Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

CLOSED SESSION:

1. Review of Closed Session Minutes

The record reflects that no discussion took place in closed session.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Zoning Board of Adjustment - Board Attorney

Mr. Kelly said the Zoning Board is looking for permission to engage their own professionals, which is permitted by Municipal Land Use Law (MLUL). Zoning Board Attorney, Scott Sproviero, addressed the Mayor and Council. Mr. Sproviero said the MLUL requires the Board to select an attorney and permits the board to select other professionals as necessary to fulfill their responsibilities. He said it is the opinion of the Board that the engineer assigned was not always prepared or well acquainted with the municipality. In addition, Mr. Sproviero said it has been the practice of the Board engineer to bill hourly, for attendance at meetings, and the Board would like to request a flat rate for meeting attendance. He said the Board would like permission from the governing body to solicit proposals independent of the Borough's RFQ solicitation. Mr. Kelly said that the Zoning Board does not need the governing body's permission. Mr. Sproviero said he came to the governing body as a courtesy.

There was no objection to the Zoning Board's request.

2. Knights Field Concept Plan

Mayor Putrino said he prefers the prior version of the plan, with the dog park adjacent to the parking lot and the open lawn adjacent to the soccer field. He said that version offers the option to use the open lawn as an additional practice field. Councilwoman Grant said that configuration also affords a larger area of open space. All present agreed. The Administrator

will ask the Planner to revise the plan to relocate those two areas as discussed and then forward it to Garbage and Recycling, Beautification, Shade Tree, Environmental and Recreation to request their input.

3. Senior Center Needs Assessment

The Administrator summarized the proposed services and fees from each of the two proposals. It was noted that the Acari & Iovino proposal contemplated both a physical and functional needs assessment, with an evaluation by an engineer and an estimated fee of \$9,500. The RSC proposal came in at an estimated fee of \$7,500 and focused primarily on the functional needs assessment, with a review of existing conditions to identify areas of concern as they relate to compliance with current codes.

Mayor Putrino said he would like some to time to review each proposal more thoroughly and to discuss with the Senior Center liaison, Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley.

Councilwoman Grant commented that both firms seem well qualified.

Councilwoman Greco-Langschultz said she favored the proposal that focused primarily on function.

The matter will be listed for further discussion at the January work session.

4. Administrator's Report

The Administrator's Report was held over to the public session.

Councilwoman Langschultz said the Fire Department is still having issues with dispatch and Captain Birnbaum is in touch with Chief Clancy about it. Mayor Putrino said it will be discussed at the next quarterly emergency services meeting.

Councilwoman Langschultz said the Fire Department would like the request to hold a boot drive to be discussed again on a future agenda. Mayor Putrino said he is planning to meet with both Chief Clancy and a representative from the Fire Department prior to relisting it on a Council agenda.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to reconvene to Council Chambers. Councilman Grotsky seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:33 PM.

PUBLIC SESSION:

Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statements and pointed out the fire exits.

4. Administrator's Report

The Administrator reported on the capital ordinance on the agenda for introduction. She said it is for the emergency clean-up of the asbestos contamination and the removal of the balance of the asbestos. She said the money is being appropriated from the capital improvement fund and does not require additional bonding. She said the ordinance appropriates a total of \$91,105, of which, \$57,500 will be charged back to the contractor for the contamination event. She said the balance of \$33,605 is for the removal of the remaining asbestos, which was not anticipated as part of the original job scope.

The Administrator reported that Borough Hall will be closed on Monday, November 11th in observance of Veteran's Day. She said for this reason the next Mayor and Council work session will be held on Wednesday, November 13th.

As a point of order, the Administrator explained that work sessions are held in the upstairs meeting room. She said the first meeting of the month is strictly a work session and therefore the entire meeting takes place upstairs. She said the second meeting of the month is both a work session and public session, with the work session being held upstairs prior to reconvening in Council chambers for the public session. Both work sessions and public sessions are open to the public. She additionally noted that once the borough hall renovation is complete the work session will be taking place in a meeting room, adjacent to Council Chambers, on the first floor.

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$91,105 FOR THE REMEDIATION OF ASBESTOS IN THE BOROUGH HALL IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH.
