
MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM PUBLIC MEETING CLOSED SESSION IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING



Monday, January 25, 2021

PUBLIC SESSION:

Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statement. The meeting was held by electronic means, in accordance with law. The Mayor read an announcement regarding public comments during remote meetings.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from the January 11, 2021 Closed, Work/Public Session meeting. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Capital Budget

The Administrator reviewed the departmental requests and the committee's recommendations. She explained that two of the items requested, the water cooler and the AFG grant match, would not be capital expenses and will be funded through other sources. It was noted that the items requested by the Police Department would be funded fully through the capital improvement fund and would not be part of the bond ordinance, which authorizes debt. She said the committee is recommending authorization of \$723,750 in debt, which includes road improvements, a new garbage truck, roof replacement and an air conditioning unit at Fire Co. #1, and equipment for the Fire Department.

Councilman Grotsky said the goal is to keep the amount borrowed under \$750,000, which will be rolled over into long term debt later in the year. He said the DPW fleet is aging and needs

to be addressed. He said the body cameras for the Police Department are mandated by the State and will be partially funded with forfeiture funds and possibly a grant from the State.

Councilwoman Sandhusen asked if the garbage truck is in addition to the existing fleet or a replacement for another truck. Councilman Grotsky said it is a replacement. Councilwoman Sandhusen said there are electronic vehicle grant opportunities for replacement vehicles. Councilman Grotsky said he does not believe an electronic vehicle can handle the tonnage required of a garbage truck. Councilwoman Sandhusen said Bergenfield recently received a grant for the replacement of garbage trucks with electronic vehicles. Councilwoman Duffie said she would be interested in learning more to see if this is something that may work for the DPW in the future.

2. Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator

Mayor Putrino referenced the letter from the OEM Director, in which she requested the appointment of Larry Mintz to the position of Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator. He said the purpose of the appointment is to maintain the chain of command and according to state guidelines, is a mayoral appointment. Mayor Putrino appointed Larry Mintz to the position of Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator.

3. MOU for Sandy Blue Acres Acquisitions

Mr. Kelly said the original MOU can be unilaterally changed by the State. He said while reviewing the proposed amendment, the Borough was working with the State on a separate access agreement for plantings on State owned land. He said the access agreement presented some challenges with regard to the insurance requirements, which required indemnification of the State. He said the revised MOU for the Sandy Blue Acres Acquisitions included the same language as the access agreement. Mr. Kelly said he worked with the Risk Manager to review the language and ultimately the decision was made that the value of the program offset the concerns regarding the insurance. He said the language in the access agreement was ultimately approved and he is recommending the same for this revised MOU.

Mr. Kelly said there was a question from the governing body as to what would constitute passive recreation. He said according to the DEP website, passive recreation includes anything in a non-organized fashion, such as walking, hiking, horseback riding, cross country skiing, snow shoeing, bird watching, nature observation, boating, picnicking, fishing and hunting. He said it would not include a playground, athletic field, outdoor basketball court, tennis court, outdoor swimming pool, skate park or ice rink. He said he believes dog walking is acceptable and the borough can post signs with permitted hours.

Council President Grant asked how many houses are covered by the agreement and if more may be included at a future date. Mr. Kelly said there are currently twelve houses covered by the agreement and there are a number of others that are eligible for the program and are at various stages in the process.

Councilwoman Sandhusen asked if the access agreement was for the Roots to Rivers program and if the program had been held up as a result of the concerns with the agreement. The Administrator said the access agreement was for the Roots to River program and the agreement was signed and the program is underway.

4. Schedule Updates

Mayor Putrino said the only update at this time is a reminder for the upcoming Hippity Hoppity Trail planned for the spring. He said it is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, March 27th with a rain date of Saturday, April 3rd.

5. COVID-19 Task Force Report

The Covid-19 Task Force met on January 21st. There were reports from the NMPD, NMFD, OEM, Ambulance Corps, Health Department, Administration, DPW, and the Board of Education. Some of the topics discussed included recreation sports (winter/spring), and the progress being made to open a vaccination site in New Milford. The next meeting is scheduled for February 4th.

6. Administrator's Report

- The budget committee met on January 15th to begin working on the 2021 operating budget. The committee is waiting for the Auditor and CFO to complete some year-end reports before finalizing the first draft of the 2021 operating budget.
- The next meeting of the Mayor and Council is scheduled for Monday, February 8th.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Councilman Seymour made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Council President Grant seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Frank Feoranzo -71 Prospect Avenue. Mr. Feoranzo asked if the roof at Fire Co. #1 had been replaced as part of the recent renovation. He was advised that only the portion of the roof over the addition is new, this would be to replace parts of the old roof that are damaged and leaking.

Mr. Feoranzo asked for information on the current fleet of garbage trucks. He was advised the fleet currently consists of five vehicles ranging in age from 1988 through 2017. He was further advised that the truck authorized in the capital budget would replace the 1988 truck.

Mr. Feoranzo asked for an update on the schedule for the resumption of in-person learning at the schools. He was advised that teachers returned on 1/25 and students would be returning to a hybrid schedule on 2/1.

Being no other member of the public who wished to comment, Councilman Grotsky made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL

Councilwoman Duffie said the Board of Health has been busy working with the State to complete the necessary documentation for the vaccine clinic. She said BOH inspectors are out on general property maintenance issues, in addition to compliance issues with the pandemic. She said the BOH President and Health Officer recently met with the manager of Shop Rite to review general requirements, capacity and wash down protocols.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley said the Historic Commission is working on an oral history project, consisting of interviews of people who have lived in New Milford for many years. She said the Public Events Committee is discussing options for Memorial Day and may do a ceremony similar to the one held in 2020 with the possibility of a parade for October.

Mayor Putrino said some of the things done in 2020 were so well received they will be incorporated into future celebrations, such as the posters of New Milford soldiers at the Memorial Day observance and the Winter Wonderland festivities.

Councilman Seymour said the BOE Superintendent offered the BOE's continued support of the Borough to bring a vaccination clinic to New Milford, while acknowledging the plan is to locate the site in a Borough building. Councilman Seymour said teachers are scheduled to return to inperson instruction on January 25th, with students returning to a hybrid of in-person and virtual learning on February 1st. Councilman Seymour said the New Milford Municipal Alliance is working on plans for Black Balloon Day and the Fishing Derby. He said the budget committee is working to provide the best services to the residents in the most fiscally responsible manner.

Council President Grant said the Library has been working hard to serve the residents in new and innovative ways as a result of the pandemic. She said 5,067 reference questions were asked and answered in 2020, the use of electronic media increased 159% and 4,338 curbside pickups were completed between June 22nd and December 31st. She said pop-up libraries have been popular and are in high demand. She congratulated the staff on a job well done during difficult times. Mayor Putrino extended his thanks to the Library staff for all of the online programming as well.

Councilwoman Sandhusen commended the Library, noting they serve a deep need. She additionally commended the Historic Preservation Commission on the brochure for the French Cemetery. She reported that the Green Team is ramping up with the expectation of being active in the year to come.

Councilman Grotsky said the Police Department will be swearing in two new officers and promoting two others at a private ceremony tomorrow. Sgt. Herrero is being promoted to the rank of Lieutenant and Detective Carlino is being promoted to the rank of Sergeant. He said the promotions and new hires will be effective February 1st.

VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the consent agenda, consisting of resolutions 2021:56 through 2021:70. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

ADJOURNMENT

Being no further business before the governing body, Councilwoman Duffie made a motion to adjourn. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 8:02 PM.
