MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM WORK SESSION OPEN SESSION immediately following 8:00 PM PUBLIC MEETING Monday, September 23, 2019



WORK SESSION:

Mayor Putrino convened the work session at Berkley Street School and read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

CLOSED SESSION:

1. Review of Closed Session Minutes

The record reflects that no discussion took place in closed session.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Asbury Street School Traffic

The Administrator referenced the recommendation from Chief Clancy to extend the sidewalk on Asbury Street, up to the intersection of Hoffman Avenue. She said the Chief had looked at alternatives but felt that the addition of sidewalks on Asbury was the safest option. Mayor Putrino said he had spoken with the two affected homeowners to explain the situation.

The Administrator said the cost to install the sidewalks and the two ADA accessible ramps ranges from \$25,000 to \$45,000 depending on whether or not it would be done independently or as an add on to an existing project. She said given the urgency, it would not be practical to add it to a project that would not go out to bid until next year. She said she had spoken with the CFO and there is currently \$150,000 in the capital improvement fund. The Administrator recommended moving forward with it as an independent project and financing it through the capital improvement fund.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to move forward with the project as described. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

2. Police Department - Table of Organization/Promotional Policy

Mayor Putrino said he had recently met with Councilman Grotsky, Chief Clancy, the Administrator and the Labor Attorney to discuss the Police Department Table of Organization and Promotional Policy. He said based on the discussion, the group is recommending the following changes:

- · Reduce the number of sergeants from six to five
- Reduce the number of total officers from forty to thirty-eight
- · Reduce the eligibility requirement for promotion to sergeant from ten years to seven years, with a minimum of six years in New Milford
- Reduce the active period of a waiting list from three years to two years
- · Eliminate the waiting list for the position of Captain

The Mayor said the ordinance, to affect these changes, is listed on the agenda for introduction.

3. Administrator's Report

The Administrator explained that the meeting had been moved to Berkley Street School because the Borough Hall had to be closed earlier in the day on an emergent basis. She said asbestos had been disturbed in the area currently under renovation. The building was closed, out of an abundance of caution, until appropriate air and surface testing can be completed.

The Administrator reported that Fire Awareness Day is scheduled for Sunday, October 6th with a rain date of October 20th. She said the Borough Hall parking lot will be closed from 11:00 AM to 5:00 PM to accommodate this event.

The Administrator said the advertisement for the Senior Center Needs Assessment RFP ran in today's newspaper with a return date of October 21st.

The Administrator said Mr. Kelly is preparing a letter to go out to the apartment complexes with regard to recycling. She said the apartments are currently collecting recyclables as single stream. She said the borough processes its recycling as dual stream and pays more for the single stream process. She said the apartment complexes will be advised that they must comply with the dual stream collection or the Borough will no longer collect their recyclables.

The Administrator said she is in receipt of a request to extend the terms of the current cell tower lease, which expires 2/19/30, to 2/19/65. She said Mr. Kelly is reviewing the request to determine if this would be allowed by law and then the matter will be forwarded to the governing body for their consideration.

The Administrator said she has received notice from the New Jersey Historic Trust that the Historic Site Management grant for the French Cemetery has been recommended for an award. She said it will be presented to the Garden State Preservation Trust on October 8th and if successful, will require a legislative appropriations bill and the governor's approval prior to the funds becoming available.

The Administrator reported that the Borough Hall will be closed Monday, October 14th in observance of Columbus Day. She said for this reason, the next meeting of the Mayor and Council will be held on Wednesday, October 16th.

Council President Duffie made a motion to call a ten minute recess. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:20 PM.

Councilwoman Grant said the Library book sale is running through tomorrow and has been very successful.
