A motion was made by Councilman Putrino to go into open session, Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Local Legislators - Senator Bob Gordon

Mayor Subrizi introduced Senator Robert Gordon to all present and announced the attendance of four local members of the DeMolay Chapter in the audience who have come to this meeting to witness how local government works. Senator Gordon stated he is making visits to the municipalities he represents to listen to and discuss their priorities and special needs, hear about grants applications with the state that are being sought, answer questions about what is going on in Trenton regarding the budget and to look into ways he can be of assistance to his constituents.

Mayor Subrizi said the number one issue is property taxes and asked the Senator to do anything he can to free up the municipal energy tax receipts being held by the state. Trenton has given back less and less money to municipalities over the years.

Another major concern in the borough is flooding. Mayor Subrizi shared response letters she received from United Water and the DEP regarding lowering reservoir water levels prior to storms. United Water affirmed they will not consider preemptive reservoir lowering as a form of flood control. The DEP stated it will continue to monitor reservoir levels in advance of weather events and keep an open dialogue with United Water in case of emergencies. Senator Gordon asked for copies of the letters. Councilwoman Grant stated that all predictions indicate there will be future increase in storms and their intensity. Councilman Colucci spoke of a possible Hackensack River dredging and cleanup as a way to ease the flooding. Senator Gordon spoke about a recent bill that he will revisit regarding river clean-ups. Dredging the river and ending the flooding is more beneficial than buying residents out of their homes due to flooding. New Milford wants to keep their residents in their homes. Other aspects of the consequences

due to flooding were discussed and the Mayor brought up the Hirschfeld Brook project. One point six million dollars has been dedicated to the project through the borough's capital funds, also, the municipality has been working for fifteen years to get money through grants and feel they are close to getting the additional funding through a Hazardous Mitigation Grant. The work will be done in three phases, with the first phase being the most costly. The Senator asked for a copy of the grant and all other grants New Milford is working on.

Councilman Putrino discussed the Streetscape grant that the borough is in the process of applying for. This DOT grant will help fund improvements along River Road going towards New Bridge Landing. He said the borough is compiling letters of support for the project from organizations and businesses in town. The Senator said he would write and a letter of support for the project. He was also asked to write a letter of support for the proposed historical house acquisition grant, which is also being worked on at this time.

Councilman Robalino talked to Senator Gordon about a recent bill regarding tax appeals. The bill, if passed would make the Board of Education responsible for paying back a portion of the adjustments won on appeal instead of holding the municipality responsible for all of it. The bill is called "Share the Burdon." The possibility of the school, town and county sending out separate residential bills was discussed. Senator Gordon said sending one bill to residents is a better method and asked New Milford to consider adding a one page mailing along with the tax bills, showing a pie chart with the breakdown of tax percentages going to town, schools and county. Putting the chart and information on our website was suggested.

Councilwoman Grant asked Senator Gordon what is going on regarding Developmentally Disabled Centers. Senator Gordon said he is sponsoring a bill requiring at least one facility each to cover the North, Central and Southern part of the state. The Totowa facility was discussed, as was the need to have both group homes and institutions.

Other topics briefly discussed included the following: Bill number 1698 regarding sprinkler requirements for one and two family homes; the Hekemian project which was recently denied by the Zoning Board of Adjustment; and a new round of DEP Blue Acres funding that some homeowners in New Milford may be eligible to apply for.

A tenant from the Brookchester Apartment complex addressed Senator Gordon regarding the tax pass-through being added to tenant's leases. He said many people living in the complex are on fixed incomes and cannot afford higher rents. He said that he had gone to a rent leveling board meeting but was directed to come to the Mayor Council meeting.

Senator Gordon discussed the work being done on the budget in Trenton. He said that cuts are being made in many areas.

New Milford resident William Lo Guidice spoke about the recent story in the newspaper regarding pay outs to government employees for unused sick and vacation time. Mayor Subrizi said that in New Milford payout is capped at \$20,000 for new employees. The Mayor spoke about other incentives that were discussed and although the employees' unions were not receptive, steps are being taken.

New Milford resident, Celeste Scavetta asked The Senator if he had up to date information on status of Common Core of New Jersey. Senator Gordon said he did not know what is being done nationally but he is working on a bill to postpone the start of the program here because it is his feeling that many schools are not ready.

Council President Randi Duffie arrived (time 7:43pm) and, being no more questions, Senator Gordon departed after stating that his office is available to support New Milford in any way it can.

Mayor Subrizi announced items one and two of the Agenda had been covered while speaking with Senator Gordon.

2. Parking Ordinance Recommendation – Ambulance Corps Lot

Mayor Subrizi stated that the Council recently passed a parking ordinance for the Ambulance Corps parking lot. Lt. Jones, head of the NMPD traffic division worked to redraft this ordinance. One side of the parking lot is for ambulance use only and the other side is meant to be two hour parking to allow people the convenience of parking in the lot to take advantage of Main Street vendors in the area. Some people are abusing the parking lot to park commercial vehicles, some for overnight parking. In addition to the language of the new ordinance as it is now, Lt. Jones has made other suggestions within the language of the ordinance which would free up spaces from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm for the patrons of the local businesses. A discussion ensued regarding the details of the metes and bounds of the parking lot property, as was legal ownership of a specific section of the lot. The Borough Attorney will rework the ordinance to add additional language.

Councilman Colucci suggested the possibility of renting overnight parking spaces to create revenue for the borough. He suggested using the parking lot of the former American Legion as a possible location. A brief discussion ensued and it was decided, although the idea is sound, that particular location does not suit the use.

3. Driveway Aprons - Proposed Ordinance Revision

Councilman Colucci spoke about the Construction and Repair of Curbs, Sidewalks and Driveway ordinance used by Teaneck, specifically the portion requiring the registration of contractors permitted to do driveway aprons and curb work. The approved registered contractors stamp their work as it is completed in Teaneck. This procedure promotes uniformity in the quality of work and ultimately makes road repaving projects less expensive. The Mayor and Council reviewed copies of New Milford's present ordinance and found that it fell in line with that of Teaneck's with the exception of the stamp. Councilman Colucci said he would work with the Building department and Zoning Officer to make sure the points within the borough's ordinance are being followed closely and to assist in creating a revision to require a stamp on completed driveway and curb work. Mayor Subrizi agreed that as the ordinance is written now, a contractor must be registered in the borough before doing curb or apron work and the DPW must inspect the work upon completion.

4. Approval of May 28, 2014 Work/Public Session Minutes

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to approve the Work/Public Session minutes of May 28, 2014. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

5. Administrator's Report

In the Administrator's absence the Deputy Clerk read from a prepared report by the Administrator as follows:

- 1. At the last meeting the Little Ferry Street Opening Ordinance was referred to the Borough Attorney for review. After subsequent discussion with both the attorney and the engineer a meeting has been scheduled for June 16th at 2:00pm to begin discussing potential revision to the New Milford ordinance.
- 2. The joint bid for solid waste disposal with River Edge bids were due June 12th. We learned last week that the notice to bidders was never published in the Newark Star Ledger as requested. Solid waste bids required publication in both a newspaper distributed in the county or municipality and a newspaper of general circulation in the state. Even though the ad ran in the Record, without proof it ran in the Star Ledger attorney recommends redoing the advertisement which pushes the date for receipt of bids back by; sixty days. River Edge Administrator will be bringing this information back to his Council on June 16th and will let us know if they wish to proceed with the joint bid or if they will withdraw.

Mayor Subrizi explained the details of the bid publication error and Marc Leibman stated that because of the Administrator's thoroughness the bids went out early enough to rebid with plenty of time.

Mayor Subrizi announced the closed session would be held at the end of the meeting. She said at the conclusion of the open session a vote on the resolutions would be taken. Mayor Subrizi said the closed session minutes of May 28, 2014 have not been completed and will not be voted upon.

NEW BUSINESS:

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2014:11

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER II OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD ENTITLED 'ADMINISTRATION," THEREBY AMENDING SUBSECTION 20-19 ENTITLED "POLICE DEPARTMENT" ADDING SECTION 20-19.4A PAYMENT OF COMPENSATORY TIME TO POLICE CHIEF PAPAPIETRO

Marc Leibman requested the deletion of the word "is" on page two at the end of paragraph 5, as it bears no significance.

Councilman Colucci made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Robalino made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2014:13

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING SECTION 30-2 ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS AND WORD USAGE," SECTION 30-23 ENTITLED "RESIDENTIAL C/MULTIFAMILY ZONE," AND SECTION 30-24A ENTITLED "RESIDENTIAL E/MULTIFAMILY TOWNHOME (MFTH) ZONE" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD.

Councilwoman Grant made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised and a public hearing will be held on June 23, 2014

Mayor Subrizi read a thank you card from the Memorial Day parade's Grand Marshall. She reminded the Council of the Blue Acres meeting on June 18th at 7:00pm and asked if any Council member would be attending. Councilman Colucci said he would be attending.

Mayor Subrizi reported that the Negotiation Committee is in the process of reviewing contracts and she hopes Councilman Ashley will be able to attend the upcoming meetings.

Councilman Colucci reported he spoke to the Fire Marshall regarding a borough establishment that is cooking and serving food without a license to do so. The Fire Marshall said that he has tried to intervene and that the establishment has been told to speak to the borough's Zoning Officer but has not as of yet. A complaint needs to be filed against the establishment.

Councilman Colucci questioned a letter received by Council regarding a new proposed cigar bar in the borough. The proposed establishment would be located at the Madison Plaza.

Marc Leibman addressed the question and told the Mayor and Council that an establishment of this nature is considered a tobacco establishment. After looking into the statue and law behind it, it is clear to him that it is not a permissible conversion. A detailed legal memo has been prepared for the governing body and should be shared with the requestor.

Council President Duffie stated that the handicapped ramp was opened at the Senior Center recently and when it was first used a wheel chair would not fit through the ramp. She said the contractor's work has been disappointing from the beginning of the project. It was asked if there is any recourse the borough can take against the contractor. A performance bond was submitted by the contractor and this is the borough's assurance the work will be completed according to specifications. More detailed information on the work at the Senior Center will be forthcoming.

The Council discussed the spending limits on the Target Business Card for the Senior Center and agreed on \$750.00. This amount will be added to resolution 2014:154.

Councilman Putrino asked that the topic of Mayor/Council Health Benefits be put on the next agenda for discussion. He said he is working on a proposal/plan which will give a minimal compensation to the governing body while eliminating their health benefits. The plan could save the borough \$100,000 per year. He said he will email information to the governing body prior to the meeting. Councilman Putrino also said that he would also like to have a utility water company come to the July 28th meeting to do a presentation for the Mayor and Council's consideration.

It was agreed that special meeting dates can be added and advertised in accordance with the Sunshine Law if necessary for July and August should the need for additional meetings arise.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Council President Duffie made a motion to open to the public. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Judy Seifert – Ms. Seifert announced that two VFW members passed away recently, Charlie Sauer and George Linne.

Celeste Scavetta - Ms. Scavetta asked if there is any news from the Police Committee and was told the next meeting is scheduled for June 19th. At this time there is no news to report.

Council President Duffie made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.
