Councilman Grotsky made a motion to go into closed session. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:01 PM.

At the conclusion of the closed session, Councilwoman Greco-Langschultz made a motion to return to open session. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:32 PM.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Affordable Housing Ordinance

Mr. Kelly said the Borough's Affordable Housing Administrator asked for guidance on the allocation of income levels and this led to additional questions. He said the original ordinance was adopted pursuant to the terms of the settlement with New Milford Redevelopment Associates (NMRA). He said the original ordinance was basic and proposed revision, which was drafted by Borough Planner Paul Grygiel, does not impact the settlement agreement as it is still compliant. Mr. Kelly said he is attempting to set the array of income limits with a consent order that has been approved by the Fair Share Housing Council and will be submitted shortly to the Court for approval.

Mr. Grygiel said the original ordinance was enacted quickly and provided for the change in zoning for the new Shop Rite site and the existing site. He said it also provided for affordable housing in the commercial zone as well. Mr. Grygiel said the Administrative Agent identified items that were not included in the originally adopted ordinance. He said the revision is comprehensive; nothing from the original ordinance has been changed or removed, additional requirements have been incorporated.

The ordinance will be prepared for introduction on November 25th and will then be referred to the Planning Board for their review.

2. CDBG Application – ADA Bathroom at Library

The Administrator referenced the estimate from the architect for ADA upgrades to two of the bathrooms at the Library. She said the estimate came in just under \$200,000 and the most CDBG has ever awarded for ADA bathroom upgrades is \$65,000. She said eliminating one bathroom reduced the estimate to \$135,000; still far more than is likely to be awarded in a grant.

Mayor Putrino suggested a curb cut and ADA ramp for access to Prospect Park. The Council unanimously agreed. The Administrator will ask the engineer for an estimate and prepare a resolution to authorize the application for the next meeting.

3. Approval of the minutes from the October 28, 2019 Work and Public Sessions

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 28, 2019 Work and Public Sessions. Councilwoman Greco-Langschultz seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, except Council President Duffie and Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley who abstained.

4. Administrator's Report

The Administrator advised that the start date for the road program is being held over until the spring; the contractor is behind schedule and it would not be prudent to proceed this late in the year. She said the contractor has signed a letter in which he has agreed to hold the prices and to give the Borough priority in the spring.

The Administrator referenced information sent out earlier regarding the Veteran Friendly Municipality Certification program. The Council agreed to place signs to designate veteran's parking in some municipal parking lots.

The Administrator referenced the DEP administered Radon Awareness Program and asked to add a resolution to the agenda to authorize the addition of revenue and a like appropriation of \$2,000 for the grant received for this program. Councilman Grotsky made a motion to add it to the consent agenda as resolution 2019:248. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The Administrator said she is ordering Borough polo shirts for the Clerk's Office staff and said there is a catalog in her office if any member of the Council would like to order a shirt.

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2019: 27

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$91,105 FOR THE REMEDIATION OF ASBESTOS IN BOROUGH HALL IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to open to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

The record reflects that no member of the public wished to comment on this ordinance.

Council President Duffie made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to adopt this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL:

Council President Duffie complimented both the Public Events Committee on the Veteran's Day Ceremony and the Drug Alliance on the ADAM event and thanked both committees for their efforts.

Councilwoman Grant announced that Terry Conlan is retiring after forty years of service to the Library and a party is being held in her honor on December 15th. Councilwoman Grant also acknowledged the recent passing of the son of Library employee, Luis Rivas.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley commented on the success of the ADAM event, noting that more than 200 people attended. She additionally reported that Ground Penetrating Radar was recently completed at the French Huguenot Cemetery, with a number of anomalies detected; the Historic Commission is awaiting the formal report. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurly made note of the upcoming holiday tree lighting scheduled for December 1st.

Councilwoman Grant asked when the Historic Commission would be requesting a revision to the historic home ordinance. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Commission is working on it and it will be forthcoming.

Councilman Grotsky said he has reopened the discussion of the feasibility of installing solar panels at the DPW and the Library and will be reporting back to the Council.

Councilman Seymour also commented on both the Veteran's Day Ceremony and the ADAM event. He also reported on the recent Rent Leveling meeting at which it was decided that the board will meet five times, rather than monthly, in 2020.

Councilwoman Greco-Langschultz reported that Jr. Football would be hosting a bonfire on Friday, November 15th at 7:00 PM and both the Pee Wees and Juniors would be competing in their respective Superbowls on Saturday, November 16th. She additionally reported that Fire Company #2 would be adding Robert Kennedy's name to their memorial on Saturday, November 16th at 1:00 PM.

Mayor Putrino announced that the Interfaith Thanksgiving gathering will be held on Sunday, November 24th at the Church of the Ascension. He additionally reported on the Elk's Memorial Service scheduled for Sunday, December 1st at 2:00 PM. Mayor Putrino also thanked both Public Events and the Municipal Drug Alliance for their efforts at each of their respective events.

LIBRARY (meetings are held the 3rd Thursday of the month; no meeting in July and August)

May 16

We are delighted to have 2 pews from St. Matthews Church in the hallway. The pews were part of the 100th anniversary of the church in 1995. There are plaques on the ends of each of the pews commemorating the Dedication (May 19, 1935)

The locks on the bathrooms near the Circulation desk were changed. They no longer need keys.

All the programs are operating and being enjoyed by patrons.

We reviewed and revised Section 5 of the Personnel Manual titled "Management and Supervisory Policy." We reviewed Section 5 of the Personnel and Policies Manual titled "Management and Supervisory Policy." Five additional sculptures were proposed for the Library's planned Sculpture Garden. All were approved.

June 20

Close to 80 children attended the kick-off for the Summer Reading program. The theme this year is "A Universe of Stories."

Terri and Sunkyung attended the NJLA Conference in Atlantic City. They attended a program on libraries going fine-free. Several BCCLS libraries are doing this. We agreed that this should be discussed.

The state created a Library Construction Bond. The results of a survey of library directors showed over 170 projects totaling over \$370 million. The bond is for \$125 million.

The Library received a plaque from New Milford High School.

The ESL programs are running well.

The DPW repaired the benches in the back of the Library

There are 42 languages registered in the New Milford school system.

We reviewed a BCCLS petition to increase state funding for libraries.

We reviewed and accepted the 2020 Holiday Schedule and the 2020 meeting dates.

Beginning on Feb. 14, 2020, any item that a patron has borrowed will automatically be renewed unless another patron has a hold on it.

The Library's new books have an RFID tag in them and come already labeled.

The auditor was at the library on July 9 and 10.

The library received 8 chairs and 2 sofas from the Rochelle Park Public Library, which is being renovated..

WHEREAS, the Borough of New Milford strongly believes in and supports open transparent government, and that citizens and residents have the right to be informed about the workings of government in order to best participate in a democracy; and

WHEREAS, on January 8, 2002 then Acting Governor DiFrancesco signed into law the Open Public Records Act (OPRA) which mandates that government records shall be available, with limited exceptions, for public access and simplifying the procedures for requesting such specific records; and

WHEREAS, the intent of the law was to provide the public with easy access to government records with an uncomplicated process for obtaining the records and eliminating bureaucratic red tape; and

WHEREAS, over the course of 18 years OPRA has been a positive light, but it has also been fraught with abuse and misuse, and has become an unanticipated financial cost to the taxpayers of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of New Milford has labored under a well-intended law that has spiraled out of control, due to the volume and nature of requests, the cost to taxpayers in responding to the requests, and the potential liability in having to pay disproportionate prevailing party attorney's fees should the requests turn into litigated matters, as well as the liability in determining which documents shall be released, with or without redaction, while attempting to maintain individual privacy; and

WHEREAS, it is not only the volume of OPRA requests that challenge our resources, but it is also the cost associated with reviewing, retrieving, and processing the OPRA request(s) by public entity personnel and counsel and possibly defending our action(s) before the Government Records Council or in Superior Court; and
