WORK SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

Councilman Putrino made a motion to go into closed session. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

CLOSED SESSION:

At the conclusion of the closed session Councilwoman Grant made a motion to reopen the meeting. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Mayor Subrizi announced Board of Education Superintendent, Michael Polizzi would not be appearing as originally listed in the agenda.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Bid Results – Sr. Center Renovations

The Mayor reported the Borough was awarded \$46,000 at the Community Development meeting the previous week. This grant is for additional improvements at the Senior Center.

The Administrator reported on the bid opening for the first round of renovations. The initial grant was in the amount of \$127,000. She said the low bidder would be dependent upon the Council's decision on what to award. If the decision was made to award just the base bid, the low bidder would be DiCarolis. If the decision was to award the base and any or all of the alternates the low bidder would be SZ Construction. She explained the first two alternates involved tv'ing the sewer line and jetting it after the construction/renovation. This is work that can be done by the borough's DPW. The third alternate, identified as Alternate 5, is for three benches to be installed outside with a little landscaped seating area. If the Council were to

award just the base bid it would be in the amount of \$126,997. If the Council were to award the base and alternate 5 it would be in the amount of \$132,000. Although the grant is for \$127,000 there is sufficient funding in the project budget to cover both the base and alternate 5. The Council agreed to award the base and alternate 5. Resolution 2013:146 was added to the agenda. Councilman Putrino asked to have the vote on this resolution held separately.

2. Town-wide Garage Sale – Request

The Council discussed the request from the Sisterhood of the New Milford Jewish Center to gift the town-wide garage sale to the New Milford Jr. Football League. The Council had no objection to the request. The Administrator will notify the Sisterhood representative.

3. Permit Fee Waiver Request

Councilman Ashley asked if there had been a recommendation from the Building Department. He was advised there was not. Councilman Putrino said he felt the Mayor summed it up best when it was first discussed; the Council does not want to be placed in a position of having to judge the nature of someone's disability. Although the entire Council agreed they were sympathetic to the request they also agreed that it could not be granted.

COUNCIL:

Councilman Colucci asked about the email from Capital Alternatives with regard to the AFG grant. The Administrator said she is trying to determine if it is specific to the AFG grant or if it applies to all federal grants. If it is specific to AFG she said the Fire Department should follow through; if it is for all grants she will work on it through her office.

Mayor Subrizi referenced the resolution appointing Elsbeth Crusius to the position of Prosecutor. She said Ms. Crusius had been attending in place of the previous Prosecutor and both the Court Administrator and the Police Chief had recommended her for the position. The Mayor said it will be necessary to appoint another Alternate Prosecutor as she had just become aware that Scott Mooney would be resigning; he has an accepted an appointment with the County that precludes him from serving. The Mayor will make a recommendation for the position at the next meeting.

Councilman Putrino said he was unable to attend the community collaborative meeting on recycling; the information will be forwarded to him.

ADMINISTRATOR:

The Administrator reported on a late request from the Shade Tree Commission for the Arbor Day Proclamation. It was added to the agenda today.

The Administrator said she had received confirmation from Capital Alternatives that the Lightning Detection System grant has been eliminated. As the Borough's portion of the system has been budgeted for, regardless of the availability of the grant, she met with the Borough of River Edge and the New Milford Board of Education to discuss the project earlier in the day. A shared services agreement will be drafted once a commitment has been made by each of the entities.

The Administrator reminded the Council that written Committee Reports will be spread in full upon the minutes beginning with the May Public meeting.

The Administrator explained the necessity of resolution 2013:144. The Council had previously appointed Mr. Radburn, a CRP, to prepare the Recycling Tonnage report with the intent that the report would be signed by the BCUA. Since the report was not prepared prior to the BCUA deadline of 4/16/13 Mr. Radburn has agreed to sign the report on behalf of the Borough to submit it by the 4/30/13 deadline. In order to do so, he must be named as the Interim Recycling Coordinator.

The Administrator reported she would be unable to attend the Mayor and Council meeting on June 24th. The Deputy Clerk will attend the meeting on her behalf.

The Administrator reported she spoke with the Library Director earlier in the day who had advised that the Library Board of Trustees had met and approved the recommendation of the budget committee to reduce the operating budget by approximately \$7,000.

The Administrator reported she had received today, the executed Modification of Lease Agreement from the New Milford Swim Club. They will be moving forward with concessions for this season.

Councilman Robalino made a motion to reconvene in the Council Chambers. Councilman Ashley seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Mayor Subrizi called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection, and led the flag salute. Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statements and pointed out the fire exits in the Council Chambers.

The Mayor announced the Superintendent of the New Milford Board of Education would not be attending. He has some additional research to do prior to addressing the Council.

PROCLAMATIONS: NEUROFIBROMATOSIS AWARENESS MONTH ARBOR DAY

The Mayor said a walk to raise awareness of Neurofibromatosis will be held on Saturday, May 4th at 10:00 AM.

The Mayor explained the addition of resolutions 2013:145 and 2013:146.

The Mayor announced the award of an additional \$46,000 in Community Development Block Grant funding for further repairs/renovations at the Senior Center to include flooring and some additional lighting.

The Mayor asked for a motion to approve the minutes as revised. Councilwoman Grant noted Ms. Verdejo's name was still spelled incorrectly. The spelling will be corrected. Councilman Colucci made a motion to approve the minutes from the September 24, 2012 Work/Public Meeting. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote as follows:

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Diego Robalino

Board of Education, Drug & Alcohol Municipal Alliance

Councilman Robalino reported the NJ Sustainable Energy Joint Meeting (SEM) received bids on April 9th for street lighting and were able to obtain a favorable rate for a twenty-four month period.

Councilman Robalino reported the Drug Alliance has scheduled the Fishing Derby for June 22nd; the Alliance will contribute funding to NMHS Sex on the Rocks campaign; and the DARE program will be changing next year at the Middle School.

Councilman Robalino reported the Teachers of the Year were announced and the budget was approved at the April 1st meeting.

Councilman Austin Ashley

Public Events, Recreation, Shade Tree

Councilman Ashley reported on the schedule revision for the Memorial Day Parade. Ceremonies will start at 8:00 AM with a parade kick-off anticipated for 9:15 AM and the concluding ceremony at Borough Hall at 10:30 AM.

Councilman Ashley reported the Egg Hunt was a success. Also noted, women's softball sign-ups netted a total of 80 participants and softball picture day is scheduled for 4/27.

Councilman Ashley reported the Shade Tree Commission will be celebrating Arbor Day on 4/27 with a clean-up of the tree farm and distribution of tube seedlings. Also noted, the Community Forestry Management plan expires in 2014. Funding is available to hire a consultant to renew the plan; the application for this grant must be filed in 2013. Also reported, New Milford was awarded the designation of "Tree City" for the second year in a row.

Councilwoman Randi Duffie

Health & Human Services, Beautification Committee, Rent Leveling/Tenants Association, Historic Preservation Commission

Absent – No Report

Councilman Dominic Colucci

Fire Department, Department of Public Works, Buildings & Grounds

Councilman Colucci reported on normal maintenance for the DPW including field preparation, sewers, stumps, etc. In response to a resident request for cleanup of the natural trails behind the Dorchester apartments the DPW pulled out numerous shopping carts, construction debris, and an oil tank. Councilman Colucci said he has spoken with the Chief of Police about posting "no dumping" signs with reference to the borough ordinance and potential fine.

Councilman Colucci reported he was unable to attend the Fire Department meeting last week as it conflicted with the Mayor and Council meeting. He said he is working with Capital Alternatives on the AFG grant. He additionally reported there would be a sweep of the property at Fire Company #2 to locate the old abandoned oil tank. Funding for the removal will come from the reappropriation of a previous bond ordinance.

Councilman Colucci said he has been working with the DPW to oversee the cut-out for the bridge/bench project proposed for the Girl Scout Silver Award candidates.

The balance of the committee reports were suspended upon the arrival of the borough auditor.

Mr. Wielkotz said he had gotten the approval from the State on the introduced budget earlier in the day and the Council can now amend and adopt the budget subsequent to the public hearing on the introduced budget.

Mr. Wielkotz said the proposed amendment reduces the introduced budget by \$73,000, which reduces the municipal increase on the average home (\$321,339) to \$47, down from \$63 at introduction.

Mr. Wielkotz also explained the ordinance to exceed the municipal budget appropriations limits to establish a cap bank. He said the Borough is not using the additional in cap appropriation that the ordinance allows, but the Borough can carry over the cap bank to the next two years so if the Borough needs the additional funds they will be available. He used pensions as an example; noting a decision could be made by the state to increase the Borough's contribution by an amount greater than two percent. These increases cannot be absorbed outside of the cap. The cap bank will ensure additional money is available if needed.

He then reviewed the ordinance authorizing an emergency appropriation explaining this will allow for the payment of a significant amount of accumulated time, owed to retiring employees, over a period of five years. The entire amount was originally anticipated in the 2013 budget.

Councilman Robalino noted there was surplus at the end of 2012, some of which was anticipated in the 2013 budget. He asked how much surplus remains. Mr. Wielkotz said there was \$917,603 in surplus at the end 2012. \$556,227 was anticipated as revenue in the 2013 budget as introduced leaving \$361,376 in surplus.

Councilman Colucci made a motion to approve resolution 2013:130. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Hedy Grant

Bergen County Open Space, Environmental & Energy Commission, Library Board of Trustees, Planning Board

Councilwoman Grant reported the Environmental Commission discussed the two applications before the Zoning Board in addition to the recent Brunetti proposal. They are planning for the Arbor Day celebration scheduled for April 27th and will be visiting Kindergarten classes to distribute tube seedlings.

Councilwoman Grant reported the Planning Board was briefed on the Brunetti meeting and the Master Plan Reexamination is due in 2014. The April 23rd meeting has been cancelled.

Councilwoman Grant reported the Library Board of Trustees discussed the recent passing of longtime Trustee and friend to the Library Dan Harmatz. Additionally, they reviewed the budget submitted for 2013 and made some reductions based upon recommendations from the finance committee. Through the Library, AARP was able to complete 372 free tax returns for New Milford seniors. The matter of waived insurance benefits for an employee was discussed and will be reviewed further.

Councilwoman Grant additionally reported that she attended a luncheon at the Bergen County Academies in honor of Women's History Month.

Councilman Michael Putrino

Historic New Bridge Landing, Garbage & Recycling, Chamber of Commerce, Ambulance Corps

Councilman Putrino reported on 4/4 meeting of the Historic New Bridge Landing Park Commission. Programming has been well attended in 2013. Progress has been made with RFPs related to the structural maintenance of the Campbell Christie House. The Commission is trying to get the State to fix broken storm drains which are flooding the streets surrounding the area. Councilman Putrino provided the Commission website www.newbridgelanding.org.

Councilman Putrino said he was unable to attend the Ambulance Corps meeting on 4/15 as it conflicted with the Mayor and Council meeting. He provided the website www.newmilfordnipd.org/nmvac.

Councilman Putrino reported the Chamber of Commerce is scheduled to meet on 4/25 and their website is www.newmilfordchamber.org.

Councilman Putrino reported the Recycling Committee had yet to meet and no tonnage reports have been provided. He noted the appointment of a Recycling Coordinator on the agenda and that additional information on garbage and recycling can be found on the Borough's website www.newmilfordboro.com

Mayor Ann Subrizi

Police/Police Aux., Senior Citizens Advisory, Community Development, Joint Insurance Fund The Mayor announced that Loyalty Day will be celebrated on May 4th at 1:00 PM at the VFW.

The Mayor reported she had received a letter of resignation from a member of the Library Board as well as a letter from a member of the Rent Leveling Board.

The Mayor announced the resignation of the current Senior Center Director and noted a resolution to appoint her replacement was on the current agenda.

The Mayor said she had nothing to report from the Joint Insurance Fund or the Police Department.

The Mayor referenced a recent appearance by Mr. & Mrs. Scesa regarding the proposed closure of the northern NJ Developmental Centers. She had asked the Scesa's to write a letter to the Governor which she will be presenting to the Governor tomorrow; the Mayor has also written a letter of support and will present it to the Governor as well.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilman Robalino made a motion to open to the public. Councilman Ashley seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Debra Smith – Keep Developmental Centers Open. Ms. Smith said her daughter, Keisha, is 42 years old and has been a resident of the developmental center for 27 years. She expressed sincere thanks to the Mayor and Council on behalf of all of the residents and the coalition. She presented a petition asking for any interested members of the public to sign to show support. Councilwoman Grant asked how many towns had passed resolutions. Ms. Smith said approximately twenty.

Darlene Minko -477 Marion Avenue. Ms. Minko clarified the decision made by the Public Events Committee regarding the Memorial Day schedule. Although there was a medical emergency last year, the committee did not opt to eliminate the ceremony after the parade; instead the parade will start earlier and the ceremony following the parade has been shortened.

Joe Loonam – 469 Marion Avenue. Mr. Loonam said he would be interested in serving on the Rent Leveling Board.

Marvin Baer – 40 Canterbury Lane. Mr. Baer asked Councilwoman Grant why she filed a lawsuit over the appointment of the Borough Attorney, how much it cost, and what was the outcome. Ms. Grant said she felt there was not only a conflict but an ethical breach and that elected officials have a duty to behave ethically. She said she retained and paid her own attorney. Ms. Grant said the request for a preliminary injunction was denied, but there was no decision on the merits of the case. She said she could continue with the case through discovery and trial and she will announce her decision at the appropriate time. Mr. Baer said funds were spent for the Mayor and other council member's defense, which he considered a frivolous use of town funds. He said he hoped Councilwoman Grant would not pursue it further. Mayor Subrizi said the cost, so far, to the town is approximately \$27,000.

Councilman Ashley made a motion to close to the public. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.
