

MINUTES BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD 7:00 PM PUBLIC MEETING CLOSED SESSION IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING Monday, February 8, 2021

PUBLIC SESSION:

Mayor Putrino called the meeting to order, asked for a moment of silent prayer and/or reflection and led the flag salute. Mayor Putrino read the Open Public Meeting Law and Mission Statement. The meeting was being held by electronic means, in accordance with law. The Mayor read an announcement regarding public comments during remote meetings.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the minutes from the January 25, 2021 Work/Public Session meeting. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said she misspoke at the last meeting; Jersey City, not Bergenfield, recently obtained electric garbage trucks.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. 2021 Budget

The Administrator said the budget committee met on February 5th to continue work on the 2021 operating budget. She said the information has been forwarded to the auditor to be dropped into the budget document, which will give the committee a baseline to continue working. She said the committee is still waiting for the 2021 figures from the BCUA, which is a big line item. She said the BCUA expects to have the information by February 19th.

2. Schedule Updates

Mayor Putrino said the Hippity Hoppity Trail is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, March 27th with a rain date of Saturday, April 3rd.

Council President Grant said the Rabies Clinic is scheduled for Saturday, February 13th from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM at the DPW garage. She said pet licenses can be obtained at the clinic if the pet is getting vaccinated. Otherwise, the license must be obtained from the Health Department. She said cats must be in carriers, dogs must be leashed, and facemasks are required.

3. COVID-19 Task Force Report

The Covid-19 Task Force met on February 4th. There were reports from the NMPD, NMFD, OEM, Ambulance Corps, Health Department, Administration, DPW, Recreation, and the Board of Education. Some of the topics discussed included the recent increase to 35% for indoor dining, recreation sports (winter/spring), the status of the vaccination site in New Milford, the return to the hybrid schedule for the BOE, and ways to increase resident participation in the Swiftreach system. The next meeting is scheduled for February 18th.

Mayor Putrino said the Borough has been approved by the State as a vaccination site. He said we are waiting on information of when and how much of the vaccine we will receive. He said once we have more information, it will be posted on the Mayor's Facebook page, the Borough website, the electronic sign and a reverse 911 will go out to residents.

Council President Grant asked if the site would be restricted to New Milford residents only. Mayor Putrino said he believes that it will be at the start, but he is not sure how long it can be maintained as a restricted site. He said the clinic will be held at the New Milford Sr. Center and will be by appointment.

4. Administrator's Report

- Borough Hall will be closed on Monday 2/15 in observance of President's Day.

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$214,000 FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF BOULEVARD (FROM MCKINLEY AVENUE TO MAIN STREET) IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM A STATE GRANT.

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT

EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT AND A NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLE, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$773,750 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS POLICE EQUIPMENT IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH, APPROPRIATING THEREFOR THE SUM OF \$46,861 AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to introduce this ordinance on the first reading. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Council President Grant made a motion to open the meeting for public comment. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Michael Sermabekian -160 Harrison Street. Mr. Sermabekian thanked the DPW for their efforts in clearing the snow from the recent storm. He identified himself as the chairman of the Green Team. He spoke about a Technical Assistance grant application and said the Green Team will be

looking for support from the governing body and borough departments. He said they had also applied for a Garnier grant for assistance with a fleet inventory; the application received positive feedback, but the grant was not awarded.

Councilwoman Duffie asked if they are looking for letters of support and if so, by what date they would be needed. Mr. Sermabekian said the application is due February 19th.

Being no other member of the public who wished to comment, Councilman Grotsky made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley reported that the Historic Preservation Commission received a \$950 grant for their oral history project. She said anyone interesting in contributing to the project should contact the HPC.

Councilwoman Sandhusen said the Green Team has been busy working toward Sustainable Jersey certification. She said the Environmental Commission recently enjoyed a presentation by the Hillsdale Environmental Commission on the scope and ways to approach an environmental resource inventory.

Council President Grant reiterated the date and time for the upcoming rabies clinic – Saturday, February 13th from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Councilman Seymour thanked the DPW, first responders and the PD for their hard work throughout the recent snow event. He said Recreation is continuing to plan for an outdoor, spring sport season and referenced the recent bid award for Knights Field, which includes a regulation high school softball field and a youth soccer practice field. On behalf of the BOE he reported that schools have reopened on a hybrid schedule with both virtual and in-person instruction. He asked if it would be possible to prioritize teachers, who are not New Milford residents, once the vaccination site is up and running. Mayor Putrino said we will be following state guidelines.

Council President Grant asked to confirm that we do not know which vaccine we will be receiving. Mayor Putrino said that it has been a 50/50 split between Pfizer and Moderna in Bergen County.

Mayor Putrino said the field improvements at Knights Field will include field lights, field sod, an area of grass for passive recreation, drainage enhancements and sports netting.

Councilwoman Duffie thanked the Board of Health President and Public Health Nurse for all the work they have done to bring the New Milford vaccination site to fruition. Regarding the request to prioritize out of town BOE staff, she said we should prioritize those in need from New Milford as it is very difficult to get an appointment. She said she would support opening it up to BOE staff if the Borough's allotment is more than enough to meet the needs of those eligible in New Milford.

Councilwoman Duffie said Beautification will be meeting discuss how they will use their budget for the coming year, noting that last year it was spent entirely on some of the special events that were held. She said a few members of the 100th Anniversary Committee will soon be meeting to plan an agenda for an upcoming meeting of the Committee as a whole.

Council President Grant said she has heard from several people who are interested in volunteering to help with the vaccination clinic. She asked to whom they should be directed. The Administrator said believes the clinic is to be staffed by Mid-Bergen but suggested that anyone interested in volunteering could contact the Health Department.

Councilman Grotsky extended his thanks and praise for the work by the DPW over the course of a very long storm.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley mentioned the need to clear fire hydrants and asked for assistance from residents to clear them.

Mayor Putrino mentioned the New Milford-Teaneck Elks Lodge 2290 annual memorial service, which is scheduled for Sunday, February 21st at 1:00 PM. He said an RSVP is required due to capacity limitations.

Mayor Putrino mentioned the opening of a new business, Maximum Performance PT on Main Street and said that a ribbon cutting ceremony will be scheduled for later this month. Council President Grant said there is also a new dog grooming business on Main Street. Mayor Putrino said something can be scheduled for that business as well as the Bergen Garden Center and Bambino's Deli.

VOTE ON RESOLUTIONS

Council President Grant made a motion to approve the consent agenda consisting of resolutions 2021:71 through 2021:78. Councilman Seymour seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Mayor Putrino announced that the governing body would be going into closed session. He said no further action would be taken and the meeting would be adjourned immediately upon returning to open session.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to go into closed session. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed. Time 7:39 PM.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress authorized the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 Program to make use of excess Department of Defense personal property by making that personal property available to municipal, county and State law enforcement agencies (LEAs); and

WHEREAS, DLA rules mandate that all equipment acquired through the 1033 Program remain under the control of the requesting LEA; and

WHEREAS, participation in the 1033 Program allows municipal and county LEAs to obtain property they might not otherwise be able to afford in order to enhance community preparedness, response, and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program.
