OPEN SESSION:

Senior Center Needs Assessment

Mayor Putrino said this was discussed both at the end of last year and the beginning of this year. He asked for the Council's approval to start the process by getting the names of some companies and cost estimates to complete a needs assessment.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley made a motion to add a resolution to the agenda to authorize the Administrator to advertise a request for proposals for the Senior Center needs assessment. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

2. Approval of the minutes from the August 26, 2019 Closed, Work and Public Sessions

Councilwoman Greco-Langschultz made a motion to approve the minutes from the August 26, 2019 Closed, Work and Public Sessions. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, with the exception of Councilman Grotsky who abstained.

3. Administrator's Report

The Administrator reported on her plans to fill the positions of Senior Van Coordinator and Rent Leveling Coordinator. She said the positions were combined a number of years ago but are not related. She said she would like to split the position; filling the Senior Van Coordinator position with one of the current drivers and offering a stipend to a current employee to take on the responsibilities of the Rent Leveling Coordinator. There was no objection from the Council.

The Administrator said Chief Clancy will be providing an updated analysis of the traffic conditions in and around the Shop Rite prior to the next meeting on September 23rd.

The Administrator said plans are underway for the reopening of Berkley Field on October 1st. She said we are waiting for confirmation from the contractor as the field may be ready to open for play prior to that date. Mayor Putrino asked to have the Recreation Director arrange for an official opening celebration/ribbon cutting on October 1st.

COUNCIL:

Councilwoman Grant said the Library would be sponsoring a town-wide garage sale on September 21st and will be holding their annual book sale from September 21st through the 24th, with a preview day for Friends of the Library on September 20th.

Council President Duffie reported that Clean Communities Day will be held on October 5th. She also reported that the Environmental Commission is continuing its work on the single use bag ordinance.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Historic Preservation Commission has hired a company to come in to scan the French Huguenot Cemetery with ground penetrating radar to locate anything that may not be marked.

Councilman Grotsky said OEM held its first practice drill during hurricane Dorian. He additionally reported that the Police Department had made arrests in two separate mail fishing episodes at the New Milford Post Office.

Councilman Seymour said he would like to coordinate an event to increase awareness of domestic violence during the month of October, which is National Domestic Violence Awareness month. Councilwoman Grant said she would like to assist with coordinating the event. Councilman Seymour said he would meet with Chief Clancy to start the process.

Mayor Putrino said he and the Administrator had met with the Planner to discuss the concept for Knights Field. He said Mr. Grygiel will draft something for the Council's review. He said we are pursuing grants for both lights and irrigation at the field. Mayor Putrino reminded everyone of the upcoming Bag for Hunger event at Shop Rite the week of September 16th through the 20th. Mayor Putrino said he had received a request from the NMHS Marching Band to use Knights Field for practice on Tuesdays from 6:00 to 8:00 PM. Mr. Kelly said the improvement to the field is not complete and it is not suitable for public use. The old Shop Rite parking lot was suggested as an alternative. Mayor Putrino said he will refer the BOE to Mr. Inserra.
