WORK SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting and Mission Statements.

OPEN SESSION:

1. Utility Audit – Allan Rotto Consultants Inc. & George A. Koteen Associates

Richard D'Arminio appeared on behalf of Koteen Associates. He explained that Allan Rotto Consultants is on the telephone auditing side and Koteen handles gas, electric, water and sewer. He said they have been in business for fifty-eight years and they audit bills for accuracy. He said the law allows for refunds back for six years. He said they also look to see if the Borough is on the best rate. Mr. D'Arminio said Koteen does not charge a fee for the audit; they are compensated with a percentage of any refund, generally it is a 50/50 split between the municipality and Koteen. He said they find errors in billing 60-70% of the time and have secured refunds for the cities of Newark and Hackensack among others.

Council President Duffie asked what happens after they find an error. Mr. D'Arminio said Koteen contacts the utility in writing and a credit is generally issued within sixty to ninety days.

Councilman Robalino asked about the fees. Mr. D'Arminio reiterated it is usually a 50/50 split between the municipality and Koteen for any refund realized and any savings going forward for a three year period. He said the savings would be calculated based upon the difference between the rate the municipality would have paid if they stayed on the original plan and the rate they are paying after switching to the plan recommended by Koteen.

Mayor Subrizi said the references provided seemed dated. Mr. D'Arminio said he would gladly provide more recent references.

Councilman Ashley said he had worked with Koteen in Palisades Park a few years ago and they were able to save the municipality approximately \$65,000.

Mr. Leibman said he would like to review whether or not pay-to-play laws would come into effect given the municipality could potentially owe Koteen Associates more than \$17,500 in a given year. It was noted they could sign a disclosure certification and it could be awarded through the non-fair and open process.

Mayor Subrizi said it sounded like a worthwhile pursuit and asked if everyone would be in agreement upon the borough attorney's review and approval of the contract. She suggested perhaps it would be incumbent upon the Borough to see if there was another company who would do it for less of a percentage. She noted it would require a resolution to move forward.

Mr. D'Arminio said he has been told it falls under the heading of an unspecifiable service, which would be exempt from bidding.

2. BCUA Sewer Connection at Henley Avenue

Sewer Foreman, Steve DeMauro and DPW Assistant Superintendent, Michael Calamari joined the meeting. Mr. DeMauro provided the Council with a written summary of the history surrounding the request for the sewer main bypass. In addition to two recent costly repairs, there has been evidence of infiltration from the Hackensack River.

The Administrator explained that an estimate to connect to the BCUA main trunk line had been prepared by Boswell Engineering in 2013. It was estimated at \$100,000, which was included in the 2013 capital budget. When the plans were submitted to the BCUA their engineer requested additional requirements, putting the revised estimate at between \$225,000 and \$250,000 in total. The Administrator said there is approximately \$86,000 remaining in the Charles Street Drainage capital line, which can be reallocated to this project. She said she had spoken with the CFO and bond attorney to explore options for financing the balance. The bond attorney said it would be best to bond the additional money which can be done at the same time as the re-appropriation of the Charles Street balance.

Mr. DeMauro and Mr. Calamari expressed confusion and frustration regarding the additional requirements from the BCUA, specifically the need for the ductile iron pipe as opposed to PVC, which Mr. DeMauro claimed could be used at approximately one third of the cost. He also questioned why they are requiring one hundred twenty five feet when the lines are right next to each other. He said they have been unable to get any answers from the BCUA.

Mr. Leibman suggested appealing once again to the BCUA to see if they would be willing to forego the additional requirements; he offered to make contact on the Borough's behalf.

Council President Duffie made a motion to authorize Mr. Leibman to contact the BCUA to request an explanation of the requirements and also to authorize the Administrator to concurrently start the process to re-appropriate the existing bond and prepare the additional bond. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

3. DPW – Tri-Boro Shared Service Study

Councilman Colucci said he and Councilman Putrino met with two councilmembers from Oradell on July 2nd. Councilman Colucci said they approached him initially to discuss to possibility of sharing some services such as leaf collection, landscaping and the sewer jet. He said Oradell is short on manpower. He said then Councilman Putrino suggested the possibility of combining services and including the Borough of River Edge as well. They discussed the study that was done for Montvale and River Vale. Councilman Putrino contacted the company that completed the study, LKM Consultants, and they provided a draft statement of work for a feasibility study of the three towns. The cost of the study is estimated to be between \$19,000 and \$23,000. Councilman Putrino said each town is now bringing it back to their respective councils to gauge interest in pursuing the study.

Council President Duffie asked when we could expect to hear back from the other towns. Councilman Colucci said he would expect to hear back within the next few weeks.

Mayor Subrizi said if the Council decides to proceed it would have to be for 2015 so it can be budgeted for.

Mr. Calamari said the Superintendent of the River Edge DPW will attempt to dissuade his Council from participating. He said Oradell just does not want to hire anyone; they have a tree truck that does not go out because they do not have the manpower.

Mayor Subrizi said if the other towns are not interested we will not pursue the study, but it is a worthwhile discussion to see if there are any areas of potential savings.

Mr. DeMauro said he is friendly with the Administrator in River Vale and has some insight as to how that shared department is faring. He said the Montvale garage is still in operation; they get work orders sent to them from River Vale. He said it is running fairly well; almost operating as a separate town under the control of River Vale. He said there are differences between New Milford, River Edge and Oradell in terms of population and the roads; New Milford is more urban and River Edge and Oradell are more suburban.

The Council agreed to continue the process with the other towns. The New Milford resolution, authorizing the continuation of the process, will be forwarded to the both River Edge and Oradell.

4. Mayor and Council Health Benefits

Councilman Putrino referenced the information he provided at the last meeting. He said he is suggesting the elimination of health benefits for elected officials. He said this would reduce borough spending and save taxpayers money without reducing services. He said the savings would be between \$100,000 and \$200,000 in the first year with additional savings in each succeeding year as the costs of healthcare increase. He said he believes this would send a positive message to the collective bargaining units, it would strengthen the borough's position with the local finance board and will put New Milford in line with most county and state municipalities.

Councilman Putrino mentioned the original information referenced the stipend as well but since the stipend and medical benefits are not directly connected he believes they should be discussed separately. He said he would like to vote only on the health benefits at this time. Councilwoman Grant said she would make a motion.

Mayor Subrizi said she spoke with Councilman Putrino about this and agrees with most of what was said, but by eliminating health benefits in 2015 the savings in 2015 will be the amount spent in 2014 which she said she believes it is about \$111,000. Councilman Putrino said it would be \$134,000 this year. Mayor Subrizi said she does not believe we can calculate future savings based upon the number of variables involved. Councilman Putrino said each year health costs go up so the savings will be greater; the costs are not going to go down.

Councilman Colucci said not knowing the proposed stipend would make it difficult to determine the savings. Councilman Putrino said as of now he is not proposing any change to the stipend.

Councilman Robalino said the elimination of health benefits could limit the quality of volunteers willing to serve on the Council. He said the savings per household has been estimated to be \$25; he said this money will not go back to homeowners, it would likely be reallocated to other expenses. Councilman Putrino said if this money offsets other expenses it would save homeowners money because taxes would not have to be raised to cover those other expenses. He said the cost of health insurance for the Council is more expensive than at least forty things funded in the budget including Recreation, Historic Preservation and the Environmental Commission.

Councilman Colucci said we are currently negotiating our collective bargaining unit contracts. He suggested there be a discussion of changing the type of health benefits being offered in an effort to reduce spending. Mayor Subrizi said contract negotiations are confidential. Councilman Putrino said we have discussed State Health Benefits but there has not been a determination that the benefits offered through that plan are equal to or better than the current health benefit package.

Councilman Robalino said Councilman Putrino said the stipend is a different issue but it really is not. He said in the previous discussion Councilman Putrino suggested raising the stipend along with eliminating the health benefits; savings would be dependent upon how much the stipend is increased. He suggested the proposal may be politically driven.

Councilwoman Grant said if the only reason someone were to run for Council was to obtain health benefits, they should not run for Council. She said this is demeaning to the sitting Council and to any Council candidates.

Councilman Robalino said it is not the only reason but it is an amenity. He said he is willing to take it a step further by eliminating the stipend as well. Councilwoman Grant said it would depend upon the motion that is made. Councilman Robalino said he would make the motion to eliminate both the stipend and the health benefits as of January 1, 2015. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion failed on a roll call vote as follows:

Councilman Ashley said the stipend is a predictable expense that will not change unless there is a vote to change it. He said health benefits are an unpredictable expense.

Councilman Putrino made a motion to eliminate health benefits for the Mayor and Council as of January 1, 2015. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote as follows:

Councilman Robalino and Councilman Colucci said they voted no because the stipend was not included.

5. Gate at Ambulance Corps Lot

Mr. Leibman said there is an ordinance on for introduction regarding the parking lot next to the Ambulance Corps. He said there is a private building, adjacent to the Ambulance Corps lot, with a backyard that has a seven foot fence that violates the local ordinance. He said in 1990 there was an application for the fence to exceed the height and a resident asked how this property owner took possession of two parking spaces from the Borough to which there was no response reflected in the minutes. Mr. Leibman said it is clear there is a property owner who has taken two parking spaces from the Borough to provide access to their rear yard and there are vehicles being stored there. He suggested the Borough formalize this by way of a license agreement with the property owner and collect a fee for the use.

Councilwoman Grant asked if there is other access to the area. Mr. Leibman said there is no other vehicular access to the rear yard.

The Mayor provided some history. She said the backyard has been used to store vehicles for commercial businesses and the only way out is through the Ambulance Corps parking lot.

Council President Duffie said that River Edge has just opened up twelve spots for businesses, employees, and customers on a Borough lot and they are offering the spots to the businesses for \$200 per year per spot. She said it would not be unusual to charge for the use of the two spots.

Mayor Subrizi said it would not be unusual if other businesses were given the opportunity to lease spots as well.

Council President Duffie asked if the lot behind the house is owned by the owner of house. Mr. Leibman said it is a house but it has a commercial operation, the lot is considered a backyard, there is access to the backyard, just not vehicular access. Mr. Leibman said he would suggest doing a license. He said the Borough could do nothing without any concern

the homeowner could acquire an easement by adverse possession. He said all they received in the 1990's was approval for a seven foot fence when a six foot fence was allowed. He said they did this to shield the vehicles from view of the neighbors. He said the resolution allows them to store two pickups and a dump truck.

Mayor Subrizi asked if there are no neighbors complaining how the issue got to the Council table. Council President Duffie said it is part of the parking lot discussion. She said the Ambulance Corps has complained there is not enough parking for members responding to calls.

Mr. Leibman said the Council could enforce the resolution to allow only the two pickup trucks and one dump truck. He said we could also stripe the two spots in front of the gate and ask the owner to put a sign on the fence to restrict parking to Ambulance Corps only. The Mayor said she believes the traffic to the rear yard is "in and out" not infrequent enough to provide for the use of the two spots.

Councilman Robalino asked to continue the discussion at a later date to allow the Council members to look at the area again. Mayor Subrizi asked if anyone had any objection to her and Mr. Leibman speaking with the business owner. There was no objection. The topic will be relisted on the 8/25 agenda.

6. Administrator's Report

The Administrator reported that there have been thirty-two Blue Acres applications filed with the DEP since the informational meeting; twenty-eight are on the borough's target list and four are adjacent to the target property. In addition, there are four pre-existing applications that were filed in 2011 and are in the target area.

The Administrator reported the County has scheduled mandatory retraining of the election board workers for 9/15/14 at 6:00 PM in the Council Chambers. She also reported that it may be necessary to move voting for Districts 3 and 5 due to the breakdown in communication with the VFW Commander. She said she is in contact with the Commander and attempting to negotiate a resolution.

The Administrator referenced the request from a Girl Scout who would like to place a container at the Borough Hall for the collection of school supplies in pursuit of her Silver Award. The Council had no objection.

The Administrator said we continue to have issues with our recycling hauler, specifically, they missed pickups two weeks in a row at one of the apartment complexes without prior notice and no response to our inquiries. The hauler is being penalized \$900 pursuant to the contract.

The Administrator said the Recreation Director has suggested signage for the recreation areas to provide instruction regarding the lightning detection system. The proposed sign would read: *Attention, this park is equipped with a lightning detection system. If siren sounds and strobe light is on lighting is in the area. Take appropriate action to ensure safety. Strobe*

light remains on during protection. When siren sounds and strobe light is off it is safe to return. Weather conditions can change. The system is not an absolute protection. Please use common sense. She said with the Council's permission they would like to place similar signs in the following locations: two at LaBarbera Field, five behind the Borough Hall, two at Warren Field, and three at Williams Field. The Council concurred.

The Administrator advised she will be out of the office the week of August 11th – 15th.

Councilman Robalino made a motion to adjourn and reconvene in Council Chambers. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

PUBLIC SESSION:

Mayor Subrizi called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection, and led the flag salute. Mayor Subrizi read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statements and pointed out the fire exits in the Council Chambers.

Councilman Colucci made a motion to approve the appointments as noted. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Ashley made a motion to file the Committee Reports with the Borough Clerk to be spread in full upon the minutes. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Councilman Colucci made a motion to approve of the minutes from the June 23, 2014 Closed, Work and Public Session, the July 15, 2014 Closed and Work Session and the July 21, 2014

Closed Session. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed. Councilman Putrino referenced a comment he made at the meeting on July 15th and asked for it to be included in the minutes. Councilman Robalino noted that Councilwoman Grant was noted as absent for a portion of the June 23rd meeting. The Clerk will revise accordingly.

REVIEW OF PROPOSED REZONING ORDINANCE

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2014:13

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING SECTION 30-2 ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS AND WORD USAGE," SECTION 30-23 ENTITLED "RESIDENTIAL C/MULTIFAMILY ZONE," AND SECTION 30-24A ENTITLED "RESIDENTIAL E/MULTI-FAMILY TOWNHOME (MFTH) ZONE" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD.

Mr. Leibman said this ordinance creates an overlay zone and the borough planner is here to answer any questions about it. He said from the legal perspective there is litigation pending in Superior Court currently which include procedural attacks on this ordinance. He said this is the exact same ordinance that was passed last year. He said by adopting this ordinance now the Borough will eliminate the procedural attacks.

Mr. Grygiel said this is the ordinance that was previously adopted by the Mayor and Council. He said it is the culmination of a process that started well over a year ago with a request for the potential rezoning of Brookchester Apartments. He said that was the area of the initial focus. He said in the process of looking at the proposal to modernize that development, to add green space, to provide additional parking, etc. it was determined that the R-C zone, the Residential C Multi-family Zone for New Milford was out of date with a number of deficiencies and not up to speed with current development trends. He said if re-development were to have occurred in accordance with the outdated ordinance it may have actually had harmful impacts on the neighboring properties such as small side yards. He said he looked at improving the development standards throughout the zone to modernize it and to provide additional safeguards for residents nearby. He said it will also, in limited instances, for larger properties, allow for more intense development in terms of height and number of units but only in exchange for a provision of affordable housing units.

Mr. Grygiel said rezoning this zone will allow for full compliance with COAH, the affordable housing standards of the State of New Jersey. Other benefits required in exchange for additional height are greater setbacks, where 20' is the minimum today, for the tallest buildings proposed, up to 68' in height, 150' would be the minimum setback from a residential property. He said this is seven and half times the setback requirement that exists today for buildings that will be less than twice as high. Mr. Grygiel said parking is a serious concern in the Brookchester community. He said the development as it exists today has inadequate parking on the site. What is proposed is to provide new parking for any development to comply with State standards. This will eliminate offsite parking demands for residents of this development. He said in addition to this and the improvements to the setbacks, green space would be provided, recreation facilities will be required, and onsite affordable housing. Mr. Grygiel said the ordinance has also been considered by the Planning Board in accordance with the Master Plan.

Councilman Putrino made a motion to open to the public for comment on this ordinance. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

George Ann Scrabo – 242 Reichelt Road. Ms. Scrabo commented the parking situation continues to worsen. She asked how many additional spaces will be provided per apartment. Mayor Subrizi said the proposal includes parking structures to eliminate street parking. Mr. Grygiel said the state requires 1.8 spaces for a studio apartment, 2 spaces for a two bedroom apartment, and 2.1 spaces for a three bedroom apartment. Ms. Scrabo asked about the 150' setback. Mr. Grygiel said that is the minimum distance required from a building. Prior to finishing his sentence Ms. Scrabo asked the setback from the street. Mr. Grygiel said the minimum from the street is 25' but that would be for the shorter buildings. Ms. Scrabo asked if they are adding on to the existing buildings or building new buildings. Mr. Grygiel said the proposal tonight for the zoning is only to change the standards to allow for new development. He said, however that Brookchester's owner has shown concept plans at public meetings and there are plans on file that do propose certain taller buildings in accordance with the proposed ordinance. He said the current proposal is for a portion of the current development to be demolished and then replaced with new, state of the art buildings that have sprinklers, modern fire safety standards and everything up to current standards. He said it is a mix of three, four, and five stories being proposed.

Ruth Gilchrist – 380 Congress Street. Ms. Gilchrist asked if the development would be a pyramid. Mr. Grygiel said the shorter buildings would be toward the property lines and the taller buildings would only be permitted on the interior of the property. Ms. Gilchrist asked if the ordinance is passed what would stop from them from going up all over; she specifically referenced the water company property. Mr. Grygiel said the zoning ordinance is a law regulating heights, setbacks, dimensions of buildings and property coverage. He said the ordinance is very detailed with varying setbacks; he said nobody could build a taller building unless a greater setback is provided. Mayor Subrizi asked the minimum lot size required to create this zone. Mr. Grygiel said this is the minimum lot size required to allow for the larger scale development. He said for a smaller scale projects none of this would even apply without a consolidation of properties. Mr. Grygiel said the water company property would not qualify by virtue of its size and because it is in a Residential A Zone.

Terrence McMackin – Madison Avenue. Mr. McMackin noted the 68' height and asked if it will be five stories. Mr. Grygiel said that is the maximum permitted. Mr. McMackin asked for an estimate on the number of people who will be housed. Mr. Grygiel noted that relates to the proposal from Brookchester as opposed to the zoning ordinance. Mr. Leibman said according to the economic impact analysis provided by the developer the development currently houses 1,202 residents and as projected would house 2,300. He continued by noting the positive impact of the proposed development stating the current development produces a net loss to the borough of \$300,000 per year, where the proposed development will produce, at a minimum, \$720,000 in additional tax revenue for a net gain of over \$1,000,000 annually. Mr. Leibman said the economic impact analysis is on file for review at the borough. Councilman Colucci said the report also addresses the number of additional schoolchildren. Councilman Robalino said there will be 82 additional schoolchildren as a result of the proposed development. Mr. McMackin said it will also increase the number of police officers required. He asked if the new fire truck will be adequate to

fight a fire in these new buildings. Mayor Subrizi said these questions would all be addressed if and when the development got to the planning stage.

Les Rothman – 349 East Woodland Road. Mr. Rothman said as described this development would resemble a wedding cake. He said he hopes the Mayor and Council are not married to the ordinance. Mr. Rothman asked for the ordinance to be removed from the agenda or postponed for at least a full year until all the ramifications can be analyzed – the environmental impact, the infrastructure, property values of the homes in proximity of the project, and the impact on the schools.

Paul Vanieri – 337 E. Woodland Road. Mr. Vanieri said his backyard borders the Brookchester property. He said there are garages that are up on a hill behind his property. He asked for clarification of the 20' vs. 150'. He said the 2 ½ stories now is about 35' and what is being proposed is a little less than double. Mr. Grygiel said the 150' is a horizontal dimension from any property in an RA Zone to a building of over 50' tall. Mr. Grygiel said the zoning allows 35' buildings 20' away. He said if the developer decided to knock down the garages that exist today he could build 2 ½ story buildings 20' off the property line. He said this ordinance would not allow for that; it would allow taller buildings but they would have to be placed half the distance of a football field away. Mr. Vanieri asked about the garages. Councilman Colucci said they will no longer be there; there is a walking path in that area as proposed. Mr. Vanieri asked what standard the borough is not meeting in terms of affordable housing. Mr. Leibman advised everyone on the Council to not respond to the question as the Borough is in litigation involving a COAH action. Mr. Vanieri also commented on the parking issues. Councilman Colucci said the plan is put the cars internal to the property.

Mayor Subrizi said Mr. Brunetti stated he does not want to force this on the town. The Mayor said this would bring a \$145 million ratable to the town. She said this is still not an application; the Borough is looking to create the zone to allow for an application. She said there is no part of the existing Brookchester development that applies to the Borough's COAH obligation.

Councilwoman Grant asked if Mr. Grygiel could explain why Brookchester doesn't currently count as affordable housing. Mr. Grygiel said the standards do not allow credit for any housing built prior to 1980.

Mr. Vanieri asked how the schools would handle the additional students. Mayor Subrizi said the net increase is projected to be eighty-two students spread out through four schools and twelve grades. Mr. Vanieri questioned the validity of the number. Mr. Grygiel said the report is prepared in accordance with the Rutgers standards; those are not just numbers someone came up with. The standards are based on real numbers from real developments throughout the State of NJ and they have been proven to be correct. He said he looked at the numbers provided by the developer's planner and he concurred they were the correct assumptions being made.

Steven Murray – 478 Luhmann Drive. Mr. Murray questioned the number of stories vs. the 68' height. He said the average ceiling height of an apartment is 8' to 10'; he said six to eight stories could be built. Mr. Grygiel says the ordinance provides for 3 ½ stories or 48' and 5 ½ stories or 68'. The additional height is to allow for a pitched roof. Mr. Murray suggested that any new construction be required to be LEED certified at least silver or gold to decrease the carbon

footprint. Mr. Grygiel said it may be too onerous to require LEED, a standard from the US Green Building Council that imposes cost on developers. He said however the ordinance does say the use of green building techniques and other environmental sustainability measures is encouraged.

Rodger Hemmings, 263 E. Woodland Road. Mr. Hemmings said we have inadequately provided for low income housing and asked if this was one of the motivations for the ordinance. Mr. Leibman advised everyone on the Council and Mr. Grygiel not to respond to the inquiry. Mr. Leibman said the Borough has been sued by the proposed developer of the United Water property, who has filed a lawsuit that says that this town is not compliant with its obligations to provide affordable housing and if that lawsuit is successful the Borough's entire zoning ordinance will be invalidated and the developer will be entitled to construct affordable housing wherever he wants. He said this ordinance is not related to that proposal. This ordinance has come about because this Council has worked very hard to try to come up with an idea that is going to benefit the entire town by building moderate housing with more tax revenue in a very balanced approach. Mr. Hemmings asked if there are laws with respect to senior housing; he said New Milford is lacking in senior housing. Mr. Grygiel said there are no requirements from the State to provide senior citizen or active adult housing.

Eileen Rothman 349 East Woodland Road. . Ms. Rothman said she is a certified math teacher and a statistician. She said she looked over the figures and she gave them to one of her students who has a PhD in statistics and the figures are skewed. She specifically referenced the income that will be generated and the number of children that will be added to the school system. Ms. Rothman said there are number of underground streams in the area. She asked how much it will cost the town for sewerage disposition. She said the town needs to get a civil engineer they cannot rely on what Mr. Brunetti said.

Maryann Milligan – Madison Avenue. Ms. Milligan said she was at the meeting when Brunetti made the presentation. Ms. Milligan said when she read the minutes it appeared as though everything revolved around accommodating with Brunetti plans to do. She stated it was said that if five stories were not allowed Brunetti would not build. She asked if we are doing this for Brunetti or the Borough. She said she would like to see more work; she said this is the first time the public has been told anything about it. She asked if the Milford Arms would be able to do this in the future, and suggested they may be able to if this is allowed to go through.

Henry Donde – 415 Congress Street. Mr. Donde said it was mentioned that this is tiered with units close to housing being lower and then increasing in height as they approach the Boulevard. He said when he reviewed the plan he noted that 150' from his property line the building was 5 ½ stories. Mr. Grygiel said the zoning does not have tiering per se. He said it does have standards to provide that taller buildings are only permitted furthest away from the residential zone, the 150' setback. He said as you get closer to existing homes in the residential zone the heights go down. He said the the tallest buildings will be one half of a football field distance away with green space or a parking lot and a 15' buffer requirement of undisturbed space. Mr. Donde referenced Brookchester property as opposed to New Milford Village property and asked to clarify if the property in question is the Brookchester property. Mr. Leibman said, to be clear, there is no proposed development at this time, there is a concept plan. Mr. Donde asked if the concept plan contemplates the entire Brookchester property or just a portion. Mayor Subrizi said it is just a

portion of the property. Mr. Donde said the piece in question is going to go from 750 units to 1,110 units which is approximately 50% more. Mr. Donde asked about the other sections of Brookchester and Mr. Leibman said he does not believe Mr. Brunetti owns any other sections of the Brookchester property. Mr. Grygiel said there is not another section that is twenty-five acres that could have the same size development. He said beyond that the requirements for increasing density are contingent on providing adequate parking; they would have to provide parking that meets the current standards, drainage that complies with State stormwater management standards, additional green space. He said the development potential that has been shown to the Mayor and Council is essentially it, there may be a few more sections that could make incremental change but not nearly to the extent of this proposal. Mr. Donde asked if the town presently owns fire equipment to meet the needs of a 68' building. Mr. Grygiel said new construction of that height would have to be either sprinkled and/or meet all the construction codes for a building that size such as fire walls. Mayor Subrizi said this is a concept not an application and all of this would be considered as part of the application. Mr. Donde asked if the Council considered traffic and other impacts that would result from increasing the development population from 1,100 to 2,300. Mr. Grygiel said the concept plan was evaluated by both the Borough Planner and the Borough Engineer and professional reports were reviewed. He said even if the rezoning is approved no application would be approved without a determination that there would be no adverse impact. Mr. Donde said he is not in favor of the proposed rezoning.

Scott Huber – 49 Bulger Avenue. Mr. Huber said he is hearing a lot of approximations and estimates. He said this is a law that will allow things to be developed in the town. He asked how the Council could consider this based upon approximations. Mr. Leibman said they are speaking in approximates but all of the specific numbers are contained in the fiscal impact analysis which has been on file for anyone to review. He said in terms of the detail regarding sewerage and runoff, these are engineering site plan issues that are reviewed by zoning and planning boards. He said the governing body writes the ordinance, the application gets made to the board and that is where the details are discussed. Mr. Huber said the movement starts here and he thinks it is premature to make this type of decision. The Mayor said the Council has been reviewing it for a year or more.

Doug Biejin – 348 E. Woodland Road. Mr. Biejin asked for the parameters of the development. Mayor Subrizi said the proposed development is on the Boulevard to the left and the right and up to the circle. Mr. Biejin said they apartments don't pay their fair share, they park where they are not supposed to. He said there is no need for the complex, they can fix what they have.

Steven Murray. Mr. Murray said the letter he received reads the ordinance is supposed to cover Brookchester north of River Road over to Hoffman Avenue to Reichelt Road, which is what was once all of the Brookchester Apartments. He said now it is being said that it is from the circle to both sides of the Boulevard. Mr. Grygiel said there are two aspects. The RC Zone covers multiple sections of New Milford including Dorchester, Brookchester, New Milford Estates and Milford Arms. He said the concept that has been discussed and reviewed is only for a portion of the Brookchester development.

Doreen Moat – 384 Congress Street. Ms. Moat said she was insulted when it was said the residents don't like it because they live near it; she said it could affect all residents down the road.

She said it is important to let the entire town know what is going on. She said it is unrealistic to say the addition of 1,200 people will only add 82 children. She asked if the ordinance is put on the books isn't the town opening itself up to a lawsuit if they do not allow the developer to build what has been proposed. Mr. Grygiel said no application can be made to the Planning Board unless the zoning is in place but the Planning Board can deny the application if it has excessive impacts. With regard to notice to the town, Mayor Subrizi said it was discussed during the Planning Board's review of the Master Plan and there is access to all of the Mayor and Council meetings and Planning Board and Zoning Board meetings on the Borough website. She said she is certain the proposed rezoning and the concept plan have been written about in the Twin Boro News and added that meetings are public and are advertised and people are encouraged to come. Ms. Moat asked if Brookchester is in such shambles why are they are not required to bring it up to code.

Paul Vanieri. Mr. Vanieri referenced the comment on sump pumps noting that water is an issue on his property. Mayor Subrizi said stormwater management rules requires runoff to be contained within the property for any new construction. She said if the application proceeds they would be required to comply, it is State law. Mr. Vanieri said water causes rodent problems and asked where in this process his concerns would be addressed. Mayor Subrizi said an application would be heard by the Planning Board and that is where he would bring his concerns.

Scott Huber. Mr. Huber asked if the Council was aware the perc comes right up to the surface in the area in question. He said you can't pump or disburse water in the ground there because there is zero perc.

Being no further comment from the public on this ordinance, Councilman Ashley made a motion to close to the public on this ordinance. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Ashley made a motion to adopt this ordinance on its second and final reading. Councilman Colucci seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote, all present in favor, none opposed.

Mayor Subrizi called for a short break at 9:42 PM. The meeting was reconvened at 9:50 PM.

Mayor Subrizi recognized a member of the audience who is attending on another matter and asked, if there were no objections, to allow him to speak out of order. Councilman Robalino made a motion to open. Councilman Putrino seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Mr. George Stafford of the New Jersey Highlands Coalition came forward to address the Council. Mr. Stafford said the Highlands Act is ten years old and they are revising the Master Plan. He said unlike the original Master Plan, this one is going to be done pretty much behind closed doors. The Highlands Council will then bring the decision of what they plan to do forward for public comment. He said the Highlands Act was designed to do three things: provide plentiful water, provide clean water, and to limit road runoff to 2004 levels. Mr. Stafford said there are development interests in the Highlands that want to change some numbers such as nitrate dilution standards. He said the Highlands Coalition is a group of eighty environmental groups and a large

number of individuals who are trying to recruit communities to pass a simple resolution. He provided copies of the resolution and his contact information to the Mayor and Council. Council President Duffie asked how New Milford's support would help the cause. He said New Milford represents one community of the 244 that receive water from the Highlands. He said there are fifty communities and freeholder boards that have passed the resolution including the Bergen County Freeholder Board. He said the Coalition wants to let the Highlands Council know the people who receive water care about it and care about what goes into the Act.

A member of the public asked if the Act is available online. He was advised that it is online and can be found on the NJ Highlands Council website.

Councilman Putrino made a motion to close to the public. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

The resolution will be brought before the Council for their consideration at the meeting on 8/25.

She said the residents have asked to have the restriction lifted. Councilman Putrino asked what will happen if commuters find out the restriction has been lifted. Mayor Subrizi said no one is parking in the areas that it is already allowed and all of the residents of the block are in favor of lifting the restriction.

Councilman Robalino made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilwoman Grant seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The ordinance will be advertised and a public hearing will be held on August 25, 2014

INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 2014:22

Councilman Colucci made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilman Robalino seconded the motion. The motion passed on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

The Council then continued to discuss the items listed for the open work session.

5. PD Headquarters

Mayor Subrizi said one of the questions from the last meeting was about the Borough's legal obligation. Mr. Leibman said he reviewed Mr. Conley's contract and the Council could terminate the services on notice and would not owe anything beyond what has already been billed.

Councilman Colucci referenced the alternate plans that had been emailed to the Council.

Councilwoman Grant said some of the earlier designs were not terrible. She said her issue is with the location of the building. She said she would not object to renewing his contract if he could put the building elsewhere; more towards Ray Woods Drive.

Councilman Colucci said from the beginning the discussion was to provide access to the courtroom while affecting the least amount of the building and it was determined it would be through an existing window that would become a door. He said it would only be possible to relocate the building adjacent to the existing by adding a corridor that would wrap around to provide entry to this room. He asked if that was what Councilwoman Grant was proposing. Councilwoman Grant said a corridor would allow access to the window without blocking the entire back of the building.

Mayor Subrizi said the two main objectives in the early planning phase were to maintain the front building line and to get the prisoners to the court without going through the public portion of the building. She said at some point in time those plans were to be thrown out the window, at great expense, to start over.

Council President Duffie said since the Council can't agree what the makeup of the committee should be she would recommend a presentation to the entire Council. She suggested the Council could provide a laundry list of items the Council would like Mr. Conley to address.

Councilman Colucci said Council President Duffie seemed agreeable with the plans as the initial committee process proceeded, with consideration to a reduction in price. He said it was not until the last committee meeting did she express interest in relocating the addition. Council President Duffie said she asked Mr. Conley, on many occasions, if this was the only option.

Councilman Putrino suggested there is a way to move the addition without changing access from the window. He said he thinks a special meeting, with the entire Council, is a good idea.

Councilman Ashley said the Council agreed to do a study of the DPW earlier but never seriously considered a study for the Police Department. He said the Council needs to explore all options and suggested we should do a needs analysis before spending any more money on plans.

Councilwoman Grant said the bylaws require adjournment at 10:30 in the absence of a motion to continue. Councilman Putrino made a motion to continue. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. All present in favor with the exception of Councilman Ashley who was opposed.

Councilwoman Grant said a threshold question is whether or not Mr. Conley is willing and able to move the building.

The Council discussed dates for a meeting and agreed to have Mr. Conley attend the 9/8 work session at 6:30 PM. The Administrator will ask Mr. Conley and Chief Papapietro to attend and will sunshine the early start.

Councilwoman Grant noted Mr. Conley's contract expired at the end of June. Mr. Leibman said the appointment is effectively a holdover and a resolution would be required to reappoint Mr. Conley. Mayor Subrizi asked if the resolution could be added to the agenda. Councilwoman Grant and Councilman Putrino suggested waiting.

Mr. Leibman said Mr. Conley should bring copies of the concept plans for each member of the Council along with any other potential plans he may have. Councilman Putrino said he would email a sketch of his proposal.

Mayor Subrizi and Mr. Leibman left the room at 10:44 PM. They returned at 10:46 PM and the meeting was reconvened.

Councilman Putrino asked to have resolutions 2014:178 and 2014:197 pulled out for a separate vote.

Council President Duffie asked Mr. Leibman if there was a meeting set for August 5th. She was advised the meeting is scheduled for 10:00 AM on 8/5 and it will take place onsite at Fresh and Fancy Farms. Both Council President Duffie and Mayor Subrizi will be attending. Mr. Leibman said the purpose of the meeting is to gather information to bring it back to the Council.

Councilman Ashley referenced the resolution regarding construction design immunity for the firehouse renovations and asked if the plans had been modified. He was advised the only modification took place prior to the bid advertisement. Councilman Ashley asked for an update on the construction. Councilman Colucci said there are meetings every two weeks and minutes from those meetings are available. He said they recently backfilled and framing is set to begin at both sites. Minutes will be forwarded to the Council.

Councilman Ashley asked to pull resolution 2014:169 for a separate vote.

Councilman Colucci asked the budget committee for 2015 to consider funding for a New Milford Weekend for 6/13 and 6/14. He said the 6th annual Fire Department 5K, the Municipal Drug Alliance Fishing Derby and the Recreation Softball finals are scheduled for 6/13. He said the 2nd Annual Warrior Run is scheduled in addition to it being Flag Day. He

suggested forming a committee of residents to brainstorm fundraising ideas. Council President Duffie suggested involving the Public Events Committee. Councilman Ashley agreed to work with Councilman Colucci to pursue the idea.

Councilman Colucci said the VFW has been trying to attract members and there is a committee trying to organize a fundraiser to attract contractors, laborers, landscapers to donate their efforts for a day in April to improve the look of the building.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilman Putrino made a motion to open to the public. Council President Duffie seconded the motion. All present in favor, none opposed.

Terrence McMackin – Madison Avenue. Mr. McMackin asked what happened to the shows and fireworks that used to be held at the Borough Hall; he asked what the town gives back to the people. Mr. McMackin asked about the compensatory time ordinance and how it will affect taxes. Mayor Subrizi said it does not change the compensatory time issues; the compensatory time is contractual. She said the State Comptroller issued a report that said if you are paying compensatory time it needs to be paid by virtue of an ordinance. Mr. McMackin referenced a comment made earlier about consolidation of services. He asked what the total cost will be for the new fire truck and building. Mayor Subrizi said there is no contract or request for a new truck but the ladder truck is at the end of its useful life. Mr. McMackin asked with mutual aid if it is even necessary to purchase another truck. Mr. McMackin asked for an update on Jay's Car Care. Mayor Subrizi said she has spoken directly with the new Property Maintenance Officer and has asked him to work with all departments to do everything we can do to bring the property to compliance. Mr. McMackin questioned the vehicles parked to the curb, noting the paved area meets the sidewalk. Council President Duffie said they are required to be 2' off the sidewalk but in that area there is no sidewalk. Mayor Subrizi asked the Borough Attorney to visit the area and advise as to how the 2' requirement would apply when there is no sidewalk. Mr. McMackin referenced the abandoned vehicles on the property. The Property Maintenance Officer will be instructed to cite all abandoned vehicles.

Anna Leone – 505 Boulevard. Ms. Leone said she was offended by Councilman Robalino saying the proposal to eliminate health benefits was politically driven. She said she brought it up over a year ago and it was not addressed. She said she also found it offensive when he said the Borough does not need to follow what every other town is doing with regard to health benefits. She said his comment about not taking the stipend is noble but only if it was meant sincerely. She said it was obvious from the way he spoke it was said to be spiteful. She then questioned Councilman Robalino's comment that the elimination of health benefits will restrict the candidate pool. She said people volunteer because they want to and have a passion for what they are doing; many people volunteer without compensation.

Ulises Cabrera – 659 Columbia Street. Mr. Cabrera said he thinks Councilman Colucci's suggestion for a New Milford Day is a great idea. He said he also liked the idea of recruiting contractors to help clean up the VFW and he offered his assistance. In order for us to have one, 20 students would be needed to be non-English speaking in one school.
