ADOPT ORDINANCE 2021:01

CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$214,000 FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF BOULEVARD (FROM MCKINLEY AVENUE TO MAIN STREET) IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM A STATE GRANT.

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2021:02

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT AND A NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLE, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$773,750 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

ADOPT ORDINANCE 2021:03

CAPITAL ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS POLICE EQUIPMENT IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH, APPROPRIATING THEREFOR THE SUM OF \$46,861 AND PROVIDING THAT SUCH SUM SO APPROPRIATED SHALL BE RAISED FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND OF THE BOROUGH.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to open the meeting for public comment on this ordinance. Councilwoman Duffie seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

Councilman Grotsky made a motion to adopt this ordinance on the second and final reading. Councilwoman Sandhusen seconded the motion. The motion carried on a roll call vote. All present in favor, none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. 2021 Budget

The Administrator reported on the committee meeting of February 18th. She said the committee reviewed the first draft of the budget and discussed some modifications, including a \$25,000 increase to legal and a slight reduction to LOSAP. She said they also discussed increasing the capital improvement fund but opted to keep it at the recommended allocation of \$200,000. The Library budget was discussed, and although the O/E line was up, salaries were down and the budget, as requested, reflected a 10% reduction overall. She said the committee is still waiting on the number from the BCUA. Based upon where that number comes in the committee may considers small increases to fleet maintenance and snow removal. She said the budget committee's next meeting is scheduled for March 12th, with the budget introduction planned for March 22nd.

2. Schedule Updates

- Hippity Hoppity Trail Saturday, March 27th with a rain date of Saturday, April 3rd
- Memorial Day Parade Cancelled. A small ceremony will be held at Borough Hall with a
 proclamation, speeches, and the pictures of the New Milford veterans displayed in front of
 Borough Hall.
- Spring Soccer Registration has closed and teams are being created

3. COVID-19 Task Force Report

The Covid-19 Task Force met on February 18th. There were reports from the NMPD, NMFD, OEM, Ambulance Corps, Health Department, Administration, DPW, Recreation, and the Board of Education. Some of the topics discussed included the status of the New Milford vaccination site, and the Swift911 initiative to increase resident participation. The next meeting is scheduled for March 4th.

Mayor Putrino said the Borough is pushing forward with the reverse 911 initiative to get residents signed up to receive important announcements from the town. He said the plans include a banner on River Road, a sign on River Edge Avenue, mailings, and a social media campaign.

4. Administrator's Report

A number of the borough's forms and applications have been uploaded to the online platform
and links have been forwarded to the departments and the governing body for testing.
Pending the outcome of the test phase, the forms are scheduled to go live on the borough
website in March.

- Status of the pre-application meeting with the DEP for the Madison Avenue sidewalk project the engineer has submitted the request twice and will follow-up with the DEP again this week.
- The Declaration of Intent for the Bergen County Open Space application is due April 9th. The governing body had originally discussed an application for Knights Field but it appears the project is fully funded, based upon the bid that was just awarded. We have asked the engineer to explore the feasibility of locating a dog park at Pavone Field. He will draft a rough concept and an estimate for the Council's consideration.
- The CFO, Auditor, Bond Attorney and Administrator will be meeting virtually with Moody's on February 25th, in advance of the upcoming bond sale, to provide information that will be used to establish the Borough's bond rating.
- The next meeting of the Mayor and Council is scheduled for Monday, 3/8

Julie Skolnick – 273 Ray Avenue Extension, Hawthorne. Ms. Skolnick said she will be running as an independent candidate for State Assembly in the 38th District, which includes New Milford.

Being no other member of the public who wished to comment, Councilman Seymour made a motion to close to the public. Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley seconded the motion. The motion carried. All present in favor, none opposed.

COUNCIL

Councilwoman Sandhusen said the Environmental Commission has scheduled the dedication of the New Milford Woods for Sunday, April 25th at 1:00 PM. She said the Green Team has submitted a Technical Assistance grant application. She thanked the Green Team for all their hard work and the governing body for their support of the Green Team's pursuit of Sustainable Jersey certification. She said the resolutions on the agenda will complete Phase I of the certification.

Councilwoman Sirocchi-Hurley reported on the Historic Preservation Committee's oral history project and asked for anyone interested in contributing to contact the committee. She said the Alumni in Recovery event from last year will take place this year at the Borough Hall on August 14th.

Councilwoman Duffie said the Beautification Committee has been meeting informally and they have a lot of work to do on the existing gardens due to damage from fall storms. She said the Board of Health has met all the qualifications and requirements to become a vaccine site and they are just waiting on the receipt of the vaccine. She said once we have confirmation, the website for registration will go live and residents will be notified. Councilwoman Duffie reported that former Fire Chief Mury is doing well after recently undergoing surgery.

Mayor Putrino said residents should sign up for the reverse 911 notifications because the Borough will send out a message once we have the vaccine and registration is open.

Council President Grant extended her best wishes to Chief Mury. She said she had nothing specific to report from any of her committees, but all are doing well. She said 150 animals were vaccinated at the recent rabies clinic.

Councilman Seymour also extended best wishes to Chief Mury. He said the Board of Education will be adding Wednesdays as a day for in-person instruction. He said Recreation is busy with plans for spring sports and the Municipal Alliance is underway with plans for Black Balloon Day on March 6th. He offered his continued thanks to the DPW for their great work during all the recent storms.

The Commission is currently researching other municipality ordinances to see how they deal with private property and the removal of trees. (How many trees can be taken down at once, replacement of trees, etc.)

They are working on an explanative to possibly put in the new home owner welcome package, and to put on the borough web site.
