WHEREAS, on Memorial Day, our Nation takes on the solemn duty to remember the sacred list of brave Americans who have sacrificed their lives for the cause of freedom and security of our nation. Although we are prosperous and free, real dangers and problems still exist in the world, we pray for peace; and

WHEREAS, the blessings we enjoy today are not just accidents of history; they are an acumination of promises kept by generations of Americans, and paid for by their courage and sacrifice;

WHEREAS, the promise of freedom articulated in our Declaration of Independence was made real by the ragtag army of brave Americans who were prepared to die for their convictions. The promise of unity was kept during the Civil War by thousands of Americans, of all races and creeds, who were willing to preserve our Union;

WHEREAS, the promise of Democracy has been kept by the hundreds of thousands of Americans who fought and died in all wars on home soil and in foreign lands, our young men and women in uniform gave their lives to keep their promise to America: to defend our freedom, to preserve our values, and to advance ideals of Democracy.

WHEREAS, we too have promises to keep, we remember and honor all those gallant Americans who have served our country for the well being of our Nation and their fellow citizens. We express profound sympathy and gratitude to the families who have lost their sons and daughters in the service to America.
