain the section with the following voice vote:

Include: Sirocchi-Hurley, Duffie, Grant, Grotsky

Exclude: Alonso, Langschultz

3. Suez Field

Councilman Alonso said plans for the Suez field have stalled and he would like to have the engineer draft a concept plan. He said it is a fixed space of 4.2 acres, including an area for water retention, which limits what can go there. He said the concept plan would lay out the locations of the utilities, lighting, bleachers, and a field house and snack stand if necessary.

He said regardless of who owns the property it will be a shared service. He said a decision also needs to be made as to whether the field will be grass or turf.

Councilwoman Duffie referenced the email from Superintendent Polizzi, received shortly before the meeting. She said the decisions are more involved than where to put the bleachers. She suggested bringing the Borough Planner into the discussion. She said he could advise as to the traffic flow and with regard to the discrepancy in the land measurements referenced in the email. She said the Planner was similarly involved with the Brookchester redevelopment discussion.

Councilman Alonso said the planning issues were addressed while the matter was before the Planning Board. He said the Planner was involved with the Brookchester discussion because it involved zoning issues.

Councilwoman Duffie said she would like the Planner to look at the property to help the Council to blend the ideas of the BOE.

Councilman Alonso said the Planner was involved at the Planning Board stage.

Council President Grant said the primary question is whether the Borough wants to keep, sell or lease the property. She said if the Borough opts to sell the property the Borough would not design it.

Councilwoman Langschultz said regardless of ownership there is a mutual interest for both the Borough and the BOE. She said it may not be in the Borough's best interest to do nothing.

Council President Grant commented on Superintendent Polizzi's assertion about the usable space. She suggested he should be invited to attend the next meeting to discuss his letter and the BOE's vision for the space. The Council agreed to invite Superintendent Polizzi to the next meeting.

4. Berkley Field

Councilwoman Langschultz said the total cost of the project is \$243,000. She said we have a commitment from the BOE for \$70,000 and the Borough has already allocated \$75,000. She said after the grant from BCOS there is \$36,000 yet to be funded. She questioned the timeline for the project and whether or not the balance would come from the capital improvement fund or be budgeted for in the 2018 budget. The Administrator said it could be allocated from the capital improvement fund and noted we cannot go out to bid until the budget is in place.

Councilwoman Langschultz said there is currently a baseball field at Berkley that is not part of the planned improvement. She asked if the field is currently being used by Little League. A representative from Little League said it is used as a practice field. The Council discussed whether or not the plans should be revised to include a baseball field and decided not to revise the plans as it may increase the cost and the delay the project even further. It was noted that Little League could still practice at that location.

Councilwoman Duffie asked about a large container on the property. She was advised that it is being used as storage by the BOE. She then asked about the agreement between the BOE and the Hovnanian School. She was advised that the agreement is still in effect.

The Council agreed that the \$36,000 should be allocated from the capital improvement fund. The ordinance will be prepared for introduction on 11/27.

5. Environmental Commission - Balloon Request

Mayor Subrizi said the State has opted not to pass legislation with regard to the release of balloons; they will leave it up to each individual municipality. She suggested modeling an ordinance after the ordinance adopted by the City of Margate.

Councilman Alonso asked why the Council would consider adopting an ordinance that is not enforceable.

Council President Grant suggested it could be incorporated into the Borough's recycling efforts. Mayor Subrizi asked if Council President Grant was suggesting an education program instead of or in addition to an ordinance. The Mayor suggested asking the Environmental Commission if they would prefer education or an ordinance. Ms. Maehrlein, representing the Environmental Commission, said the Commission would like both education and an ordinance.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to introduce an ordinance prohibiting the intentional release of balloons. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote as follows:

The ordinance will be prepared for introduction on 11/27.

6. French Cemetery

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Blauvelt-Demarest Foundation owns the French-Huguenot Cemetery and the Borough has been maintaining it on their behalf for many years. She said the Historic Commission approached the Blauvelt-Demarest Foundation to ask if they would be willing to deed the property to the Borough. She asked Historic Commission Chairperson, Nancy Varretoni, to come forward to comment. Ms. Varretoni said the cemetery is the most significant historic property in town. She said it is the "birthplace" of the "birthplace" of Bergen County because it is where it all began. It is where the first families built their first homes, their first church and where they made their final resting place. She said she received notice from the Blauvelt-Demarest Foundation that they would like to deed the property to the Borough. She said the cost to acquire and maintain the property is minimal, noting that we are already maintaining it. She said the only other cost to the Borough would be insurance and whatever legal fees would be associated with the transfer. She said any other expenses would be paid for through funds raised by the Commission.

Mr. Kelly said the Borough would need some type of formal offer to gift the property to the Borough and then would adopt a resolution to accept it.

The Council agreed to have Ms. Varretoni work directly with Mr. Kelly to effectuate the transfer.

7. NMRA Developer's Agreement

Mr. Kelly said he circulated a revised agreement which incorporates a majority of his suggested revisions. He said he received notice that the developer has begun work that is outside the scope of the soil moving permit that was granted. He said he spoke with the engineer and they agree the work should stop until the developer's agreement and full bond is in place. He said the engineer has been in touch with the construction manager and he, Mr. Kelly, will be contacting the developer's attorney. He said once in place, the developer's agreement will be recorded and it will run with the land and bind all future owners.

Council President Grant said there has been significant discussion among homeowners in the neighborhood with regard to their homes shaking and potential damage to their foundations. Mr. Kelly said the developer's agreement does not protect individual private homeowners. He said as part of the approval process the developer is required to maintain insurance and if a homeowner has damage, and can prove the developer is responsible, they would deal directly with the developer.

Mr. Kelly said the engineer has requested a pre-construction meeting and the developer has agreed; the meeting is in the process of being scheduled.

Council President Grant asked if final approval from the Bergen County Planning Board would be required before they could proceed. Mr. Kelly said that BCPB final review is basically a document review; it will not entail a series of hearings.

Councilman Alonso reviewed a number of clarifications and modifications he would like to see throughout the agreement. Mr. Kelly said he will make the revisions and present it to the developer as the Mayor and Council's final position.

8. 2018 Mayor and Council Meeting Dates

The Council discussed the options for meeting dates in November and opted to schedule one meeting on November 19th.

9. Ad Hoc Parking and Traffic Safety Committee

Mayor Subrizi said she has been fielding emails from people interested in serving and been working on the goals and objectives for the committee. She said since she suggested the committee, Councilman Grotsky has expressed interest in leading the initiative and drafted a proposal for the committee. She said she will pass on the names of the interested parties to Councilman Grotsky.

Councilman Alonso said the committee, as originally discussed, was for parking and Councilman Grotsky's proposal appears to have expanded the scope to include traffic safety. He said it mentions speeding, which is covered by laws enforced by the Police Department. He said traffic safety issues should be deferred to a traffic engineer.

Councilman Grotsky said the intent would be to identify areas where there are traffic safety issues in town. He said the intent is not for the committee to make recommendations, but rather to identify the areas that need attention.

Mr. Kelly said Title 40 covers the issues of speeding and that any complaints or concerns should be directed to the Traffic Safety Officer. He said if the issues are not satisfactorily addressed they would then come to the Council. He said the committee is ad hoc, temporary – they will make their recommendations to the Council and then would be disbanded.

Councilwoman Langschultz asked for clarification with regard to the landlord representative. Councilman Grotsky said he thought it would be appropriate to include someone from the Brookchester Apartments since some of the complaints are directly related to the tenant parking.

Councilman Alonso said he thinks it is important that the committee review the historical perspective of how we have gotten to this point. He said if the committee ultimately decides to uphold the overnight parking restrictions they should also address the need for parking and how to accommodate all the additional vehicles. Councilman Alonso asked why the landlord, DPW representative and PD representative would be non-voting members. Councilman Grotsky said he felt that it would be important to have them represented in an advisory capacity.

10. Approval of the October 23, 2017 Closed, Work and Public Session Minutes

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the Closed, Work and Public Session minutes from October 23, 2017. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

11. Administrator's Report

The Administrator said the Borough received a letter from FEMA on October 30th with regard to the revised Flood Insurance Rate Map. She said the map reflects the proposed flood hazard determinations within Bergen County. She said the letter is posted to the home page of the Borough's website and notice of the determinations was published on 11/3 and 11/10 in the Record with a 90-day appeal period. She said the sole basis for any appeal is the possession of knowledge or information that indicates the determinations are scientifically or technically incorrect. Anyone wishing to appeal must present the data to the Borough who will then forward it to FEMA.

The Administrator reported that Bergen County's Winter Wonderland at Van Saun Park is set to open on Friday, November 24th. She said there are trees, representing each municipality in

Bergen County, which line the entrance and the New Milford tree is slated to be decorated by the Beautification Committee next week.

The Administrator reported that P.O. Keith Wester, as part of a community policing initiative, has arranged for Santa to visit New Milford on December 9th from 12 to 2 PM. She said Santa will be arriving by helicopter and landing at the High School field to greet the children of New Milford.

The Administrator reported that Borough Hall will be open for extended hours, 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM November 16, 17, 20, and 21 and will be closing at 1:00 PM on Wednesday 11/22.

Mayor Subrizi said the proclamation for National Family Week will be read by Council President Grant at the interfaith celebration scheduled for November 19th at the Presbyterian Church.

Councilwoman Langschultz said Giving Tuesday will be held from 5:00 PM to 9:00 PM on Tuesday, November 28th at New Milford High School. She said the U12 New Milford Knights Baseball Team will be hosting a Fundraiser for their Cooperstown trip on Saturday December 2nd at the New Milford Athletic Club at 7:00 PM. Councilwoman Langschultz asked for anyone interested in serving on the Recreation Advisory Board to submit a letter of interest to Mayor Subrizi.

Mayor Subrizi said the MJK Convenience Store at the CVS Plaza North will be holding a ribbon cutting ceremony on Saturday, December 2nd at 3:30.

Councilman Grotsky said he had contacted the Tax Assessor with regard to resolutions 2017:285, 286, and 287 to the Tax Appeal attorney as it may affect the pass-through to tenants. It was noted that his concerns do not pertain to the settlements; the resolutions can be acted upon accordingly.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Tree Lighting Ceremony is scheduled for Sunday, December 3rd at 6:00 PM.

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A MULTI-USE FIELD COMPLEX AT KENNEDY FIELD IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$2,730,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

Councilman Alonso made a motion to table this ordinance. He said there has been a change in circumstance from when this was first discussed. We now have the Suez field and there are still capacity issues. He said there are needs for improvement at other fields and suggested the Council should consider using this money to improve all of the Borough's other facilities.

The motion was not seconded.

Council President Grant made a motion to open to the public. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Lauren Maehrlein asked what would happen to the softball fields with the improvements to Kennedy Field. Councilman Alonso said softball would be played on turf.

George Adelung – 732 Berkley. Mr. Adelung said there will be three softball fields and the committee spoke with the softball coaches to discuss their needs while they were designing the field.

Council President Grant made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Council President Grant made motion to adopt this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote as follows:

Councilman Grotsky asked to have resolution 2017:294 removed from the consent agenda and tabled.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Mayor Subrizi reminded the members of the public that individual public comment would be limited to five minutes per person.

Mr. Kelly said the intention of public comment is to allow the public the opportunity to comment on any Borough business or anything for the good a welfare of the Borough.

Council President Grant made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Chris Ryan – 508 Windsor Court. Mr. Ryan identified himself as the Vice-President of the BOE. Mr. Ryan confirmed that the BOE intends to use the field as a field. He said the building referenced in the email would be on district property and possibly on a portion of Cecchino Drive. Mr. Ryan said the proposed above ground water retention area accounts for the discrepancy in the size of the property. He confirmed that Boswell is the engineer for the BOE but noted they are working with an architect on the concept designs.

Joe Loonam – 469 Marion Avenue. Mr. Loonam said he agrees the balloon ordinance would be difficult to enforce. With regard to the background check ordinance he said there should be some discretion unless it was a felony conviction. He commented that there was a need to prepare plans for Kennedy Field because we were applying for a grant. He said it makes sense to allow the BOE to pitch their plan for Suez. He thanked the Mayor and Council for having the vision to finalize the plans for Kennedy Field.

George Adelung – 732 Berkley Street. Mr. Adelung thanked members of the Council for moving forward with Kennedy Field.

Dan Davis – 243 Milford Avenue. Mr. Davis said Little League has always mandated background checks for volunteers. He said over the years there have been things that have come up that were reviewed and sometimes dismissed. He said people with serious problems have the sense not to apply. He said he lives four blocks from the Suez site and the vibrations are a nuisance. He thanked the Council for moving forward with Kennedy Field.

Christopher Dunn – 305 Birchwood Road. Mr. Dunn identified himself as the President of Little League and commended the Field Committee and the Governing Body on moving forward with Kennedy Field.

Ryan Kuchmak – 186 Cleveland Street. Mr. Kuchmak said that he works from home and the work at the Suez site is very disruptive. He said he has no idea how long it is going to last and asked for any assistance the governing body could provide.

Cheryll Calderon – 675 Bliss Drive. Thanked the governing body for having the vision and drive to get Kennedy Field done. Ms. Calderon commented that issues still exist with the lighting at Williams Field and with 450 children in the soccer program she said there is just not enough lit fields for soccer practice. With regard to the background check ordinance she said any consideration to overturn a decision for someone who has been rehabilitated would open the Borough up to liability. She asked for the policy limit on the insurance for the Suez development. Mr. Kelly said the policy limit is \$5,000,000.

Lauren Maehrlein – 230 McKinley Avenue. Ms. Maehrlein thanked the Mayor and Council, on behalf of the Environmental Commission, for their decision to move forward with the balloon ordinance.

Edward Kilarjian – 3030 Edwin Avenue. Mr. Kilarjian said there are too many cars parked on McKinley Avenue and there is nowhere to put leaves. Mr. Kilarjian said he went to the New Milford Library. He claimed to be mugged and commented that the ground is shaking with the work at the Suez property.

Michael Putrino – 327 Lacey Drive. Mr. Putrino thanked the Field Committee for their work and the governing body for moving forward with the project. With regard to the work at the Suez property, he suggested the Senior Center should be monitored to be sure it is not adversely affected.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.
